NOTES TO RACING SCHEDULE

1. SINGLE-HANDED CREEPSTAKES – Only Skipper is allowed on boat during race.
Two Classes: S Class and All Others
2. See SERIES Information (page 16)
3. LADIES' RACE – Skipper must be a lady. Broadside Trophy for best in fleet with all-girl crew.
Yachts eligible for this trophy must advise Race Committee prior to first warning signal.
4. CLASS RACE – A one-design race for any class with three or more entries.
5. Time Limit 2230.
6. Time Limit 1900.
7. No Time Limit.
8. Counts toward season class pennant.
9. Winners in races shown in ALL CAPS qualify for Perpetual Trophies. Consult Race Information under PRIZES for specifics.
10. Finish at Babylon Yacht Club dock.
11. No racing fee required.
12. Tune-up Series – to emphasize tuning, no prizes will be awarded.

RACING INFORMATION

ELIGIBILITY

All proper cruising sailboats owned or chartered by SBCC members are eligible to participate in Club races provided they have paid the racing fee and handicap information is available for them. SBCC family races, the Class Day Race, and other Yacht Club invitationals do not require payment of the SBCC racing fee.

HANDICAPS

The SBCC fleet includes many widely differing types of cruising sailboats. In order to make race participation attractive to as many members as possible, both SBCC Handicap and Measurement Rule racing is offered. Under this dual system, every yacht in the fleet upon request to the Handicap Chairman is given a SBCC Rating based on its maximum speed potential. In addition, members may elect to obtain measurement certificates for their yachts, qualifying them to race under the MORC or Storm Trysail rules. Members may change classes as often as they desire except that no class change is permitted after the warning signal.

SBCC HANDICAP CLASSES

The SBCC Handicap System rates each yacht according to its maximum speed potential, thereby encouraging each skipper to get the best performance from his yacht.

Maximum speed potential is established for each yacht through (1) statistical analysis of race data for consistently well-sailed boats of similar design, (2) comparison with data from other racing fleets and (3) speed-trending data from past performances.

Under the SBCC Handicap System all yachts of different design will have distinctive maximum speed characteristics from which individual handicaps are derived. Fine tuning factors are applied to yachts of the same design to account for differences in rig, prop type, sail complement, etc.

Two classes, Spinnaker and Non-Spinnaker, are scored under the SBCC Handicap System. Skippers electing to race in the Spinnaker class may use their full sail complement, and any sail combination consistent with USYRU racing rules or special race instructions. In the Non-Spinnaker class, spinnakers, bloopers/streakers, staysails or drifters **cannot** be used at any time during the race. Only one jib can be flown at a time, whose luff must be attached full length to the headstay.

Each racing skipper is obliged to contact the Handicap Chairman in advance of his first race under the following conditions:

- (a) A particular yacht is to be raced in the SBCC fleet for the first time.
- (b) The skipper has raced another yacht bearing the same sail number during the season.
- (c) The sail complement has been changed.
- (d) The basic design of the yacht is modified in any way which could affect its speed potential.

RACING INFORMATION (Cont'd.)

Measurement Rule Classes

Measurement Rule racing is based on the assumption that the maximum speed potential of a yacht can be calculated on the basis of its physical measurement. Because such calculations do not take into account the condition of the yacht or historical performance, measurement racing lays heavy emphasis on boat speed relative to the calculated potential. Its special appeal is to the owners of yachts of modern design, equipped with a full complement of racing gear.

Yachts under 30 ft. LOA with a valid Midget Ocean Racing Club measurement certificate (1976 version) may elect to race in Class M, and those 30 ft. and over with a valid Storm Trysail Club 1965 Rule measurement certificate may elect to race in Class S. To race in one of these classes, it is the responsibility of the individual yacht owner to obtain a measurement certificate from a professional measurer recognized by the certifying organization. To assist in this matter, the Fleet Measurer will arrange for boats to be measured in groups. These groups are formed during the Spring of each year and measuring is usually done on Saturdays, at some mutually convenient location.

It is the individual owner's responsibility to see that his up-to-date measurement certificate is on file with the measurement chairman. A yacht failing to comply with this requirement cannot be scored in the measurement classes.

Handicaps in Class S and M are computed on the basis of a time allowance in seconds per mile obtained for the certified rating of the yacht. All Class S and M yachts automatically acquire SBCC ratings in addition to and distinct from their Measurement Rule ratings.

IDENTIFICATION

Racing numbers, either USYRU or SBCC, are required on mainsails, spinnakers and overlapping (LP greater than 130%J) headsails, in accordance with current USYRU rules. Racing skippers are reminded that USYRU numbers are usually required for racing off the Bay.

Racing yachts are required to fly class streamers of the following colors from their standing backstays or the leach of their mainsails. Streamers should measure 4" x 18".

Class	Color
Spinnaker	Red
Non-Spinnaker	Yellow
S	White
M	Blue

Absence of a streamer or racing numbers will be cause for disqualification.

PRIZES

Perpetual trophies are awarded for one year only. They are awarded to the yacht with the best corrected time based on the SBCC Handicap rule.

Each year the club awards eight perpetual trophies, as follows:

Commodore's Cup — Best corrected time in the Commodore's Cup Race.

Foulke Trophy — Best corrected time in the Foulke Trophy Race (night race).

RACING INFORMATION (Cont'd.)

Sympatico Cup — Last yacht to cross the finish line in the Foulke Trophy race.

Smith Trophy — Best corrected time in the Smith Trophy Race.

Deale Trophy — Best corrected time in the West Island Race.

Schnur Trophy — Last yacht to cross the finish line in the West Island Race.

Governor's Cup — Best total corrected time for the Commodore's Cup, West Island and Foulke Trophy races.

Broadside Trophy — Best corrected time in the Ladies' Race by a yacht with an all-girl crew.

Keeper cups are given to winners of these trophies and their names are engraved on the perpetual trophy. It is the responsibility of the winner of a perpetual trophy to return it by November 1 to the Trophy Chairman for engraving of the following year's winner.

Trophies for individual SBCC races (when not part of a series) will be awarded to each class, according to the following schedule:

Number of Starters	Trophies for
1 through 3	1st
4 through 6	1st and 2nd
7 or more	1st, 2nd and 3rd

In SBCC series the greatest number of starters in any race will govern the number of trophies awarded for that series.

Class Championship pennants will be awarded to the yachts with the lowest scores in 10 races. DNF's and DNS's will not be scored. The races selected are designated with note 8 in the racing schedule, except that a maximum of any three Twilight races and a maximum of any three Great River Week races may be used.

SERIES SCORING

Points for each race will be awarded on the basis of $\frac{3}{4}$ -point for first, two points for second, three points for third, etc. DNF and WDR boats will receive 1 point more than the number of boats in that class that started in the series. DNS and DSQ boats will receive 2 points more than the number of boats in that class that started in the series.

A starter in any one race of the series will be considered to have started in all the races of the series. Series position will be determined by the total points accumulated by each yacht, in inverse order. Ties will be broken in favor of the boat which has beaten the other the greater number of times. If a tie still remains it will be broken in favor of the finish order of the last race of the series.

A Yacht that serves as committee boat for one race of any series will receive credit toward series qualification for that race and points equal to the average of its finish positions in the other races of the series, DNS and DNF races included. A Yacht serving as committee boat for an Eastern Twilight Series race will receive for that race either three points or one more than the number of starters, whichever is less.

