## RACING PROGRAM — SCORING/SERIES

- Members may change classes as often as they desire except that no class change is permitted after the warning signal.

- The Novice class is a temporary Non-Spinnaker class designed to encourage new skippers (or others who have never won a trophy in previous seasons) to race in the early races of the season.

### SCORING METHOD

SBCC races will be scored using the Time on Distance method. A yacht's time allowance is calculated by multiplying her SBCC handicap by the race course distance. The time allowance is then subtracted from the yacht's elapsed time yielding corrected time. The Yacht with the lowest corrected time is the winner.

Race results are mailed to each participating skipper shortly after each race and official results are printed monthly in the "Masthead".

### SERIES SCORING

Points for each race will be awarded on the basis of  $\frac{3}{4}$ -point for first, two points for second, three points for third, etc. DNF and WDR boats will receive 1 point more than the number of boats in that class that started in the series. DNS and DSQ boats will receive 2 points more than the number of boats in that class that started in the series.

A starter in any one race of the series will be considered to have started in all the races of the series. Series position will be determined by the total points accumulated by each yacht, in inverse order. When there is a tie on points between two or more yachts the tie shall be broken in favor of the yacht or yachts with the most first places, and when the tie remains, the most second places and so on, if necessary, for such races as count for total points. When the tie remains it shall stand as part of the final series results.

A Yacht that serves as committee boat for one race of any series will receive credit towards series qualification for that race and points equal to the average of its finish positions in the other races of the series, DNS and DNF races included. This does not apply to the Family Race (which is not a series) or to the Class Championship.

### SERIES INFORMATION

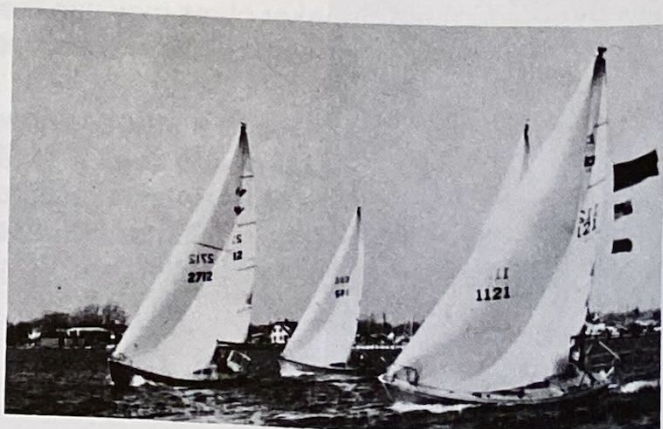
#### Tune-Up Series

This is a two-race series with no throw-outs. To emphasize tuning, no prizes will be awarded.

#### East, West, Babylon and Wind-Up Twilight Series

These are three-race series. They will be scored on the basis of a yacht's best two races. (Except committee boat, as noted above.) Non-Spinnaker class only.

The Western Twilight Spring Series includes an expanded start for novice racers.



## RACING PROGRAM — SERIES/CHAMPIONSHIP/TROPHIES

### Pursuit Series

These are two-race series with no throw-outs. There will be a raft-up in Secret Harbor between races. Non-Spinnaker class only.

### Summer Series

This is a two-race series with no throw-outs. There will be a separate start for Novices (see Expanded start sequence).

### Great River Week

This is a five-race series. It will be scored on the basis of a yacht's best four races. Racers traditionally join the Great River Week raft up after each race.

### Sayville Yacht Club Invitation

See SYC start sequence (Page 20). No streamers required for catboats. No throw-outs. On Saturday, all boats will sail Nicoll Bay Course G.

On Sunday, Sp and NS classes will sail Sayville Course G; catboats will follow SYC instructions.

### SBCC CLASS CHAMPIONSHIP

Class Championship trophies will be awarded to the yachts with the best scores in 10 races. The races or series selected are designated with note 7, 8 or 14 in the racing schedule, except that a maximum of any three Yacht Club Invitationals may be used, which are designated as alternates (Note 8) in the yearbook. Points for these races are computed on the following basis: 1st place yacht receives points equal to the number of starters in the race plus  $\frac{1}{4}$  point; the 2nd place yacht receives  $1\frac{1}{4}$  points less than the 1st place yacht; the 3rd place yacht receives  $2\frac{1}{4}$  points less than the 1st place yacht, etc.

### RACE TROPHIES

Perpetual trophies are awarded for one year only. They are awarded to the yacht with the best corrected time based on the SBCC Handicap rule.

Each year the club awards nine perpetual trophies, as follows:

*Commodore's Cup* — Best corrected time in the Commodore's Cup Race.

*Foulke Trophy* — Best corrected time in the Foulke Trophy Race (night race).

*Sympatico Cup* — Last yacht to cross the finish line in the Foulke Trophy race.

*Smith Trophy* — Best corrected time in the Smith Trophy Race.

*Deale Trophy* — Best corrected time in the West Island Race.

*Schnur Trophy* — Last yacht to cross the finish line in the West Island Race.

*Governor's Cup* — Best total score for the Commodore's Cup, West Island and Foulke Trophy Races.

*Patricia A. Kelly* — Best corrected time in the Ladies' Race by a yacht with an all-girl crew. Additional trophies will be awarded to yachts with an all-girl crew in accordance with the "number of starters" competing.

*Cruising Club Crock* — Best corrected time in the Around Long Island Race.

Keeper cups are given to winners of these trophies and their names are engraved on the perpetual trophy. It is the responsibility of the winner of the perpetual trophy to return it by November 1 to the Trophy Chairman for engraving of the following year's winner.

