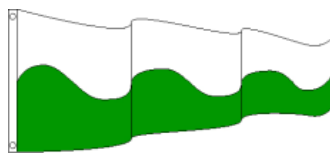

BOAT YARD PARTY PRIZE WINNING RECIPES

Hungry Girl" Veggie Chili Enjoy! Sandralee Capitain

1 1/2 pound lean turkey breast
29 oz. can tomato sauce
14.5 oz. can drained diced tomatoes (I used petite cut)
15 oz. can chili beans in sauce, undrained
15 oz. can dark red kidney beans, drained and rinsed
(15 oz. can black beans, drained and rinsed. Not called for in original recipe, but I add them.)
3/4 cup canned corn, drained
2 bell peppers, different colors, large chop
1 large sweet onion, large chop
2 carrots chopped (I used 1 cup of the baby peeled)
2 cloves chopped garlic
1 T. Worcestershire sauce
1 t. chili powder
1/2 oz. 70% cocoa, broken up
salt to taste
1 cup serving: 172 cal., 3.5 g fat, 5.5 g fiber

Cook turkey breast in skillet with onion and garlic. Drain and add to crock pot. Add all other ingredients except the cocoa. (I like to lightly fry up the carrots and peppers in a skillet before adding to the pot.) Cook on high for 2 hours, then reduce to low for 3 hours. In the last hour, stir broken cocoa pieces into the chili.

Toffee Crunch Cookie Brittle

1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
1/2 teaspoon baking soda
1/2 teaspoon salt
3/4 cup (1 1/2 sticks) unsalted butter, melted and cooled slightly
1/2 cup granulated sugar
1/2 cup packed light brown sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 cup crushed Heath or Skor bars (4 bars)
1 cup coarsely chopped pecans

Preheat the oven to 350°F. Position a rack in the center of the oven. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.

Mix the flour, baking soda and salt in a medium bowl, set aside. In a large bowl, stir together the melted butter, granulated sugar, brown sugar and vanilla until smooth and glossy, about 30 seconds. Stir the flour mixture into the butter mixture until the mixture is smooth. Stir in the crushed toffee and the walnuts.

Spoon the dough into the center of the prepared baking sheet. Press the dough into a rectangle leaving 1 to 1 1/2 inches boarder around the dough. Using your hands, press the dough into an even 1/2 -inch layer

Bake until the top is golden brown and the sides are light brown, about 19 minutes. Cool the cookie on the baking sheet for 10 minutes, and then slide the cookie with the parchment paper onto a wire cooling rack. The cookie will become crisp as it cools.

Break the cooled cookie into 4- to 5-inch pieces, and store in an airtight container for up to 4 days. Makes about 12 to 15 cookies.

Our Rendezvous Weekend was September 11th at Oak Island Lead. Dave and I anchored at Oak Island in the late afternoon on Friday, we like to head out early on Friday's when possible. I noticed right away that the shoreline was covered with a lot of litter and debris. This anchorage is usually very clean. I thought that in the morning I would suggest to Dave that we launch the dinghy and head to shore with some garbage bags and start some clean up. Saturday morning was spectacular, warm and sunny, I looked over to the shore and there was a boat with a man in a wet suit already hard at work. I saw the boat clearly marked SPLASH. When we returned home I found their website (operationsplash.net) filled with information about the group. They even get children involved in clean up outings.

Operation SPLASH (Stop Polluting Littering And Save Harbors), a volunteer non-profit organization started in 1990, provides a solution to the growing problem of waterfront pollution through public awareness and individual participation. The SPLASH boats are docked at the Town of Hempstead 's Guy Lombardo Marina in Freeport, Nassau County's Wantagh Park Marina and also at East Rockaway's Town Marina. Each boat has it's own sailing schedules and to find a time that suits you please check the "SAILING SCHEDULES AND CAPTAINS CONTACT INFO on their web page. Each boat goes out at least once daily and actually removes debris from the local waterways and shorelines. SPLASH has hundreds of active members who are dedicated to keeping our coastal waterways pollution free, allowing marine life to thrive once again in the bays.

The boats seem to be operating out of Nassau County, but the boat I saw was working in Suffolk.