SERIES INFORMATION

East and West Twilight Series

These are three-race series. They will be scored on the basis of a yacht's best

RACING INFORMATION (Cont'd.)

two races. To qualify, a yacht must race two races. (Except committee boat, as noted above.) However, in the Eastern Twilight Spring and Fall Series only there will be no throwout races.

Family Series

Trophies awarded on combined time for two-day series. Crews must sleep aboard Saturday night. No Spinnakers.

Great River Week

This is a six-race series. It will be scored on the basis of a yacht's best five races. In addition, the last three races will be scored as a separate series, with no throw-out race (except committee boat).

Novice Series

This is a two-race series with no throw-outs. It is open only to owners who have never previously won a trophy. Experienced crew will be available by request. Raft-up and critique in Secret Harbor between races.

Sayville Yacht Club Invitation

See SYC start sequence (Page 17). No streamers required for catboats. No throw-outs. On Saturday, all boats will sail the SYC courses distributed at the start line. On Sunday, Sp and NS classes will sail Sayville Course G; catboats will follow SYC instructions.

TUNE-UP SERIES

To emphasize tuning, no prizes will be awarded.

RULES

Racing rules of the USYRU shall be observed except as otherwise specified in these instructions. Burgees and other flags may be flown when racing. Government navigation buoys not stated to be marks of the course may be disregarded at the discretion of the skipper. The Inland Rules will replace Part IV of the Racing Rules between the hours of sunset and sunrise. All required lights must be shown.

EQUIPMENT

The equipment required by USYRU for category 4 races is strongly recommended.

PROTESTS

The SBCC Protest Committee operates under Racing Rules of the USYRU, supplemented by published decisions of the USYRU Appeals Committee. In addition, it shall hear all protests arising from violation of the Inland Rules which replace Part IV of the USYRU Rules between sunset and sunrise.

RACING INFORMATION (Cont'd.)

It will only entertain protests made in conformity to the USYRU rules including:

- Display of protest flag
- Notification of protested yacht
- Notification of Race Committee
- Submission of written protest
- Citation of rule or rules allegedly infringed

Protest must be addressed to the Chairman of the Protest Committee and hand-delivered or postmarked within 24 hours of the conclusion of the race in question.

STARTING

Signals will be made at five minute intervals with each signal lowered one minute before the hoisting of the next. The visual signal governs; the gun merely calls attention to it.

When, after a starting signal, all the yachts of the class or classes involved have properly started, the Race Committee will, if practicable, announce "all clear".

RACING INFORMATION (Cont'd.)

RECALLS

The Race Committee will endeavor to notify any yacht starting early by means of a Recall signal. The signal will be one blast of a horn or whistle for each yacht over early. The committee will also hail the yachts being recalled individually. Nearby yachts are requested to pass the hail. Any yacht failing to hear or heed such a recall will be penalized by having one-half hour added to her elapsed time.

General Recall: If there should be a number of unidentified premature starters, or if an error is made in the starting procedure such as a significant inaccuracy in the interval between signals, the Race Committee will make the General Recall signal. The starting sequence will resume with the Warning signal for the class that was recalled.

STARTING LINE ETIQUETTE

Racing skippers are reminded to stay clear of the starting line until the Preparatory signal for their class. Failure to do so may result in disqualification.

The Preparatory Signal for each class is the Starting Signal for the preceding class (except in the West Island Race). Yachts starting with the wrong class may be disqualified.

TIME LIMIT

Regardless of time of start, the time limit for each class will expire at 1800 for all races except as noted otherwise in the schedule. If any yacht finishes within the time limit, it is a race for her class. Yachts finishing after the committee boat has left its station should take their own time and report it to the Race Committee as soon as possible.

SPECIAL SIGNALS

Code flags A through J are used to designate courses (see Course Instructions).

Code flags below apply to all SBCC-conducted races:

- L** — One of the designated MARKS is missing; come within hail for instructions.
- M** — ROUND or pass the object displaying this signal instead of the mark it replaces.
- N** — ABANDONMENT, race called off (accompanied by three guns).
- R** — Sail the designated course in the REVERSE direction. Leave all marks to opposite hand.
- S** — Sail the SHORT course prescribed in the course instructions. When flown after the start (accompanied by two guns), finish between the committee boat and the nearby mark of the course.
- T** — Sail the designated course TWICE around.

Answering Pennant - POSTPONEMENT signal (accompanied by two guns). Starts postponed fifteen minutes. Warning signal will be made 1 minute after Answering Pennant is lowered.

RACING INFORMATION (Cont'd.)

1st Repeater - GENERAL RECALL signal (accompanied by two guns). Starting sequence resumes with the Warning signal for the class being recalled.

COURSE INSTRUCTIONS

SBCC courses in the Bay have been grouped by starting area as follows:

For each of these areas, a variety of courses is described below, each bearing a distinguishing letter. The choice of courses available to the Race Committee on any given day is shown in the Race Schedule. The course selected will be signaled from the Committee Boat by the appropriate letter code flag. (Letters A through J may be used).

Any course can be reversed by code Flag "R" or shortened by code flag "S" as described under "SPECIAL SIGNALS" above.

BABYLON COURSES

Course A: Start established by committee boat off Willetts Creek; to Flasher No. 7 off Oak Island Channel, leaving it to port; through the center span of Robert Moses Causeway to Flashing Green No. 11, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point, leaving it to port; to Black and White Mo(A) in Great Cove, leaving it to port; return through center span of the Causeway to finish line off Willetts Creek. Course distance: 16.6 nm. Short Course * distance 15.8 nm.

Course B: Start established by committee boat off Willetts Creek; to Flasher No. 7 off Oak Island Channel, leaving it to port; through the center span of Robert Moses Causeway to Flashing Green No. 11, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point, leaving it to starboard; to Can No. 3 off Heckscher State Park, leaving it to port; to Black and White Mo(A) in Great Cove, leaving it to port; return through center span of the Causeway to finish line off Willetts Creek. Course distance: 13.2 nm. Short Course * distance 12.4 nm.

Course C: Start established by committee boat in vicinity of Willetts Creek; to Flasher No. 7 off Oak Island Channel, leaving it to port; through the center span of the Robert Moses Causeway to Flashing Green No. 11, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point, leaving it to port; to Black and White Mo(A) in Great Cove, leaving it to port; return through center span of the Causeway to finish line near Willetts Creek. Course distance: 9.8 nm. Short course * distance: 9.0 nm.

Course D: Start established by committee boat off Willetts Creek; to Flasher No. 7 off Oak Island Channel, leaving it to port; through the center span of the Robert

Moses Causeway to Nun No. 6, leaving it to port. Return through center span of the Causeway to finish line off Willetts Creek. Course distance: 4.4 nm. Short Course * distance 3.6 nm.

Course E: Start established by committee boat off Willetts Creek; to Flasher No. 7 off Oak Island Channel leaving it to port; through the center span of Robert Moses Causeway to Nun No. 6, leaving it to port; Return through center span of the Causeway to the starting line stake boat, leaving it to port; to Flasher No. 7 leaving it to port; to finish line off Willetts Creek. Course Distance: 6.0 nm. Short Course * distance: 5.2 nm.

Course F: Start established by committee boat in vicinity of Willetts Creek to Flasher No. 7 off Oak Island Channel, leaving it to port; through center span of the Robert Moses Causeway to Flashing Green No. 11, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Red No. 2 off Champlin Creek, leaving it to port; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point; leaving it to port; to Black and White Mo(A) in Great Cove, leaving it to port; return through center span of the Robert Moses Causeway to the finish line off Willetts Creek. Course distance: 11 nm. Shore Course * distance 10.2 nm.