## RACING PROGRAM — RULES/PROTESTS

Trophies for individual SBCC races (when not part of a series) will be awarded to each class, according to the following schedule:

Number of Starters	Trophies for
2 or 3	1st
4 through 6	1st and 2nd
7 or more	1st, 2nd and 3rd

In SBCC series, the greatest number of starters in any race will govern the number of trophies awarded for that series. Only first place trophies will be awarded for the Class Race.

### RULES

Racing rules of the USYRU shall be observed except as otherwise specified in these instructions. Burgees and other flags may be flown when racing. Government navigation buoys not stated to be marks of the course may be disregarded at the discretion of the skipper.

The Inland Rules will replace Part IV of the Racing Rules between the hours of sunset and sunrise. All required lights must be shown.

### IDENTIFICATION

Racing numbers, either USYRU or SBCC, are required on mainsails, spinnakers and overlapping (LP greater than 130% J) headsails, in accordance with current USYRU rules.

Racing yachts are required to fly class streamers of the following colors from their standing backstays or the leach of the mainsails. Streamers should measure 4"x18".

Absence of a streamer or racing numbers will be cause for disqualification.

### EQUIPMENT

The equipment required by USYRU for category 4 races and the minimum USCG safety equipment is strongly recommended for all races.

### PROTESTS

The SBCC Protest Committee operates under Racing Rules of the USYRU, supplemented by published decisions of the USYRU Appeals Committee. In addition, it shall hear all protests arising from violation of the Inland Rules which replace PART IV of the USYRU rules between sunset and sunrise.

## RACING PROGRAM — RACE PROCEDURE

It will only entertain protests made in conformity to the USYRU rules including:

- Display of protest flag
- Notification of protested yacht
- Notification of Race Committee
- Submission of written protest within 72 hours
- Citation of rule or rules allegedly infringed

Protest must be addressed to the Chairman of the Protest Committee and hand-delivered or postmarked within 72 hours of the conclusion of the race in question.

Written protests for the Ocean Invitational must be submitted immediately after the race.

### SPECIAL RACE REQUIREMENTS

**Single-Handed Creepstakes** — Only Skipper is allowed on boat during race.  
Two Classes: 30 foot LOA and over; and under 30 foot LOA.

**Novice Day** — Open only to members who have never won a trophy in previous seasons. The morning "race" will consist of a series of short windward/leeward "sprints." Succeeding warning guns will go off ten minutes after the last boat finishes. As many starts will be run as time permits. There will be no score for these practice "sprints." The afternoon trophy race will begin after a lunch time raft up in Secret Harbor. Experienced crew will be available on request.

**Pursuit Races** — This is a special "staggered start" series where "slower" yachts get a head start over "faster" yachts. Theoretically, all yachts should finish together, but the first yacht to finish wins. Start sequence lists will be mailed to racers prior to the Spring race. The list will give each yacht's start time and detailed instructions covering the conduct of these races. This list should be saved as it will also be used for the Fall series.

**Smith Trophy and Summer Series** — There will be a separate start for Novices after the Spin and No-Spin classes. (see expanded start sequence)

**Family Race** — Non-Spinnaker race to and from Watch Hill. Crews must sleep aboard Saturday night.

**West Island Race** — The Spin and No-Spin classes will be split into divisions for this race: Spin #1, Spin #2, No-Spin #1 and No-Spin #2. Yachts handicapped at 203 or under will be assigned to Spin or No-Spin Division #1 and yachts handicapped over 203 will be assigned to Spin or No-Spin Division #2.

**Ladies' Race** — Skipper must be a lady. Patricia A. Kelly Trophy for best in fleet with all-girl crew. Yachts eligible for this trophy must advise Race Committee prior to first warning signal.

**Class Race** — A one-design race for any class with three or more entries. Class racers are required to fly their Spin or No-Spin class streamers to signify which division they are racing in. Classes may hold both Spin and No-Spin races provided the minimum of three entrants are satisfied in *each* division (in this case both divisions will start together but will be scored separately).

## RACING PROGRAM — RACE PROCEDURE

### STARTING

Signals will be made at five minute intervals with each signal lowered one minute before the hoisting of the next. The visual signal governs; the gun merely calls attention to it.

When, after a starting signal, all the yachts of the class or classes involved have properly started, the Race Committee will, if practicable, announce "all clear."

### RECALLS

The Race Committee will endeavor to notify any yacht starting early by means of a Recall signal. The signal will be one blast of a horn or whistle for each yacht over early. The committee will also hail the yachts being recalled individually. Near-by yachts are requested to pass the hail. Any yacht failing to hear or heed such a recall will be penalized by having one-half hour added to her elapsed time.

**General Recall:** If there should be a number of unidentified premature starters, or if an error is made in the starting procedure such as significant inaccuracy in the interval between signals, the Race Committee will make the General Recall signal. The starting sequence will resume with the Warning signal for the class that was recalled.

## RACING PROGRAM — RACE PROCEDURE

### STARTING LINE ETIQUETTE

Racing skippers are reminded to stay clear of the starting line until the Preparatory Signal for their class. Failure to do so may result in disqualification.

The Preparatory Signal for each class is the Starting Signal for the preceding class (except in the West Island Race). Yachts starting with the wrong class may be disqualified.

Skippers electing to change class after arriving in the starting area (but before the warning signal) *must* notify the race committee of that change.

### TIME LIMIT

Regardless of time of start, the time limit for each class will expire at 1800 for all races except as noted below:

Eastern, Western, Babylon and Wind-Up Twilights — 2230

Foulke Trophy — No time limit

West Island — 1900

Tune up, Summer & Pursuit Morning Race — 1230

If any yacht finishes within the time limit, it is a race for her class. Yachts finishing after the committee boat has left its station should take their own time and report it to the Race Committee as soon as possible.

### SPECIAL SIGNALS

Code flags A through K are used to designate courses (see Course Instructions).

