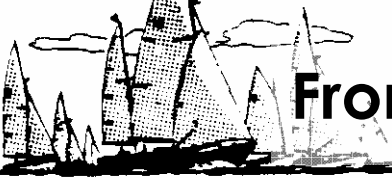

### RACE INSTRUCTIONS ADDENDUM

**Finish off BYC Dock:**           “V” flag           (Red X on White Field)  
Leave the floating finish mark to port.  
Ignore ‘X Mark’ on final leg leading to BYC.  
If ‘G 9’ is the last mark before BYC, round it to starboard.

## From the Fleet Captain

Both the Bristol and Peconic Bay cruises are completed and I would like to thank the cruise captains for their efforts in leading these cruises. Adrian and I joined the Peconic cruise after spending some time at Block Island. The thoroughness and detail that the Beckers and Holwells put into planning the itinerary for their cruise rewarded those that participated with an enjoyable two weeks. The Kohls cruise to Bristol gave the participants the opportunity to experience one of the largest and the oldest 4<sup>th</sup> of July parades in the country. Fog became the weather challenge during our cruise. At Block we had five days of it. The trip home, Montauk to Shinnecock, and then Shinnecock to Fire Island Inlet was all in fog. Having a chart plotter and radar went a long way toward making the trip safer. *Kariana* lead the Peconic cruisers back through the fog and it demonstrated to me the effectiveness of radar reflectors. Initially two boats in the group had their radar reflectors safely stored in a locker. It was amazing to see the difference between boats that had reflectors up, and those that didn't. On the radar screen those boats without radar reflectors were only visible part of the time. This was in smooth sea conditions. Had waves been high they may have been even less visible. The lesson is clear. **Radar reflectors work!** Use them. It is also important that they be mounted in the proper position. This is known as the "rain catch" position.


Past Commodore Mike Smith and his wife Ginny spent a week at Block Island with their family. Adrian and I met them there on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July. We were glad to see that Mike is doing very

well after recent heart surgery. They are enjoying their growing family and send best wishes to all.

The Blast on Saturday August 13<sup>th</sup> is again located at the home of Michael Simon in Bay Shore. Michael Simon has a large bulkhead and permission to use neighboring space as well. Depth into his creek is adequate for all boats. Specific docking locations will be assigned by boat length. Docking will only be available beginning on Saturday. In order to accommodate all, we need to know if you are coming by boat. Bob Van Tassel and Dennis Krug will be acting as Dock masters for this event. Berthing assignments will be predetermined. The Week in the Bay Cruise will start on Sunday August 14<sup>th</sup>, the day after the Blast, in Connetquot River. On Monday we will travel to Bellport, then to Atlantique on Tuesday. Tuesday we will have a Bar-B-Q and Wednesday the SBCC "Games on the Beach". From Atlantique we will go on to Sore Thumb and Coast Guard Cove. *Kariana* will be the Cruise Leader for this always popular event and we look forward to seeing you, for all or any part of the cruise.

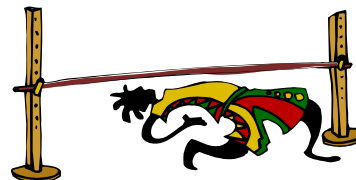

## Summer 2005 cruise to Bristol, RI July 1-July 9, 2005

### Day 1 Friday July 1

We left our dock in Connetquot River at 6:30am and motored to Bellport. We were joined by **Midnight Sun** and **God's Grace**. **Habanero** was an hour ahead of us and called back navigation info at intervals. They went out Shinnecock inlet to Lake Montauk.

Transited the canals **God's Grace** ran aground at buoy 26 We waited for **God's Grace** by the Shinnecock bridge, and then sailed over to where **Counterpoint** and **Vixen** were anchored. We anchored in Shinnecock Bay at 2:30pm. Cocktails on **Justus Counterpoint, Vixen, Midnight Sun, God's Grace, JustUs**

### Day 2 Saturday July 2

Depart Shinnecock 7am inlet had heavy incoming seas despite outgoing tide. Fog on ocean visibility extremely poor 2-4 ft rollers. Sailed part of the trip.