Course G: Starting line between committee boat and Flasher No. 7 off Oak Island Channel; through center span of Robert Moses Causeway; leave Flashing Green No. 11 to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Howells Point, leaving it to port; return leaving Flashing Green No. 11 to port, through center span of the Robert Moses Causeway; to the finish line between the stake boat and the flagpole at the end of the Babylon Yacht Club dock (which should not be used as a rendezvous for this race). Course distance: 34.0 nm.

**For Babylon races, if short course is signaled, omit Flasher No. 7 on first leg and proceed directly to center span of Causeway.*

BAY SHORE COURSES

Course A: Start established by committee boat $\frac{1}{3}$ mile south-east of Brightwaters Canal; to Flashing Green No. 11 east of Robert Moses Causeway; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point; to Black and White Mo(A) in Great Cove; to Flashing Green No. 11; to finish line off Brightwaters Canal. Leave all marks to port. Course distance 5.2 nm.

If Short course is signalled proceed directly from Flashing Green No. 1 to finish line. Course distance 3.7 nm.

Course B: Start established by committee boat $\frac{1}{3}$ mile south-east of Brightwaters Canal; to Flashing Green No. 11 east of Robert Moses Causeway; to Flashing Red No. 2 off Champlin Creek; to finish line off Brightwaters Canal. Leave all marks to port. Course distance 4.7 nm.

RACING INFORMATION (Cont'd.)

Course C: (Should not be reversed for Twilight Races) Start established by committee boat $\frac{1}{3}$ mile south-east of Brightwaters canal; to Nun No. 6 east of Robert Moses Causeway; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point; to Black and White Mo(A) in Great Cove; to finish line off Brightwaters Canal. Leave all marks to port. Course distance 5.7 nm.

Course D: Start established by committee boat $\frac{1}{3}$ mile south-east of Brightwaters Canal; to Nun No. 6 east of Robert Moses Causeway, leaving it to port; to Flashing Green No. 11, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Red No. 4 off Nicoll Point, leaving it to port; return to finish line off Brightwaters Canal. Course distance 11.7 nm.

Course E: Start established by committee boat $\frac{1}{3}$ mile south-east of Brightwaters Canal; through the center span of Robert Moses Causeway; to Flasher No. 7 off Oak Island Channel, leaving it to port; return through center span; to Flashing Green No. 11 east of Robert Moses Causeway, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point, leaving it to port; to finish line off Brightwaters Canal. Course distance 9.1 nm.

Course F: Start established by committee boat $\frac{1}{3}$ mile south-east of Brightwaters Canal; to Nun No. 6 east of Robert Moses Causeway, leaving it to port; to Black and White Mo(A) in Great Cove, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Red No. 2, off Champlin Creek, leaving it to starboard; to starting line stake boat, leaving it to port; to Nun No. 6 east of Robert Moses Causeway, leaving it to port; to finish line off Brightwaters canal. Course distance 10.9 nm.

If short course is signalled, leg from Flashing Red No. 2 to stake boat is last leg. Course distance 7.4 nm.

Course G: Start established by committee boat $\frac{1}{3}$ mile south-east of Brightwaters Canal; to Nun No. 6 east of Robert Moses Causeway, leaving it to starboard; through center span of Robert Moses Causeway to Flasher No. 7 off Oak Island Channel, leaving it to port; through center span of Causeway to Flashing Green No. 11, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 15 off Point o'Woods, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Red No. 4 off Nicoll Point, leaving it to port; to Flashing Red No. 2 off Champlin Creek, leaving it to starboard; to finish line off Brightwaters Canal. Course A: Start established by committee boat in the vicinity of Can No. 3 off Heckscher State Park; to Flashing Red No. 2 off Champlin Creek; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point; to finish line near Can No. 3. Leave all marks to starboard. Course distance 3.5 nm.

Course B: Start established by committee boat in the vicinity of Can No. 3 off Heckscher State Park; to Nun No. 10 off Bay Shore; to BW Mo(A) in Great Cove; to finish line near Can No. 3. Leave all marks to starboard. Course distance 6.0 nm.

If short course is signalled, substitute Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point for BW Mo(A). Short course distance 5.2 nm.

Course C: Start established by committee boat in the vicinity of Can No. 3 off Heckscher State Park; to Flasher No. 3 in the Range Channel; to Nun No. 30 off Green Point; to finish near Can No. 3. Leave all marks to port. Course distance 7.0 nm.

If short course is signalled, substitute Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point for Nun No. 30. Short course distance 4.2 nm.

NICOLL BAY COURSES

Course A: Start established by committee boat in Nicoll Bay; to Flashing Green No. 15 off Point o'Woods, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point, leaving it to port; to Nun No. 10 off Bay Shore, leaving it to starboard; to finish line in Nicoll Bay. Course distance: 15.5 nm.

Course B: West Island Course. Start established by committee boat in Nicoll Bay; to Nun No. 10 off Bay Shore, leaving it to port, to Red and Black Quick Flasher off Saltaire, leaving it to port; to Flashing Red No. 8, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 15 of Point o'Woods, leaving it to port; to finish line in Nicoll Bay. Course distance: 15 nm.

RACING INFORMATION (Cont'd.)

This course may be sailed in the opposite direction with all marks left on the opposite hand. For the West Island Race itself, there is a special starting sequence.

Course C: Start established by committee boat in Nicoll Bay; to Flashing Red No. 4 off Nicoll Point, leaving it to port; to Red and Black Interrupted Quick Flashing Green south of Patchogue Channel, leaving it to starboard; to finish line ½ mile north of Sailor's Haven. Course distance: 13 nm.

Course D: Start established by committee boat in Nicoll Bay; to Flashing Red No. 18 off Point o'Woods; to Flasher No. 31 off Blue Point; to finish line in Nicoll Bay. Leave all marks to port. Course Distance: 12.0 nm.

Course E: Start established by committee boat in Nicoll Bay; to Flashing Red No. 4 off Nicoll Point; to Flasher No. 31 off Blue Point; to finish line in Nicoll Bay. Leave all marks to port. Course distance 12.0 nm.

Course F: Start established by committee boat in Nicoll Bay; to Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Red No. 2 off Champlin Creek, leaving it to port; to Flasher No. 3 off Point o'Woods, leaving it to port; to Nun No. 28 in Nicoll Bay, leaving it to port; to finish line in Nicoll Bay. Course distance 10.0 nm.

Course G: course deleted

Course H: Start established by committee boat in Nicoll Bay; to Flashing Red No. 4 off Nicoll Point, leaving it to port, to Nun No. 30 off Green Point, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Red No. 18 off Point o'Woods, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Red No. 2 off Champlin Creek, leaving it to starboard; to finish line in Nicoll Bay. Course distance 11.5 nm.

Course I: Start established by committee boat in Nicoll Bay; to Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Red No. 2 off Champlin Creek, leaving it to starboard; to Flasher No. 31 off Blue Point, leaving it to port; to finish line in Nicoll Bay. Course distance; 16.5 nm.

Course J: Start established by committee boat in Nicoll Bay; to Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point to Flashing Green No. 29 in Nicoll Bay; return to finish line in Nicoll Bay. Leave all marks to port. Course distance; 4 nm.

OCEAN COURSES

Ocean Course A: Start between committee boat and Buoy No. "4FI" off Fire Island Inlet; to Black and White Gong Buoy No. "J1" off Jones Inlet and return, leaving No. J1 to port. Course Distance: 26.5 nm.

RACING INFORMATION (Cont'd.)