Code flags below apply to all SBCC-conducted races:

**L** — One of the designated MARKS is missing; come within hail for instructions.

**M** — ROUND or pass the object displaying this signal instead of the mark it replaces.

**N** — ABANDONMENT, race called off (accompanied by three guns).

**R** — Sail the designated course in the REVERSE direction, Leave all marks to opposite hand.

**S** — Sail the SHORT course prescribed in the course instructions. When flown after the start (accompanied by two guns), finish between the committee boat and the nearby mark of the course.

**T** — Sail the designated course TWICE around.

**Answering Pennant** — POSTPONEMENT signal (accompanied by two guns). Starts postponed fifteen minutes. Warning signal will be made 1 minute after Answering Pennant is lowered.

**1st Repeater** — GENERAL RECALL signal (accompanied by two guns). Starting sequence resumes with the Warning signal for the class being recalled.

### VHF COMMUNICATIONS

VHF radio communications may be maintained during a race utilizing channel 16 for calling and channels 9, or 68 thru 72 for communication. Radio communications may be utilized to relay information on unusual situations during races such as postponements, recalls, withdrawals, etc. However, Race Committees are not required to use radio. Racers should **not** communicate with the Race Committee from the time of the Warning gun to the time of the last class start.

## RACING PROGRAM — RACE PROCEDURE

### COURSE INSTRUCTIONS

SBCC courses in the Bay have been grouped by starting area as follows:

For each of these areas, a variety of courses is described below, each bearing a distinguishing letter. The choice of course available to the Race Committee on any given day is shown in the Race Schedule. The course selected will be signaled from the Committee Boat by the appropriate letter code flag. (Letters A through K may be used).

Any course can be reversed by code Flag "R" or shortened by code flag "S" as described under "SPECIAL SIGNALS" above.

### BABYLON COURSES

**Course A:** Start established by committee boat off Willetts Creek; to Flasher No. 7 off Oak Island Channel, leaving it to port; through the center span of Robert Moses Causeway to Flashing Green No. 11, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point, leaving it to port; to Black and White Mo(A) in Great Cove, leaving it to port; return through center span of the Causeway to finish line off Willetts Creek. Course distance: 16.5 nm. Short Course \* distance: 15.6 nm.

**Course B:** Start established by committee boat off Willetts Creek; to Flasher No. 7 off Oak Island Channel, leaving it to port; through the center span of Robert Moses Causeway to Flashing Green No. 11, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point, leaving it to starboard; to Can No. 3 off Hecksher State Park, leaving it to port; to Black and White Mo(A) in Great Cove, leaving it to port; return through center span of Causeway to finish line off Willetts Creek. Course distance: 13.2 nm. Short Course \* distance 12.3 nm.

**Course C:** Start established by committee boat off Willetts Creek; to Flasher No. 7 off Oak Island Channel, leaving it to port; through the center span of the Robert Moses Causeway to Flashing Green No. 11, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point, leaving it to port; to Black and White Mo(A) in Great Cove, leaving it to port; return through center span of the Causeway to finish line near Willetts Creek. Course distance 9.7 nm. Short course \* distance: 8.8 nm.

**Course D:** Start established by committee boat off Willetts Creek; to Flasher No. 7 off Oak Island Channel, leaving it to port; through the center span of the Robert Moses Causeway to Nun No. 6, leaving it to port. Return through center span of the Causeway to finish line off Willetts Creek. Course distance: 4.3 nm. Short Course \* distance 3.4 nm.

**Course E:** Start established by committee boat off Willetts Creek; to Flasher No. 7 off Oak Island Channel leaving it to port; through the center span of Robert Moses Causeway to Nun No. 6, leaving it to port; Return through center span of the Causeway to the starting line stake boat, leaving it to port; to Flasher No. 7 leaving it to port; to finish line off Willetts Creek. Course Distance: 6.0 nm. Short Course \* distance: 5.0 nm.

**Course F:** Start established by committee boat in vicinity of Willetts Creek to Flasher No. 7 off Oak Island Channel, leaving it to port; through center span of the Robert Moses Causeway to Flashing Green No. 11, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Red No. 2 in North Channel, leaving it to port; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point, leaving it to port; to Black and White Mo(A) in Great Cove, leaving it to port; return through center span of the Robert Moses Causeway to the finish line off Willetts Creek. Course distance: 10.9 nm. Short Course \* distance: 10.0 nm.

*\*For Babylon Races, if short course is signaled, omit Flasher No. 7 on first leg and proceed directly to center span of Causeway.*

### BAY SHORE COURSES

**Course A:** Start established by committee boat  $\frac{1}{3}$  mile south-east of Brightwaters Canal; to Flashing Green No. 11 east of Robert Moses Causeway, leaving it to port; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point, leaving it to port; to Black and White Mo(A) in Great Cove, leaving it to port; to Flashing Green No. 11, leaving it to starboard; to finish line off Brightwaters Canal. Course distance: 5.2 nm.

If Short course is signalled proceed directly from Flashing Green No. 1 to finish line. Course distance: 3.7 nm.

**Course B:** Start established by committee boat  $\frac{1}{3}$  mile south-east of Brightwaters Canal; to Flashing Green No. 11 east of Robert Moses Causeway; to Flashing Red No. 2 in North Channel; to finish line off Brightwaters Canal. Leave all marks to port. Course distance: 4.7 nm.

**Course C:** (Should not be reversed for Twilight Races) Start established by committee boat  $\frac{1}{3}$  mile south-east of Brightwaters canal; to Nun No. 6 east of Robert Moses Causeway; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point; to finish line off Brightwaters Canal. Leave all marks to port. Course distance: 5.7 nm.

