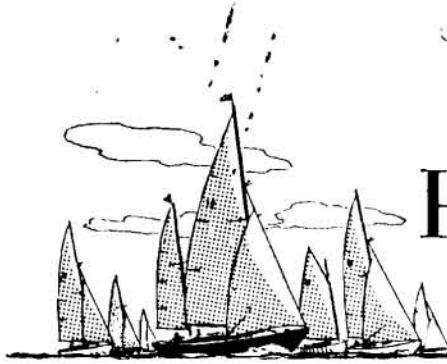
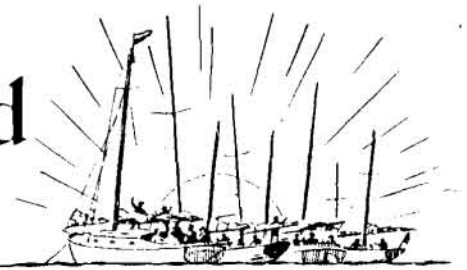

SINGLE-HANDED CREEPSTAKES RACE, SATURDAY, SEPT. 23

Starts at one p.m. just before the clam bake. Designed to aid elderly skippers in working up an appetite. Last year, Good Girl, Oriana, Extra Dry took Class A in that order, while Amberjack, Lady Lou, Bear were the winners in Class B. Rules and Course as follows:

Boats start from Yacht Club dock or from anchor. At first gun (1230) every one except skipper must be off boat. All boats must be sailing by Warning Gun at 1300. Boats start in classes as usual. Start established by Committee Boat off Yacht Club dock, passing around Green Flasher #7 (Oak Beach Channel), through center span of bridge, around Nun #6 and back to finish line, leaving all marks to port.