Ocean Course B: Start between committee boat and Buoy No. "4FI" off Fire Island Inlet; to Nantucket Sea Lane Lighted Buoy "NB" and return, leaving Buoy "NB" to port. Course distance: 22 nm.

Notes on Ocean Race:

1. Harbor start from Sore Thumb one hour prior to Warning Gun.
2. If adverse weather conditions necessitate cancellation of the Ocean Race the committee boat will signal abandonment at Sore Thumb one hour prior to the Warning Gun.
3. If the Ocean Race is abandoned, there will be a "Bay Race" if wind and weather conditions permit.

Bay Race Course A: To Red and Black Quick Flasher off Saltaire; to Flashing Red No. 8, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 15 off Point o'Woods; to Flashing Red No. 5 off Nicoll Point; to finish line between committee boat and Flashing Red No. 2 off Champlin Creek. Leave all marks except No. 8 to port. Course distance depending on start locale.

Bay Race Course B: Through Snakehill Channel to Nun No. 6; to Mo(A) in Great Cove; to Can No. 3 off Heckscher Park; to finish line between committee boat and Flashing Green No. 11 off Brightwaters. Leave all marks to starboard. Course distance depending on start locale.

SAYVILLE COURSES

Course A: Start established by committee boat $\frac{1}{3}$ mile South-East of Brown Point; to Flashing Green 29 in Nicoll Bay, leaving it to port; to finish line off Brown Point. Course Distance: 5.0 nm.

Course B: Start established by committee boat $\frac{1}{3}$ mile South-East of Brown Point, to Red and Black interrupted Quick Flashing Green in Patchogue Bay, leaving it to port; to finish line off Brown Point. Course distance: 4.5 nm.

Course C: Start established by committee boat $\frac{1}{3}$ mile South-East of Brown Point; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Lone Hill; to Flashing Green No. 29 in Nicoll Bay; to finish line off Brown Point. Leave all marks to starboard. Course distance 7.5 nm.

Course D: Start established by committee boat $\frac{1}{3}$ mile South-East of Brown Point; to Flasher No. 1 off Watch Hill Channel; to Red and Black Interrupted Quick Flashing Green in Patchogue Bay; to finish line off Brown Point. Leave all marks to port. Course distance: 6.5 nm.

Course E: Start established by committee boat $\frac{1}{3}$ mile South-East of Brown Point; to Flashing Red No. 18 off Point o'Woods; to Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point; to finish line off Brown Point. Leave all marks to starboard. Course distance: 8.5 nm.

RACING INFORMATION (Cont'd.)

Course F: Start established by committee boat $\frac{1}{3}$ mile South-East of Brown Point; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Lone Hill, leaving it to port; to finish line off Brown Point, Course distance: 4.4 nm.

Course G: Start established by committee boat East of Blue Point; to Flasher No. 31, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point, leaving it to port; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Lone Hill, leaving it to port; to finish line off Blue Point. Course distance 12.5 nm.

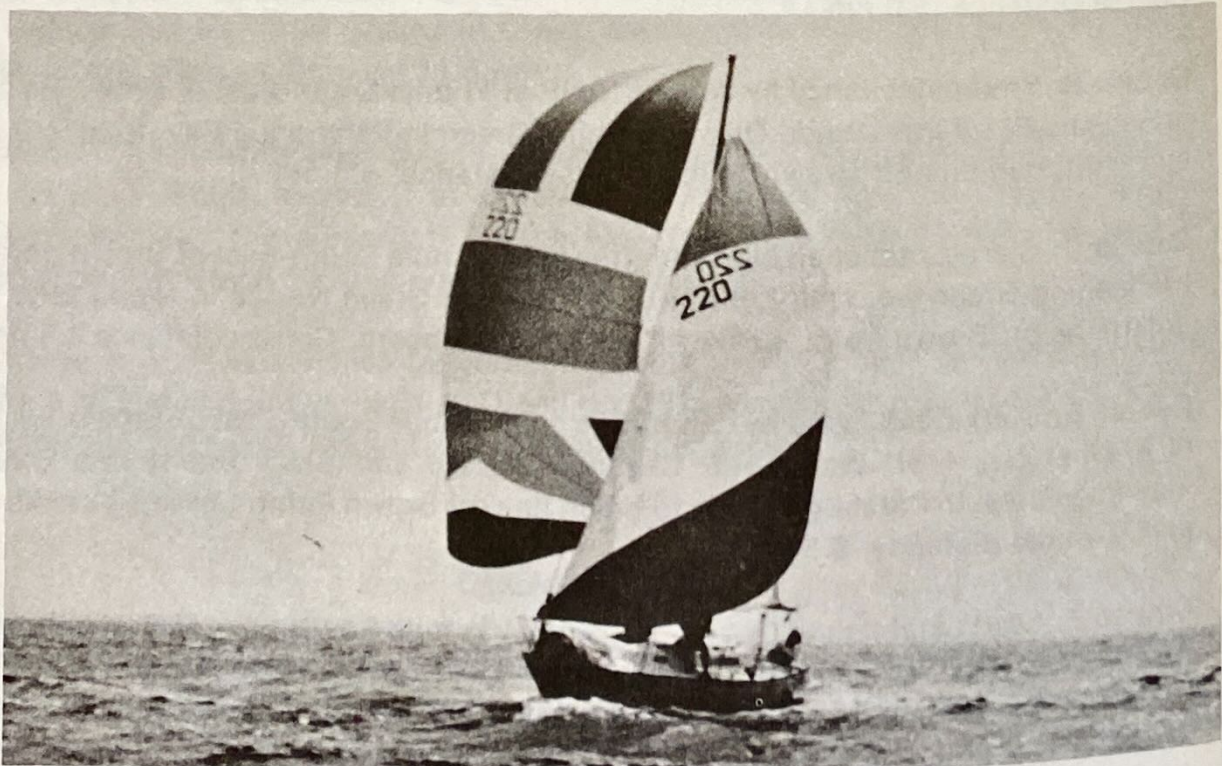
If short course is signalled, substitute Nun No. 30 for Flashing Green No. 5. Short course distance 9.4 nm.

Course H: Start established by committee boat in vicinity of Flashing Green No. 1 off Howells Point; to Flashing Red No. 32 off Swan River, leaving it to port; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Lone Hill, leaving it to starboard; to Nun No. 2 off Patchogue River, leaving it to starboard; to finish line off Howells Point. Course distance: 13.5 nm.

Course I: Start established by committee boat in vicinity of Flashing Green No. 1 off Howells Point; to Flasher No. 31 off Blue Point, leaving it to port; to finish line off Howells Point. Course distance: 9.0 nm.

WATCH HILL COURSES

Course A: Start in vicinity of North end of channel to Watch Hill; to finish at or near Nun 10 at the entrance to the West Channel. Distance 10.2 nm.

FEBRUARY 7 - "Emergency First Aid Aboard" by Dr. Charles Curry, Chief of Emergency Facilities, Good Samaritan Hospital.

FEBRUARY 14 - "Off Shore Sailing and Safety" by Captain Jack Young of Courtesan, SBCC's ocean sailing and racing expert.

All meetings were well attended and most popular with the membership.

Commodore Bud Rosenberg presented the committee with a challenging assignment - putting together a program for our "latent" novice racing skippers, who, he felt, might need encouragement to come out and race in the new Non-Spinnaker Class.