**Course D:** Start established by committee boat  $\frac{1}{3}$  mile south-east of Brightwaters Canal; to Nun No. 6 east of Robert Moses Causeway, leaving it to port; to Flashing Green No. 11, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Red No. 4 off Nicoll Point, leaving it to port; return to finish line off Brightwaters Canal. Course distance: 11.6 nm.

**Course E:** Start established by committee boat  $\frac{1}{3}$  mile south-east of Brightwaters Canal; through the center span of Robert Moses Causeway; to Flasher No. 7 off Oak Island Channel, leaving it to port; return through center span; to Flashing Green No. 11 east of Robert Moses Causeway, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point, leaving it to port; to finish line off Brightwaters Canal. Course distance: 9.1 nm.

**Course F:** Start established by committee boat  $\frac{1}{3}$  mile south-east of Brightwaters Canal; to Nun No. 6 east of Robert Moses Causeway, leaving it to port; to Black and White Mo(A) in Great Cove, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Red No. 2, in North Channel, leaving it to starboard; to starting line stake boat, leaving it to port; to Nun No. 6 east of Robert Moses Causeway, leaving it to port; to finish line off Brightwaters canal. Course distance: 10.9 nm.

If short course is signaled, leg from Flashing Red No. 2 to stake boat is last leg. Course distance: 7.4 nm.

**Course G:** Start established by committee boat  $\frac{1}{3}$  mile south-east of Brightwaters Canal; to Nun No. 6 east of Robert Moses Causeway, leaving it to port; to BW Mo(A) in Great Cove, leaving it to starboard; to Nun No. 30 in Nicoll Bay, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Red No. 18, leaving it to port; to Flashing Green No. 15 off Point o'Woods, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point, leaving it to port; to Flashing Red No. 2 in North Channel, leaving it to starboard; to finish line off Brightwaters Canal. Course distance: 20.3 nm.

## RACING PROGRAM — RACE COURSES

**Course H:** Start established by committee boat  $\frac{1}{3}$  mile south-east of Brightwaters Canal; to Flasher No. 31 off Blue Point, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Red No. 18 off Point o'Woods, leaving it to port; to Flashing Green No. 15 off Point o'Woods, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Red No. 8 SE of West Fire Island, leaving it to port; to RB Quick Flasher off Saltaire, leaving it to starboard; to BW Mo(A) in Great Cove, leaving it to port; through center span of Robert Moses Causeway; to Flasher No. 7 off Oak Island Channel, leaving it to port. Return through center span of Robert Moses Causeway to finish line off Brightwaters Canal. Course distance: 30.1 nm.

**Course I:** Same as Course H, except round Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point leaving it to starboard, and omit Flasher No. 31 and Flashing Red No. 18. Course distance: 20.7 nm.

**Course J:** Start established by committee boat  $\frac{1}{3}$  mile south-east of Brightwaters Canal and finish between committee boat and Buoy 31 off Blue Point. Course distance: 9.8 nm.

**Course K:** Start established between committee boat and vicinity of BW Mo(A) in Great Cove; through center span of Robert Moses Causeway; to Flasher No. 7 off Oak Island Channel, leaving it to port; return through center span to Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point, leaving it to starboard; to Flasher No. 31 off Blue Point, leaving it to port; to RB Quick Flasher in Patchogue Bay, leaving it to port; return leaving Flasher 31 to starboard, Flashing Green No. 11 to port, through center span of the Robert Moses Causeway; to the finish line between the stake boat and the flagpole at the end of the Babylon Yacht Club dock (which should not be used as a rendezvous for this race). Course distance: 31.4 nm.

## HECKSCHER PARK COURSES

**Course A:** Start established by committee boat in the vicinity of Can No. 3 off Heckscher State Park; to Flashing Red No. 2 in North Channel; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point; to finish line near Can No. 3. Leave all marks to starboard. Course distance: 3.7 nm.

**Course B:** Start established by committee boat in the vicinity of Can No. 3 off Heckscher State Park; to Nun No. 10 off Bay Shore; to BW Mo(A) in Great Cove; to finish line near Can No. 3. Leave all marks to starboard. Course distance 6.4 nm.

If short course is signalled, substitute Flashing Green No. 1 off Bayberry Point for BW Mo(A). Short course distance: 5.6 nm.

**Course C:** Start established by committee boat in the vicinity of Can No. 3 off Heckscher State Park; to Flasher No. 3 in the Range Channel; to Nun No. 30 off Green Point; to finish near Can No. 3. Leave all marks to port. Course distance: 7.5 nm.

If short course is signalled, substitute Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point for Nun No. 30. Short course distance: 4.5 nm.

### NICOLL BAY COURSES

**Course A:** Start established by committee boat in Nicoll Bay; to Flashing Green No. 15 off Point o'Woods, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point, leaving it to port; to Flashing Red No. 2 in North Channel, leaving it to port; to Nun No. 10 off Bay Shore, leaving it to starboard; back to Flashing Red No. 2 leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point, leaving it to port; to finish line in Nicoll Bay. Course distance: 15.7nm.

**Course B:** Start established by committee boat in Nicoll Bay; to Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Red No. 2 in North Channel, leaving it to port; to Nun No. 10 off Bay Shore, leaving it to port, to Red and Black Quick Flasher off Saltaire, leaving it to port; to Flashing Red No. 8, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 15 of Point o'Woods, leaving it to port; to finish line in Nicoll Bay. Course distance: 14.5 nm.

This course may be sailed in the opposite direction with all marks left on the opposite hand.

**Course C:** Start established by committee boat in Nicoll Bay; to Flashing Red No. 4 off Nicoll Point, leaving it to port; to Red and Black interrupted Quick Flashing Green south of Patchogue Channel, leaving it to starboard; to finish line ½ mile north of Sailor's Haven. Course distance: 13.8 nm.