1pm off Montauk Point

**Habanero** remained in Montauk to repair engine. Arrived point Judith 5:30pm found **Counterpoint** and **Vixen** anchored there. We had a dinghy ride into town and a nice walk. Saw lots fireworks along the Connecticut shore beautiful star filled night.

### Day 3 Sunday July 3

Anchor up at 8:30am departed point Judith for Bristol. Motored to west passage put out sails and sailed up west passage and under bridge. Arrived Bristol 1:30pm anchored in harbor. Dingy ride to town. Landed at the park and watched flag and sword throwers practice for the parade. Yummy ice cream. Bristol has changed a lot since we were here last. There is lots of new construction restaurants and stores. Fireworks at 10pm Sue & Bob and Dan & Jane came to our boat to watch them.

### Day 4 Monday July 4

Went to town to watch the parade which started 10:30am. Saw Frank, Barbara, Joel Dorothy & grandson Josh while strolling the parade route. Met Bill Grauer, Sally & Bill and joined them on the lawn to watch the parade. Corinne & John were sitting behind us. A kind local woman was sharing info on the parade participants. The parade was awesome; great sounding bands, the uniforms were stunning, the flag, sword and rifle tossing was precise and impressive. We dingied back to boat for a nap. **Shootin' the Breeze** came into harbor at 2pm. We went into town with them for dinner at 6pm. After dinner there were fire works in the distance.

Day 5 Tuesday July 5

Left in the fog for Newport. Motored all the way there. Docked at the Newport Yachting Center with **God's Grace, Midnight Sun, Habanero & JustUs**. **Counterpoint, Vixen & Njörd** were at Ida Lewis. Had lunch, wandered the town & took a cab to West Marine for some essentials. Cocktails on **Habanero** that evening then off to the movies.

Day 6 Wednesday July 6

Left dock at 11am for Block, in the fog, for a change. Motor sailed to Great Salt Pond & grabbed a town mooring. **Midnight Sun** traveled with us and **God's Grace** followed later. After lunch on the boat we dingied to Block Island Boat Basin and walked into town. Wandered for a few hours then had dinner at Ballard's. Back to dingy at 9pm & rode back to the boat with white caps breaking over the bow. Spent a very bumpy and restless night on the mooring.

**Midnight Sun, God's Grace, JustUs**

Day 7 Thursday July 7

Thursday dawned as rough as Wednesday ended. Tired of staying in a washing machine we called Block Island Boat Basin and got a slip. We dropped the mooring and motored over, docked the boat and went to the Oar for breakfast. After breakfast we rented bikes and rode the entire Southern part of the island. We met up with Dan and Jane on bikes near town and joined them for lunch at the National Hotel. Rode back to the boat and relaxed till dinner time. Had a barbeque on the dock.

**Midnight Sun, God's Grace, JustUs**

Day 8 Friday July 8

Left the dock at 7am for Shinnecock Inlet. According to all weather service predictions, the forecast was for 20-25 mph winds from the East and 1 - 2 foot seas. HA!!!! **Midnight Sun, God's Grace, JustUs** motored to Montauk & then sailed with jibs only in the 25-30 mph breezes. Seas started to build alarmingly and, within hours we were being pushed along by 10 to 12 foot rollers. We kept seeing 10.5 knots over ground on the GPS as we surfed down the waves. 45 miles in 7.5 hours!! As we neared the inlet the height of the waves started to concern us. We would have to take the waves on our beam to enter the inlet. The alternative, continuing on in deteriorating conditions to Fire Island Inlet seemed even less appealing. So we cut across the bar and approached the inlet at an angle, running for it when the time seemed right. The wind seemed to be howling even worse inside the inlet and we decided to head for the relative shelter of Tiana Bay for the night. All three boats anchored and settled in for the night.

**Midnight Sun, God's Grace, JustUs**

Day 9 Saturday July 9

We hoisted anchor at 9am to catch high water at buoy 26 in Moriches bay. All 3 boats transited the bays and canals without incident and arrived in Bellport Bay around 1pm.

**JustUs** and **God's Grace** tacked Bellport Bay and Patchogue Bay while **Midnight Sun** broke off to motor home. As we neared Blue Point we furled the sail and motored home to Oakdale.

This was our first cruise since 1997 and we were happy to be back. Next year, with Radar, we plan on doing another 9 day cruise, this time, to Western Long Island Sound