With the able assistance of Capts. Buyer, Forman, Johnson, Rosenberg and Thayer, a program was developed and presented on January 23rd at La Grange covering the topics:

Preparing to Race

- Ashore
- On-board

The Race

- Start and Windward Leg-Rounding the Mark
- Spinnaker legs - Reaching and Running
- The finish
- Basic Rules and Tactics

After the Race - The rendezvous

The lecture program was followed by two novice races on June 4th with experienced skippers volunteering their services as crew members aboard the novice skipper's vessels.

The Novice Racing Program was attended by a small enthusiastic group of skippers and crews. The committee recommends expanding the lecture and racing program for the novices in 1978.

The dinner dance was held on February 5th. One hundred and fifty people, braving the elements, made it thru extreme icy conditions to La Grange. It was worth the effort - as always it was one of the grandest nights of the season. Road conditions were so bad that some sort of Icy Road Award should have been bestowed upon those brave souls who traveled up to two hours to attend the festivities.

While all of us were attending lectures and dancing during the deep freeze - Racing Chairman Ed Buyer and V.C. Dick Nehring were rejuvenating the 1977 Racing Program. It is a ten point program to entice more of us to cross the starting line. We all enjoy seeing how our boats perform. Often while day sailing down the bay we quietly race the boats around us. Pushing the weed off the rudder, adjusting the sails or sitting very still while a puff slides one boat ahead of another - its all part of the fun of racing. Listed below are the new changes:

1. The number of races have been reduced by about thirty per cent. The most popular remain.
2. The number of trophies awarded per race has been reduced in some instances; i.e. no trophy for fourth place.
3. An attempt is being made to incorporate social activities with more of the races.
4. Instead of the two club classes (I and II) being divided by boat speed, the two classes will be "Spinnaker Class" and "Non-Spinnaker Class". "S" and "M" classes will remain as they are now.
5. A skipper may change classes without restriction except during the races.
6. To interest new racing skippers, two short races will be held at Secret Harbor early on and each new skipper will have aboard one of the "old salts" to help tune the boat, start the race, and otherwise "show the ropes".
7. Before the racing starts, one or two meetings will be held for the new racing skippers to discuss starting techniques, and a few of the basic rules (like how to remember which is port). Nothing profound.
8. Class banners will be awarded to the "winningest" boat in each class plus a banner for the most improved of the year.
9. So that everyone will have a fairly good idea of where they finished in each race, Ed Miller is switching to a time-on-distance formula for the Club rule.
10. The racing fee has been changed to \$10.00.

The General Meeting of April first had to do with Cruising. Under the leadership of Cruising Chairman Bo Spivack, the awards for the Green Water, Blue Water, Great River and the 1976 Cruise were distributed to one and all. The

remainder of the evening was devoted to discussing the 1977 Cruise. Mast stepping, safety, charts and radio contact were discussed. The meeting broke into groups - the Scenic cruise with Bo Spivack and the Ambitious Cruise with Rodger Ramsdell. The cruises were designed to satisfy everyone's appetite for cruising.

May 14th marked our Spring Cocktail Party which was held at the Bay Shore Y.C. with two hundred attendance! Delicious food and a grand band (The University of Illinois Steel Band) for background music. Directions for arriving by boat were extremely accurate, no one reported grounding out.

Commissioning Day, Monday May 30th arrived with perfect weather. A record crowd attended to consume five hundred hot dogs - washed down with unrecorded amounts of beer, pop, etc. The auction was conducted by Boyd Max and Bud Rosenberg. So successfully did they run this affair - they became speechless, which pleased their wives.

July 9th Cruise time; Bo Spivack the cruise chairman who lead the scenic cruise submitted the following from the Log of the "Wilde Thyme".

The summer cruise for the year 1977 was divided into three cruise areas. It was the intent of the Cruise Committee to make the cruise attractive so that many of the new and past members would be interested in participating.

The ambitious cruise, under the leadership of Captain Roger Ramsdell, traveled to such far distant places as Cutty Hunk, Nantucket, Edgertown and Menemsha and by all reports had a most enjoyable voyage and visitation.

The two remaining cruise groups combined to form one and took the route of the Scenic Cruise.

The assembly of the fleet at Cormorant Point on Saturday, July 9 was impressive as usual. The count of vessels was difficult to make because of continued arrivals and departures, but we counted upwards of sixty vessels. On Saturday evening at 1730 hours, the two cruise Captains had their respective skippers meetings, and on Sunday at 0500, the two cruise groups parted company.

The Scenic Cruise group started moving through the Shinnecock Canal at 1000 hours. Vessels had their masts removed at the south end and replaced at the north end of the canal. The many helping hands made the task move quickly and efficiently. By late afternoon on Sunday, most of us were in West Neck Harbor Having a cool swim.

On Monday at noon we moved on to Coecles Harbor. The next day, Tuesday, July 12 at 0630, nineteen vessels of our fleet left Coecles Harbor under very cloudy skies. There was a good wind from the southwest and it carried us to and through the Race in good order. As we approached the mid point of the Sound, the wind died completely and it became very cloudy and hot, and so it was back to the "Iron Sail". We reached Hamburg Cove in the early part of that day and after a quick swim it was "all aboard" the Lady Lynn and a shopping trip to Essex. After shopping in Essex, there was nothing to do but have dinner at the Griswald Inn. Once back at Hamburg Cove, we turned in for a quiet and restful night. Our next day, Wednesday, July 13, was planned as a "lay-over" day. For most of the fleet, it was a boat trip up the Connecticut River for lunch at the air conditioned dining room or beer garden at the Gilston House and then a visit to the town of East Haddem.

On Thursday, July 14, we left Hamburg Cove under a moderate breeze down the Connecticut River and easterly in the sound to Stonington Harbor. The visit to Stonington Harbor gave the fleet a chance to be in a good anchorage where showers and other dockside facilities are available. The town of Stonington is very interesting to visit.

On Friday, July 15, we left Stonington at 1200 hours and had a very pleasant sail across the Sound to Block Island. It was an ideal day for a sail across the Sound and it was enjoyed by all. At Block Island, many of us rafted up at the Block Island Marina while others remained anchored in the harbor. During our stay at Block Island, several other vessels of the S.B.C.C. joined us in the harbor. Our stay in Block Island included lots of swimming, eating out, and just having fun. On Monday, July 18, we departed Block Island at 0800 heading for Montauk. The wind was very light. Midway in our trip to Montauk, we encountered a very heavy fog. With some careful navigation, horn blowing and bell ringing, we got through the fog. As we emerged from the fog Montauk Point became visible.

At the suggestion of the Captain of the Sinn Fein, after we entered the Montauk Harbor area, we proceeded in a southeasterly direction to the Captains Marina where some of our vessels took dock space, and some of us remained on the hook. This was during the extreme hot spell of the summer. At the Captains Marina, they had a very cool, fresh water pool, and very good facilities. We extended our stay at this harbor for an extra day because of the very cool pool and the very hot weather.

On Tuesday evening, the operators of the Captains Marina set up a lobster and steak cookout. It was very tasty and resonable in price. On Wednesday, July 20, we left Lake Montauk and sailed to Deering Harbor on Shelter Island. There was a short stop over at Greenport for provisions and shopping. Once in Deering Harbor, we looked for a cool spot to drop the anchor. It was still very hot and we all needed a cool swim.

On Thursday at about mid day, we sailed out of Deering Harbor and headed for West Neck Harbor on the south side of Shelter Island. There we were joined by several other vessels of the S.B.C.C.

On Friday, July 22 with a strong gusty wind out of the northeast, we sailed down through the bay to Shinnecock Canal. Arriving at the Canal at about 1000 hours, we proceeded to remove mast for the canal passage. The wind was rather strong and this made the task more difficult but with help and care, the job was done and the fleet was assembling at Cormorant Point at 1400 hours.