**Course D:** Start established by committee boat in Nicoll Bay: to Flashing Red No. 18 off Point o'Woods; to Flasher No. 31 off Blue Point; to finish line in Nicoll Bay. Leave all marks to port. Course Distance: 11.7 nm.

**Course E:** Start established by committee boat in Nicoll Bay; to Flashing Red No. 4 off Nicoll Point; to Flasher No. 31 off Blue Point; to finish line in Nicoll Bay. Leave all marks to port. Course distance: 11.9 nm.

**Course F:** Start established by committee boat in Nicoll Bay; to Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Red No. 2 in North Channel, leaving it to port; to Flasher No. 3 off Point o'Woods, leaving it to port; to Nun No. 28 in Nicoll Bay, leaving it to port; to finish line in Nicoll Bay. Course distance; 9.5 nm.

**Course G:** Start established by committee boat in Nicoll Bay; to Flashing Red No. 18 off Point o'Woods, leaving it to port; to Red and Black Interrupted Quick Flashing Green south of Patchogue Channel, leaving it to port; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Howells Point, leaving it to port; to finish line east of Blue Point off Sayville YC. Course distance: 15.7 nm.

If short course is signalled proceed directly from Red and Black Quick Flasher to the finish line. Course distance: 9.2 nm.

**Course H:** Start established by committee boat in Nicoll Bay; to Flashing Red No. 4 off Nicoll Point, leaving it to port, to Nun No. 30 off Green Point, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Red No. 18 off Point o'Woods, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Red No. 2 in North Channel, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point, leaving it to port; to finish line in Nicoll Bay. Course distance: 13.2 nm.

## RACING PROGRAM — RACE COURSES

**Course I:** Start established by committee boat in Nicoll Bay; to Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Red No. 2 in North Channel; leaving it to starboard; to Flasher No. 31 off Blue Point, leaving it to port; to finish line in Nicoll Bay. Course distance: 16.2 nm.

**Course J:** Start established by committee boat in Nicoll Bay; to Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point to Flashing Green No. 29 in Nicoll Bay; return to finish line in Nicoll Bay. Leave all marks to port. Course distance: 3.3 nm.

### OCEAN COURSES

**Ocean Course A:** Start between committee boat and Red Whistle Buoy No. "4FI" off Fire Island Inlet; to Black and White Gong Buoy No. "J1" off Jones Inlet and return, leaving No. J1 to port. Course Distance: 26.5 nm.

**Ocean Course B:** Start between committee boat and Red Whistle Buoy No. "4FI" off Fire Island Inlet; to Nantucket Sea Lane White/Orange "NA" and return, leaving Buoy "NA" to port. Course distance: 22 nm.

#### *Notes on Ocean Race:*

1. Harbor start from Sore Thumb one hour prior to Warning Gun.
2. If adverse weather conditions necessitate cancellation of the Ocean Race the committee boat will signal abandonment at Sore Thumb one hour prior to the Warning Gun.
3. If the Ocean Race is abandoned, there will be a "Bay Race" if wind and weather conditions permit.
4. If the committee boat is unable to remain on station at the finish line, finishing yachts shall pass No. 4FI to port for course A or to starboard for Course B. Yachts shall record their own finish times when the buoy bears abeam of the stern of the yacht. Such finishing times shall be reported to the R/C. Observers may be stationed on the beach to verify finishing times.

**Bay Race Course A:** To Red and Black Quick Flasher off Saltaire; to Flashing Red No. 8, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 15 off Point o'Woods; to Flashing Red No. 5 off Nicoll Point; to finish line between committee boat and Flashing Red No. 2 off Champlin Creek. Leave all marks except No. 8 to port. Course distance depending on start locale.

**Bay Race Course B:** To Red and Black Quick Flasher off Saltaire, leaving it to port; to Nun No. 10 off Bay Shore, leaving it to starboard; to Can No. 3 off Heckscher Park, leaving it to port; to finish line between committee boat and Flashing Green No. 11 off Brightwaters. Course distance depending on start locale.

## RACING PROGRAM — RACE COURSES

### SAYVILLE COURSES

**Course A:** Start established by committee boat ½ mile South-East of Brown Point; to Flashing Green 29 in Nicoll Bay, leaving it to port; to finish line off Brown Point. Course Distance: 5.6 nm.

**Course B:** Start established by committee boat ½ mile South-East of Brown Point; to Red and Black interrupted Quick Flashing Green in Patchogue Bay, leaving it to port; to finish line off Brown Point. Course distance; 4.2 nm.

**Course C:** Start established by committee boat ½ mile South-East of Brown Point; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Lone Hill; to Flashing Green No. 29 in Nicoll Bay; to finish line off Brown Point. Leave all marks to starboard. Course distance; 7.6 nm.

**Course D.:** Start established by committee boat ½ mile South-East of Brown Point; to Flasher No. 1 off Watch Hill Channel; to Red and Black Interrupted Quick Flashing Green in Patchogue Bay; to finish line off Brown Point. Leave all marks to port. Course distance; 5.8 nm.

**Course E:** Start established by committee boat ½ mile South-East of Brown Point; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Lone Hill, leaving it to port; to finish line off Brown Point; Course distance: 4.3 nm.

**Course F:** Start established by committee boat ½ mile South-East of Brown Point; to Flashing Red No. 18 off Point o'Woods; to Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point; to finish line off Brown Point. Leave all marks to starboard. Course distance: 9.1 nm.

**Course G:** Start established by committee boat East of Blue Point; to Flasher No. 31, leaving it to starboard; to Flashing Green No. 5 off Nicoll Point, leaving it to port; to SYC inflatable mark ½ nm north of Flashing Green No. 1 off Lone Hill, leaving it to port; to Flasher No. 31 leaving it to port; to finish line east of Blue Point. Course distance: 12.9 nm.

