From the Fleet Captain

By the time you read this, we will either be on cruise or ready to throw the dock lines to begin our two-week cruise around Long Island with Cruise Captain Rich Troy. We can't believe it's almost time, and we can't wait. Interestingly enough, one of our ports-of-call will be the Mat-A-Mar Marina in Mattituck, which is the new home of *Painkiller*. So June will be able to see her old boat in her new setting, and in the water again!

She had been on land for too long a time. Her new owner loves her, and told me a couple of 'stories,' which I'll share with you. First, he sailed to Coeple's Harbor in the southeast corner of Shelter Island. First, he didn't know that you have to watch the currents at Plum Gut. He thought it was odd that the water was quite turbulent as he went through, but "it was only for about 100 yards or so." Next, he sailed into Coeple's Harbor at midnight, for the very first time. Given the narrow-ness of the entrance channel, I'd rather do it in the daylight. Lastly, he told his brother he'd be home around 1 PM on a particular day. Well, he was having so much fun that he decided to stay and enjoy himself. He didn't even leave Shelter Island until well after his pre-arranged arrival time, which made him quite overdue. His brother, not being able to reach him by cell phone, called the Coast Guard and the Suffolk County Marine Police. *Painkiller's* new owner said to me, "I was wondering why the CG helicopter was flying over me....now I know why! I must have had 15 messages on my cell phone between the CG and the police!" So my point in

sharing this story is this...When going out in open water, make sure you know what current effects you can expect to encounter, if any, and time them appropriately. Second, don't enter unfamiliar harbors late at night when you're tired and can't see very well. You really could cause damage to you and your boat. Lastly, and most importantly, make a float plan, BUT if you will be arriving later than you anticipate, PLEASE call the person you left the float plan with and let them know of your change in plans. His brother might be more reluctant to call for help the next time he's late, and that could be the time he really needs the assistance!

The Chesapeake Bay Cruisers should be back by now, and some of them may be restocking and going right back out with the two-week cruise. Commodore Bob Van Tassel and his group of boats will be well on their way to Marblehead, MA as well. So if you're not cruising this month, please take up the slack for those of us that are out and please participate in the weekly rendezvous!

And don't forget the popular one week Around the Bay Cruise beginning on August 12. Della Bucher and sister Nancy Sherman will be heading that cruise up, and it sounds like it will be a lot of fun!

I'll be praying that nothing goes wrong on this cruise. I'm stocking up on spare parts, and I'm doing some initial checks to see if I can head off any potential problems. See you on the Bay

largely due to concern about how easily GPS can be interfered with. The new solid state system has improved signal quality and strength. So if you have not thrown your old Loran unit out, hook it up and give it a try. I found that my old Si-Tex unit came up quickly with a very accurate fix. It's nice to have a back-up to GPS on board.

The Coast Guard has implemented new schedule openings for the Goose Creek (Wantagh), Sloop Creek (Meadowbrook) and Long Creek (Loop Parkway) bridges. On weekends and holidays the Meadowbrook Parkway bridge will open on the hour between 7 am and 8 pm and

the Wantagh Parkway Bridge will open on the half hour between 7:30 am and 8:30 pm. Allowing only 30 minutes to make the opening of the second bridge when traveling east or west between both bridges. The Loop Parkway Bridge will open twice an hour at 20 and 50 minutes past the hour between 6:20 am and 7:20 pm.

Our sailing schedule is not clear yet! Peggy just told me that we have a family wedding in Westchester to attend at the end of July. Hopefully the balance of the summer will remain conflict free.

One of the greatest sailing traditions on The Bay and part of the Great South Bay Yacht Racing Association for one hundred years is the annual *Race Week*. This year, the Bay Shore Yacht Club will host the four day event with a PHRF racing schedule designed to make participating as convenient as possible.