On Saturday, July 23 at 1000 hours, we all upped anchor and headed west toward the Great South Bay. In the Moriches area we found our way through the winding path with a few minor groundings. Once in Bellport Bay, the entire fleet was under full sail coming down the bay. Most of us headed into Great River for a final evening of singing and story telling. The singalong conducted by "Big" John Woodward concluded the cruise for 1977.

Rodger Ramsdell tells of the adventures of the Ambitious cruise in the log of the "Puritan".

The ketch Puritan was Flagship of the two week cruise to Southern New England

and the Islands. The crew was composed of Roger, Skipper and Group Captain, Isabelle, Chief Mate, Navigator and Supply Officer and Linda, Bosun and Junior Morale Officer. The little ketch cast off from her Amityville wharf at 1430 on Friday July 8. She towed behind her, a Dyer Sailing Dink. After taking aboard precious gasoline, sail was raised, which included the Mizzen, Main, Staysail and Jib and she sailed east on a broad reach pushed by a light 8 to 10 knot Southwest wind - a good omen for the first days run. The little ketch anchored in Great River at 1900 among many other sailing craft from the Cruising Club.

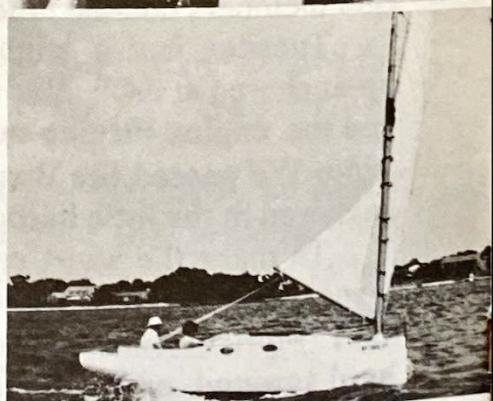
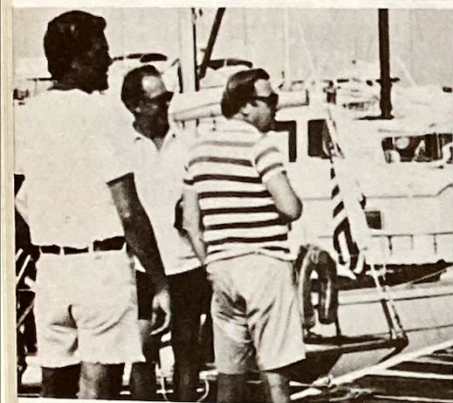
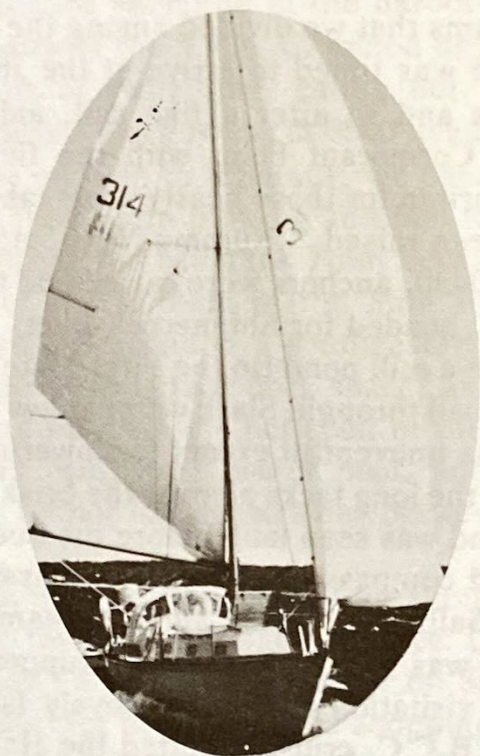
Saturday was a beautiful day. Before we raised the anchor, a friendly clammer donated a half bushel of clams that we divided among the fleet that still remained. The departure time of 0845 was timed to arrive at the shallows of Moriches and Ponquogue at a rising tide and so after a fine sail, aided by our trusty "iron staysail" we anchored at Cormorant Point with the fleet at 1730. A skippers meeting was held on the Puritan for those hearty souls taking the outside passage. The Cocktail flag having been raised, "Nummy Num" time commenced.

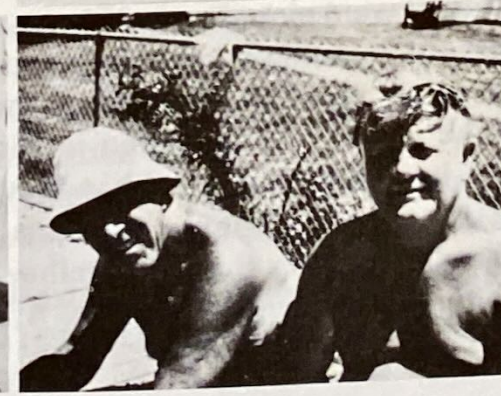
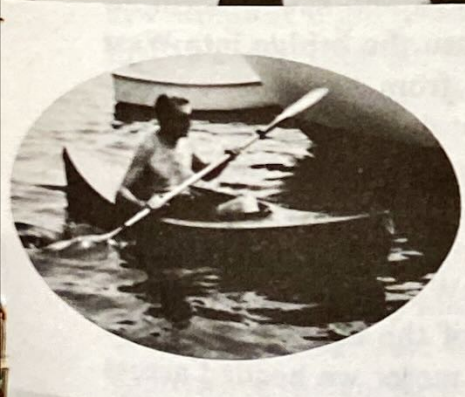
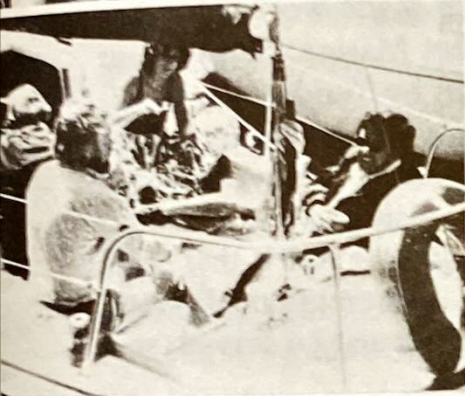
On the 10th of July at 0430, anchors were raised and the fleet of thirty sailing craft, running lights aglow, headed for Shinnecock Inlet. The fleet arrived at the narrow inlet, which was like a mill pond (to the First Mate's great delight) at 0525 and proceeded to power and sail through. Slack water at low tide was calculated to be 0530. The sail eastward was uneventful except for lowering the main, furling the jib, raising the main during the long tacks against the brisk east wind. The weather was so clear that Block Island was seen long before the fleet cleared Montauk. The run to Block was at an odd compass course to compensate for the swift flowing incoming tide at the Race. Sails were furled and we steamed into Great Salt Pond and were soon at anchor. It was 1735. Cocktails and supper were greatly received.

Monday was rest and visitation day on the lovely Island. More of the fleet arrived and a total of 35 S.B.C.C. cruisers dotted the Harbor. Various groups of club members donned fancy clothes and ate ashore at many of the fine restaurants.

Tuesday had a slight overcast, but the weather report was good, so we up-anchored at 0800 after morning colors and headed for sea. With four sails flying and the engine turning over 1000 RPM we sailed east with an 8 to 12 knot south wind. We passed the Buzzard Bay tower and headed for Cuttyhunk. At 1515 we anchored in the little harbor. Twenty-four of our sailing cruisers had made the trip.