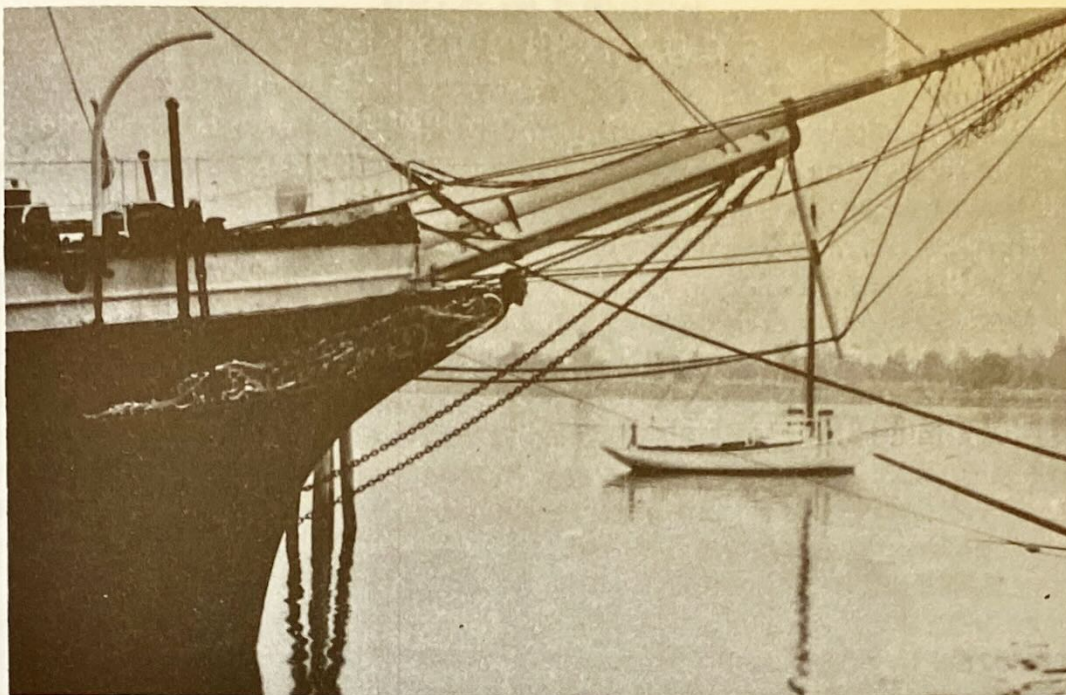
If short course is signalled, substitute Nun No. 30 for Flashing Green No. 5. Short course distance: 9.7 nm.

**Course H:** Start established by committee boat in vicinity of Flashing Green No. 1 off Howells Point; to Flashing Red No. 32 off Swan River, leaving it to port; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Lone Hill, leaving it to starboard; to Nun No. 2 off Patchogue River, leaving it to starboard; to finish line off Howells Point. Course distance: 13.5 nm.

**Course I:** Start established by committee boat in vicinity of Flashing Green No. 1 off Howells Point; to Flasher No. 31 off Blue Point, leaving it to port; to finish line off Howells Point. Course distance: 8.4 nm.

### WATCH HILL COURSE

**Course A:** Start in vicinity of North end of channel to Watch Hill; to Flashing Red No. 2 in North Channel, leaving it to port; to finish at or near Nun 10 at the entrance to the West Channel. Distance: 10.1 nm.

The safety of a vessel and her crew is the sole and inescapable responsibility of the skipper, who must do his best to ensure that the yacht is fully found, thoroughly seaworthy, and manned by an experienced and physically-fit crew. He must be satisfied as to the soundness of hull, spars, rigging, sails and all gear. He must ensure that all safety equipment is properly maintained and stowed, and that the crewmembers know where it is kept and how it is to be used. He must have all safety equipment required by the U.S. Coast Guard and, if racing, he must have the racing equipment suggested by the United States Yacht Racing Union (USYRU). The South Bay Cruising Club disclaims any liability for the seaworthy condition or operation of a yacht or the safety of its crew, for which the owner has sole responsibility.

It is the exclusive responsibility of each skipper to decide whether or not to start, continue, or drop out of any event. The South Bay Cruising Club does not assume any liability for the decision of any participant. Because of the increased costs of all vessels and the tendency to litigate all accidents, whether liability exists or not, the Board of Governors of the South Bay Cruising Club recommend that all owners and skippers carry liability as well as hull insurance to protect all parties from the financial consequences of an accident.

