FROM THE HELM

After a busy and successful spring, schools are finally out and summer has kicked into high gear.

Along with the various weekend races, Regatta has been busy with the Tuesday BSIR and Thursday Babylon races. The first series of the BSIR was well attended with a total of 17 boats participating. The Commodore's Cup was run on June 29. As Wendy and I returned from the *Chile today*, *Hot tamale* rendezvous in Coast Guard Cove hosted by Beth and Eddie Anderson, we were able to make our start time and headed to buoy #9 off Babylon. We expected *Haven* wasn't going to be competitive, as she's fully loaded for cruising, we were shorthanded, and I've only been racing for a year. Based on our rating, we were the last boat to cross the start line and stayed in that position the entire race. All was going well until rounding the last mark and heading towards the finish line. It was directly upwind and we started with 7 kts of wind (true) that soon dropped to 5 kts. When it hit 2.5 kts we withdrew since we weren't going to finish by the 3 hour end time. That's the first time we didn't finish a race, but we had a good time and extended our weekend by making another trip around the bay. Well, *almost* another trip around the bay...

The weather had been challenging for a few of our early rendezvous, but that is to be expected at the beginning of the season. One memorable rendezvous was Barbara and Duncan Burns hosting the *Summer Solstice* in Great River. This was their first time hosting on *Beaumaris* after relocating her to Bay Shore. She's a great addition to the SBCC fleet on the GSB!

Both Jeff Mattera on *Eagle's Wings* and Pam and Todd McCarthy on *Bleu Moon* have already started their 2025 coastal cruise and safely arrived at Block Island with plans to go further East. We hope to meet up with them at some point on the two week cruise after our fleet leaves for Narraganset Bay on July 12th.

After planning for several years, Mara and Fred Liesegang just departed on their multi-year cruise. They are currently heading up the Hudson River

as they start the Great Loop. There is a Facebook page to chronicle their journey. Search "*Dust in the Wind 2023*" on Facebook and filter on "People"; their faces are in their profile picture. You will need to make a friend request for access. We wish them safe travels as they embark on a trip most of us can only dream of.

Keep an eye out for upcoming emails regarding the Blast held at the Snapper Inn on August 16. This leads into our one-week cruise around the bay, which unofficially starts immediately after the Blast with the Margaritaville rendezvous on the River. Both the Blast and one-week cruise have seen an increase in attendance over the past several years, so let's keep that streak going. If you can't make the entire one-week, please consider joining us for part of it.

2025 Babylon Cup Invitational — Race Report

It was an excellent Friday night for the Babylon Cup Invitational Race last week. The weather cooperated, the Babylon YC Regatta chair Kim CarolSELLi had their clubhouse and refreshments all ready for the post-race awards party and the pizzas & salad were delivered right on time- TGIF!

The Race Committee consisted of myself, Eddie Anderson who arranged for use of the BYC crash boat and Kim who also joined us. The wind was a steady SW at 12 kts but died as we set the starting line at 6:30 pm. We picked Babylon course #2 (start, 9, 6 and finish) and we had 7 boats show up ready to race. We were worried about the lack of wind, however just 5 minutes before the start the wind suddenly freshened! The countdown began in a 15-20 kts SW wind with boats jockeying for position and trying to keep control in the gusts. The start was very



exciting, especially for us sitting in the RC boat! But all racers did well and found their slots at the start. Then it was a tight reach in gusty winds to the first mark and *Vantage* was first to round followed by *Rettsie* & *Kickin' Back*.

The race took about 1 hour with the finish at the Babylon YC dock. Line honors went to Kevin Padden & crew in *Rettsie*, followed by Dave Hyer (3 generations) on *Vantage* and Marty O'Connell & team *Kickin' Back*. The final Handicap results are:

FROM THE REGATTA CAPTAIN**Charlie Margeson****2025 Babylon Twilight #1 Spring Race — Race Report**

We held the rescheduled Babylon Twilight Spring Race this past Thursday, June 26 in some challenging conditions. Winds were a steady 20 kts at the start with 6 boats racing. Our RC- John Davis picked a course of #9, #6 to port & back to #9 for the finish. There was plenty of starting line excitement given the conditions.

Wind shifts & heavy gusts kept crews on their toes and reefing was key to keeping boats on their feet and moving upwind. After rounding the #6 upwind mark, it was a wing-on-wing race to the finish. Even in these conditions, the poles really helped the crews deal with the wind shifts.

First over the line was *Rettsie*, followed by *Shadow*, *Kickin Back*, *Naughty Dog* and *Sovereign*. The final adjusted results were actually very close, with only 47 secs between 1st & 2nd place and an amazing 5 secs between 2nd & 3rd place. See the final results below. 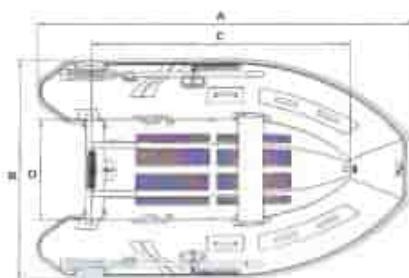

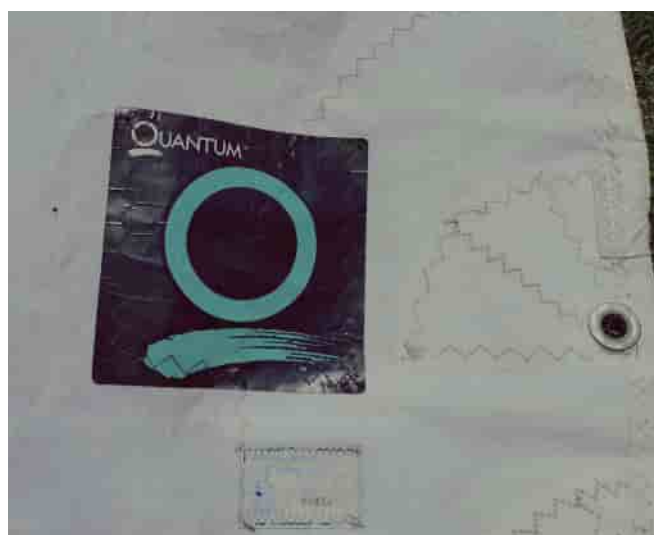