To make the short passage up the west side of the Elizebeth Islands with a favorable tide meant a late start. And so we put to sea on Wednesday the 13th at 1051. More overcast skies. As we left Cuttyhunk Harbor, we spotted the Barcorol hard aground, on her side. So we steamed over to her. Sitting on the lower rail was Captain Mo, he waived indicating all was well and he would have to wait for the next high tide. A brisk sail to the east before 25 knot SW winds brought us to beautiful Hadley Harbor, where we anchored with 19 club yachts. Some of the young sailors gathered mussels which were steamed and dipped in hot butter for cocktail hour - What a treat! As we lay at anchor, a magnificent Friendship Sloop tacked into the harbor and anchored under sail, no engine, through the crowded anchorage. A fine example of able seamanship. The sloop was the famous "Eastward" owned and sailed by Mary and Roger Duncan. It was a treat to observe

this magnificent vessel in action.

Thursday was clear. The current thru Woods Hole is so severe that small vessels can only navigate thru it at slack water. This meant an early departure to make the slack and have the current with us to Nantucket. On July 14th at 0435, anchors were raised. Coffee was boiled and the little fleet steamed out of the Harbor. Captains and Mates stood at their helms wearing warm sweaters to keep out the morning cold and tightly gripping their hot mugs of Java. There was a very light NW breeze so Puritan motored at 1200 to 1400 RPM down the Sound. At 1115, we steamed into Nantucket Harbor. Reservations had been made weeks ahead so one by one the yachts were assigned berths in the Nantucket Marina. Some of our cruisers preferred to anchor out in the Harbor and came in by Tender.

Friday was Hot! From the radio reports old New York was suffering a heat wave. 18 Cruising Club boats were accounted for here at "Nan". This was another day for relaxing, lunch ashore, a tour of the Island by Bus, visitations to historical spots, museums and shopping for much needed supplies. Rumor has it that some yachts consumed more spirited refreshments than their consumption of water, stove fuel and gasoline combined. The inner man and women must be served; so it is said.

The next destination was Martha's Vineyard. Saturday started out as another beautiful day. But when the fleet left at 0930 a haze set in and then followed by a fog. An 18 knot wind from the WSW blew hard as the fleet under shortened sail bent to windward. By noon it cleared and Chapaquidick Island was sighted. It was 1430 when the Killick was dropped in Edgartown Harbor, a beautiful day, again!

Sunday was a day of rest, church and touring the picturesque Island. Many of our hearty salts took time to dine ashore. The S.B.C.C. Ambitious Cruise fleet numbered 16.

The cruise was in it's second week and so on Manday July 18 a small portion of the fleet, following the planned itinerary, up anchor at 1230 and sailed north for Cape Cod. By 1515 we were in Osterville. We steamed thru the bridge into West Bay near Cotuit. The fleet anchored at 1600. 6 yachts from the club were in Osterville, the rest of the fleet had elected to spend another day in Edgartown. The afternoon was spent swimming, relaxing cocktailing and of course eating.

Tuesday was another beautiful day. The fleet raised their hooks at 0530 and steamed to the west. At 0925 we anchored in Tarpolin Cove. What a beautiful sight to see eleven S.B.C.C. boats at anchor in this lovely spot. We watched the famous topsail schooner Shennendoah raise canvas and sail out of the cove. At 1430 the fleet departed for the "Vineyard". Under reefed sail and motor we headed across Vineyard Sound. The southwest wind picked up to 25 knots and met the outgoing tide water and the famous Vineyard Sound seas grew larger and larger. On the second tack, with deck awash, we came about and headed in towards Menemsha. It was 1830 when we came thru the jetties. We anchored in Menemsha Pond. The group now numbered 14. It was a long, busy day - All hands turned in early.

It was now July 20, Wednesday, slightly overcast. At 0700, the fleet up anchored and gingerly threaded it's way thru the shallow, swiftly flowing, narrow stream connecting the Pond and Menemsha Harbor. At 0815, beautiful, colorful

Gay Head was sighted to port. Because of light winds which blew into our teeth, we elected to steam the entire trip. So at 1600 RPM, we powered westward. A haze developed followed by fog. As we approached Block Island, a huge shadow appeared on our port bow - it was a tanker and was so close that we could see that the mate in the pilot house hadn't shaved! She turned and headed west down the Sound. Finally, after 45 miles on the high seas we anchored in the Great Salt Pond at Block Island at 1555. Many boats rafted for cocktails. Because of the strong winds and questionable holding bottom, the rafts broke up for the night.

Thursday was a day of rest. 25 cruising club yachts were in the Salt Pond. The group captain and his lady sailed around the harbor in their dink, hailing or visiting all the cruisers in the fleet. A lovely old clipper bow sloop was anchored off our stern. Her mast was gone and a gaff and boom were lashed to her deck. Her very salty, bearded, pig-tailed captain explained that while sailing up from the Caribbean he was caught in a storm off Block Island and dismasted. He was living aboard, working ashore to have a new rig built. It was the sloop Pelican, built by Herreshoff in 1890. Then word came first by radio and then by Coast Guard, that a NW storm was due to hit the Island this evening - WHAM, it did arrive - Every boat was battened down with the second anchor at the ready. The yachts stood facing into the blow. Puritan had 200 feet of anchor cable down and a Yachtsman anchor hung from the bowsprit. The engine was kept turning over at 500 RPM as a standby. During the heavy rain, a young teenager, who had been caught ashore, rowed ably thru the gale aided by flashlights to her ship. The sea produces some very able young slats.

"Friday is here", say the captains. At 0430 lights appear in the cabins of the little ships at anchor. Delicious odors of cooking coffee and bacon come from the many "Charley Nobles". At 0500, anchors are raised, sails are raised and the fleet departs for Long Island. As we sailed westward and were still off Block Island, we saw Montauk Light dead ahead. At 0815 we were at Montauk. The wind picked up, first 15 knots, then 20, then 25 and finally 30 knots. What a run under shortened sail. With a bone in her teeth, the Puritan leaped ahead. At 1315 we sailed thru Shinnecock Inlet. A record run, by cracky! By 1400 we were anchored behind Cormorant Point, rafting and cocktails aiding in the rejoicing. A good day's sail.

Saturday saw the fleet leaving Cormorant at 1000. So the South Bay Cruising Club headed thru the Bays and Canals and thru many bridges until 1330 when we entered Bellport Bay and looked westward into the sun at our own Great South Bay. Sailing into a variable blustery NW wind, we progressed up the Bay. At 1755 we approached the anchored fleet at the river. Amid hails of greeting and blasts on the horns, we anchored in our home waters.

Sunday, July 24 arrived. The wind was blowing hard from the old familiar southeast. After a great breakfast of bacon, eggs, toast, jam and coffee, we pulled the hook, raised sail and headed home.

At 1425 we tied up at our home berth in Amityville. A great cruise and an even greater crew. The last entry in the log reads, "God Bless Us All."

On August 6th the West Island Race was held. A great day with just the right south west breeze to make a well attended race perfect. Sunday morning August

7th dawned bright and beautiful: Services were held on the front lawn at Snapper inn by Father Langley. Ten o'clock breakfast was served. The snap, crackle and pop of the cereal was drowned out by the loud popping of the Champagne corks being torn from their moorings. Oh what a beautiful morning! That afternoon a Character Boat Parade was held complete with costumes. The boats passed in review, winding through the fleet past Don Zimmer and his panel of judges. A well received parade it was. Much thought and effort was expended on resurrecting the costumes and dressing ship. Prizes were awarded - First place W. Menger #117, Second H. Langley #388, Third A. Davison #256, Fourth A. Yaxis #125, Fifth R. Snyder #161, Sixth Stott #247, and Seventh to F. Braddon #21.