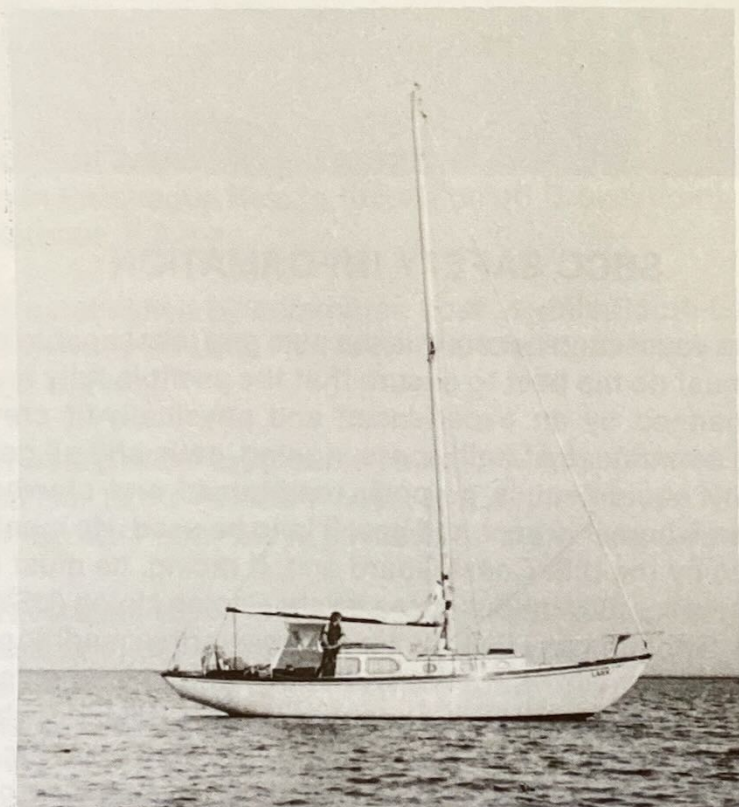

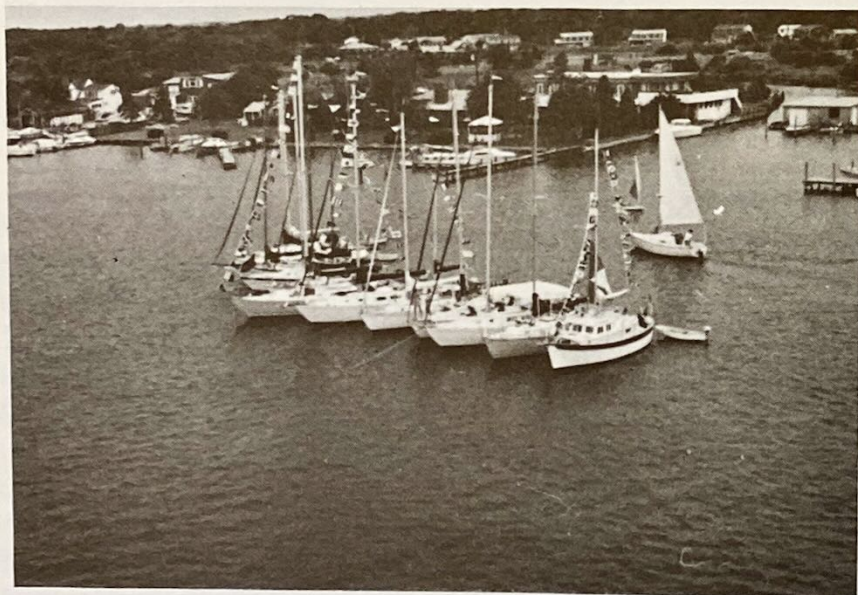

### THE "DOWN EAST" CRUISE

The club Yawls "Wanderlust" and "Blue Norther" were joined by a Florida ketch "North Star" and sailed from Babylon on July 9th for Maine. Their original itinerary was altered along the way to minimize night sailing, as a result of an incipient revolt by some crew members of "Wanderlust." Ports such as Isles of Shoals off Portsmouth, New Hampshire, Jewell Island near Portland, Maine, Burnt Island in lower Penobscot Bay and North Haven were visited as well as "Blue Norther" having gone up to Rogue Island, not far from the Canadian border. "Wanderlust" reported that the only two lay days in the entire cruise were had at Block Island on the way home. ### 1982 CAPE COD AND THE ISLANDS LOG OF THE "MARYANNE"

July 2

Underway at 1000 from Great River. Wind SW, 10/15 knots. Beautiful sail to Smith's Point in the company of "Myriah." Powered from Smith's Point to Forge River where we anchored for the night, preparatory to facing the Moriches passage in the morning. Weather begins to cloud up.

July 3

Wind calm. Weather cloudy with rain later. Underway at 0700 to make high water at Tuthill Point. Caught up with the other SBCC boats enroute and all arrived at Moriches together. And almost all went aground together. After much backing and filling and looking for four feet of water, several of us are dragged over the bar and proceed easterly to a rainy anchorage at Cormorant Point. We are not made happier to find that several boats had gone through Moriches with no trouble the night before and had preceded us to Block Island.

July 4

Weather clearing. Wind north a little east, maybe 20 knots. Underway at 0630, enroute to Block Island. Shinnecock Inlet is flat and soon all are under sail trying to hold a course of about 070°. We are headed at Napeaque and the wind drops off. Once more we go to the Westerbeke and motor and motor sail to the Island. Arrive about 1700 and Great Salt Pond is not to be believed — The place is wall to wall boats — hundreds, maybe thousands — and only a few SBCC yachts can be identified. We are entertained by some 4th of July fireworks and singing but tomorrow — to coin a phrase — is another day and we are pretty early to bed.

## YEAR IN REVIEW (Cont'd.)

July 5

Weather clear. Wind 0. Underway at 0700 for Menemsha. All of a sudden out of the maze of boats in the pond, SBCC yachts begin to show up as they make their way out of the inlet. We head east under power but eventually the wind fills in out of the SW and we have a beautiful 5 knot reach to Menemsha Cove. We cannot go up into the pond because of low water and so anchor in the Cove for a couple of hours to wait. In time, Fleet Captain Zimmer, paraphrasing another famous seaman, said "Damn the rocks, full speed ahead." Whereupon a Martha's Vineyard rock took a rap at "Utopia's" keel. All benefited by this bit of derring do and were able to thread their way unscathed into Menemsha Pond where rafts were formed, fish were broiled and some socializing was done. At this point the fleet consisted of 29 yachts.

July 6

Weather clear. Wind SW, 10 - 15 knots increasing to 20 knots. Leave with the tide for short sail to Lake Tashmoo which we enter despite tales of foreboding regarding difficult entrance passage. Only one boat gets hung up and this one chose to initiate a new channel. This is a beautiful anchorage, the day is lovely and all is right with the world. We are reduced in numbers to 23 as others have gone on to Vineyard Haven or Edgartown for stores.