It all starts on Thursday, July 26 with a twilight race off Bay Shore which replaces the regular race off Babylon at 1930, and will be scored both as a Babylon Twilight series race and the first race of Race Week. All races will start off Bay Shore including the second race which will take place Friday evening at 1930. Races 2 & 3 are scheduled on Saturday with the first starting at 1030, and the second starting 20 minutes after the last boat finishes the morning race. Race 5 will start 1030 on Sunday.

You must submit a completed *Entry Form* either by advance mail, in person at BSYC, or at the PHRF committee boat no later than 10 minutes

before the start of Race 3 Saturday morning. You can find a copy of the *Entry Form* in this issue, at BSYC, or at gsbyra.org. You will also need a copy of the PHRF *Sailing Instructions*. Please contact me and I will get everything to you.

To make it easier for those bringing their boats from ports away from the area, we have arranged for docking for several boats just east of the Brightwaters Canal at the home of Michael Simon. Please contact me for further information.

A barbeque will take place at Bay Shore Yacht Club Saturday evening and an awards ceremony will be held after the races are scored on Sunday. It's a terrific event at a great location! Please make plans to join us.

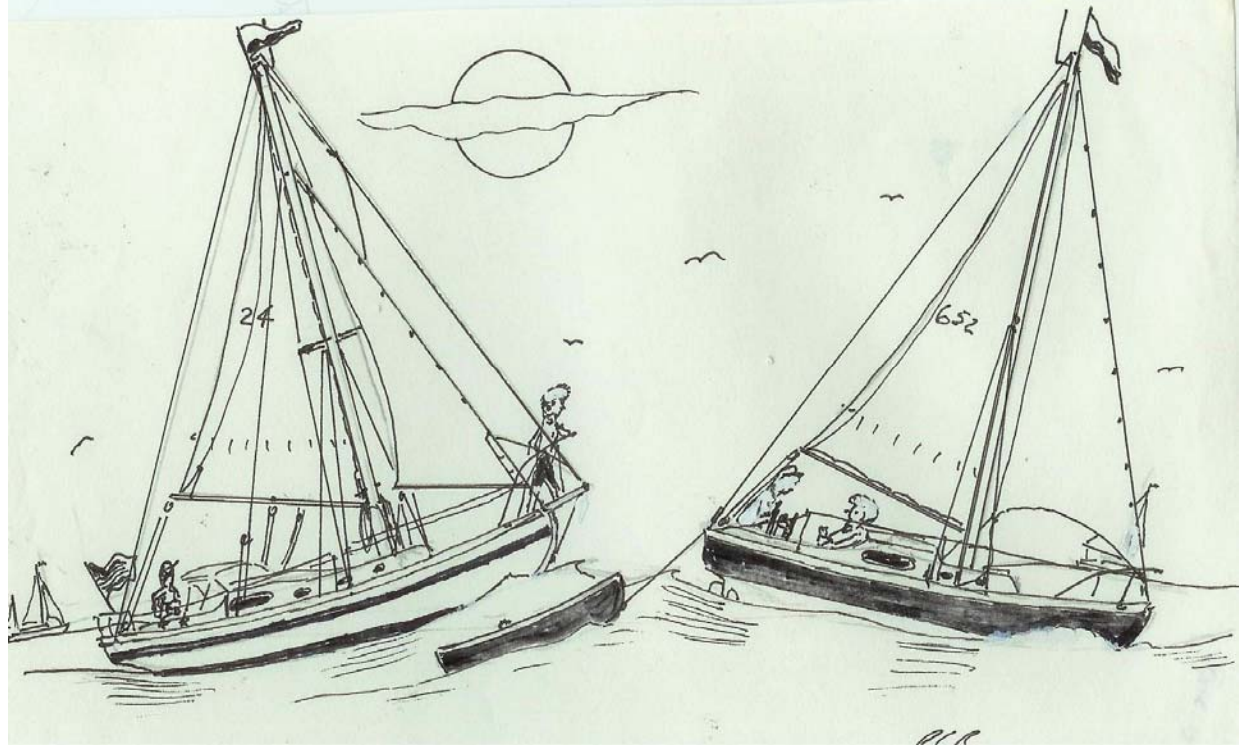