Monday morning Lois Spivack, Lady Lynn and Wally Katchel served Coffee and Doughnuts on a sizeable raft for the first get-together of Great River Week. John Beinert and Fred Eggerstedt the race committee for the week held a racing skippers meeting to discuss the racing activities for the week. Then on to racing or to swimming for the non-races and snoozing for the non-swimmers or what ever. Tuesday called for dinghy rowing and sailing racing for all ages and sexes. The youngsters were awarded Mac Donald Gift Certificates. The Ladies won Champagne'. In the evening Chantyman Ed Schecker conducted a sing-a-long that was just super. Ed wrote a cruise song to the tune of the Wiffenpoof song which appears on page 66.

Wednesday everyone was told to go fly a kite! There are two kinds that one may fly. MFK or CFK. - figure that one out....The Stott family took first place, Ward Brook second, and Ann Davison third in the MFK class. In the CFK class Eric Wieda first place and Peter Davis took second. Thursday the weather was watery. The Cookout at Tallsmen was cancelled. Friday the Dinghy Train toured the canals on the east side of Great River. A treat for all - the folks along the canals enjoyed it too. Saturday the rain stopped and started most of the day while every one rested for the Blast. The "Blast" held at Timber Point was capped by a Thunder and Lightning extravaganza - a grand finale to a lovely week.

August 20th the Foulk trophy race was held at Babylon Y.C. with great style. Earl Murray and his committee made a black tie affair of it. They did an excellent job, as efficient as good looking. The following Saturday Jack Layton conducted the Commodores Cup race with Ralph Logan taking the honors as best of the fleet. Sunday August 28th the Ladies Race had a total of eleven boats competing round the course. Gene Reardon handled the committee duties and declared Blithe Spirit first, Decatur second, and Falcon third.

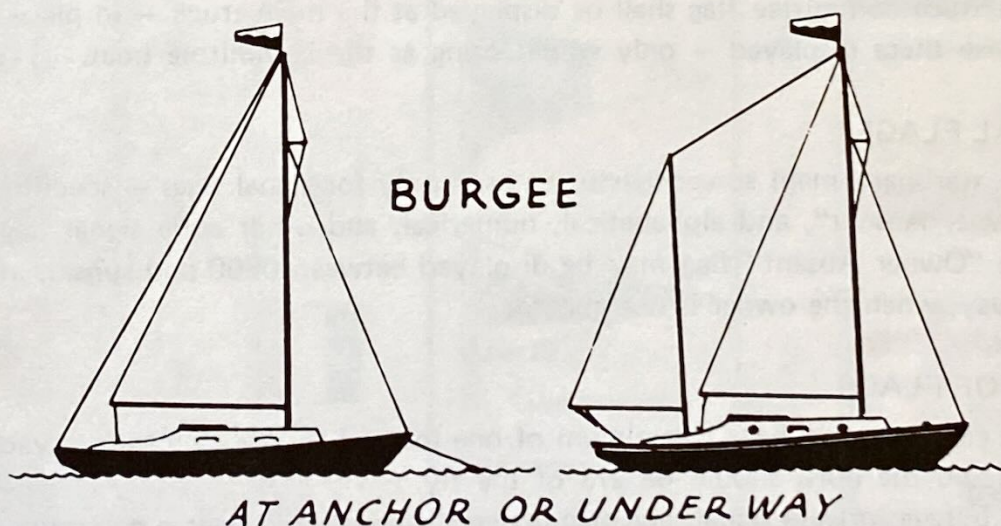
FLAG ETIQUETTE

The correct display of flags, signals, and ensigns is one of the more obvious marks of a yachtsman. This inflexible code is steeped in the tradition of the sea and promotes uniformity in communication and identification between yachts. The complete flag etiquette of the N.A.Y.R.U. covers ten pages. We offer below a paraphrased version that covers the signals that are used daily on small or medium sized sailing yachts.



THE ENSIGN

1. The ensign is displayed between 0800 and sunset only.
2. The ensign is displayed at anchor or under power along at a stern staff.
3. The ensign may be displayed under sail at the after peak of gaff-rigged yachts, otherwise 2/3 of the way up the leach of the aftermost sail.

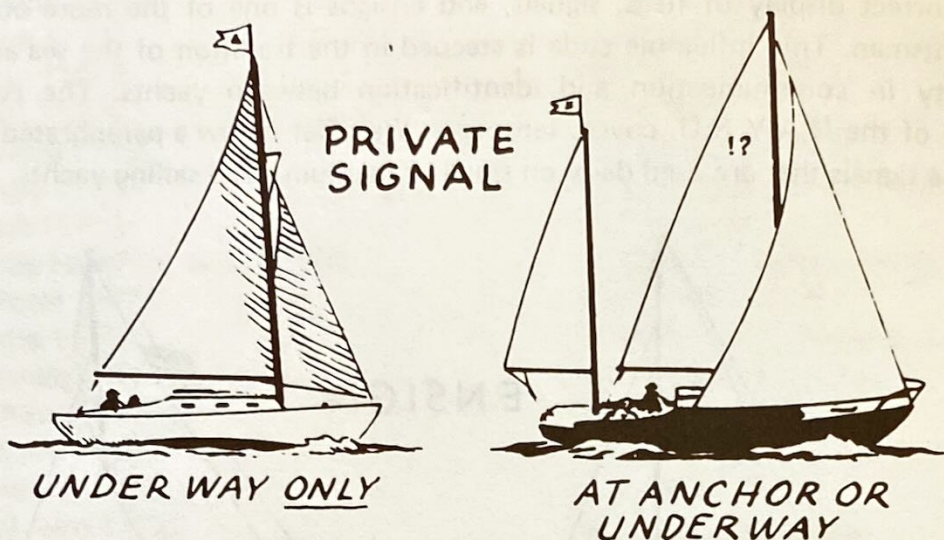


THE BURGEE

The club burgee is displayed whenever the ensign is displayed, but may also be displayed separately, between 0800 and sunset, while at anchor or underway, on

1. The masthead of single-masted yachts
2. The forward masthead of two-masted yachts
3. NEVER at the spreader

THE PRIVATE SIGNAL

The owner's private signal may be displayed between 0800 and sunset on:

1. Single-masted yachts while underway in place of the club burgee at the masthead.
2. Two-masted yachts at the after masthead, at anchor and underway.

FLAG OFFICERS' FLAGS

A flag officer shall display his flag both day and night in place of and instead of his private signal on two-masted yachts or at the masthead of single-masted yachts.

RACE COMMITTEE FLAG

The Race committee flag shall be displayed at the main truck — in place of the flag otherwise there displayed — only while acting as the committee boat.

SIGNAL FLAGS

The starboard main spreader is to be used only for signal flags — specific flags, such as "Owner Absent", and alphabetical, numerical, and other code signal flags.




































The "Owner Absent" flag may be displayed between 0800 and sunset, at anchor or underway, when the owner is not aboard.

SIZES OF FLAGS

The ensign should have a minimum of one inch of fly for each foot of yacht's overall length, and the hoist should be $\frac{2}{3}$ of the fly.

The burgee, private signal, and flag officers' flags should have a minimum of $\frac{1}{2}$ inch of fly for each foot of height of the highest mast, and the hoist should be $\frac{2}{3}$ of the fly.