July 7

Weather foggy, wind SW at 15 knots. Underway from Lake Tashmoo in clearing weather and settle down for a rousing reach to Nantucket. As wind picks up we get up to 7 knots. Would you believe 6? How about a sustained 5½? Fog comes in again and after arguing the right of way with the Nantucket ferry — he won, his horn was bigger, much bigger — we arrive at Nantucket Boat Basin about 1500. Showers finally and dinner ashore.

July 8

Weather clear and getting warmer. Lay day at Nantucket taken up with shopping, sight seeing, store replenishment, meeting people et al. We are joined by Mary's brother Bill and his wife, Mary, who will sail with us to their home in Chatham. Dinner ashore again — this chef never had it so good!

July 9

Weather hazy. Wind calm. Warmer. We are heading into a heat wave which will be with us for quite awhile. Underway at 1000 for Chatham using the Loran in light fog and calm most of the way. There is a bit of a foul up due to mixed instructions regarding anchoring but everything is set aright with the arrival of Commodore Ed Noyes of the Monomoy Yacht Club and at his direction we are all soon rafted up at moorings in the inner harbor. Ed makes everyone welcome and invites us all to make use of the club facilities. The captain and mate of the "Maryanne" are soon involved with laundry, showers, cocktails, and dinner — not necessarily in that order — at Bill and Mary's charming home in West Chatham. Many attend a band concert and dine ashore.

## YEAR IN REVIEW (Cont'd.)

July 10

Weather clear and warm. Wind WSW. We are waiting for a radio repairman whom we hope will give us "ears" and a voice again — we have been without them since the morning at Cormorant. A launch service is made available to the fleet and many utilize it to go ashore and visit the Chatham area. Some take up Ed Noyes offer and use the Monomoy Yacht Club facilities to pick up guests — we are joined here by our son Rob and his wife Sue, who will be with us until Edgartown. Once again cocktails and dinner ashore — I may give up the sea.

July 11

Weather clear. Wind SE at 10 knots. Underway at noon for Hyannis and have another great sail — almost too short. The Hyannis Yacht Club anchorage turns out to be very open which isn't so bad but the ferry's running in and out expose the yachts to their wake. Our attempts at rafting are made untenable and some damage occurs. We are made welcome by the club steward and many of us avail ourselves of the amenities of the club's splendid restaurant with the help of the YC launch.

July 12

Weather foggy. Wind calm. Underway at 0900 for Osterville as rest of the fleet waits to go ashore, have lunch, etc. Our radio repairs at Chatham proved ineffectual and we hope that the greater facilities at the Chester A. Crosby and Sons yard in Osterville will put us right again. We arrive to a great reception — the yard has been expecting us and we soon meet Chester Crosby, his son and most of the yard supervisors, all of whom are doing their best to get the sheds cleaned up and the paint shop ready for the "clamboil." Subsequently the rest of the SBCC yacht's join us, having sailed over from Hyannis in fog. Most of these boats moor or anchor in the North Bay which is a very attractive spot.

July 13

Weather hot. Lying at dock at Crosby yard while the radio is replaced. After a walk into Osterville village to check out the stores, what else? — a hose down on the dock felt good and saved a trip across the bridge to the showers. Clamboil starts at 1730 with 45 people attending and enjoying steamers, lobsters, corn, etc. It is impossible to say too much about the help and cooperation we received from Chet Crosby and his people — no concern of ours is too small for their attention.

July 14

Weather hot, wind SE at 10 knots. Underway at 0830 following the well marked channel out of Osterville. Some nine or ten boats of the two week group separate and start on their way back to Long Island. Most of the rest of us go on to moorings in Edgartown Harbor. Rob and Sue go ashore to scope out travel arrangements for their flight home. The launch service here is terrific and even tho we're way up in the inner harbor, travel back and forth to showers and to town is very easily done. Four of us go over to Oak Bluff's for dinner.

July 15

Lay day at Edgartown. "Black Petrel," "Manana III," "Charisma," "Sea Jay," and "Mariah" go on ahead to Hadleys. "Utopia" separated yesterday to go into Marion to exchange crews. While ashore we ran into old friends of ours and many in the club, Dave and Vivian Bernard, and had lunch with them — they are on their own cruise, traveling with two boats from Patchogue. We put the chef back to work and had dinner aboard. "Misty" goes back to Osterville as the Thompsons have a wedding to attend in Maine are are leaving the boat with daughter and friends.

## YEAR IN REVIEW (Cont'd.)

July 16

Weather foggy, Wind SE at 5 knots. Trying to sail to Hadley's but wind drops and we motor to West Chop when it comes in from the west at 10/15 knots. Arrive at Hadley's around 1230 and after dragging anchor a bit we moved into a very crowded inner harbor. Hadley's, beautiful as it is, becomes more crowded every time we go there. There were several boats anchored outside the cove this time.

July 17

Weather partly cloudy, some fog. Wind SW light but increasing. We have a slow run up Buzzards Bay but are moving out well with the increased breeze when we arrive at Red Brook. We had been talking to "Utopia" on VHF and passed her leaving Red Brook as we went in. There is a real foul-up regarding mooring assignments in Red Brook brought on largely by Red Brook Marine's conflicting advice. Eventually we're all taken care of either in docks or at moorings. Wind still blowing hard from the SW when the fog closes down and the shoreline and moored boats disappear. Some hardy souls however make it ashore for dinner at the "Chart House."

July 18

Weather clear. Wind SW as before. Went ashore to do some shopping and found that the shortest way to market was to walk the rails of what appeared to be a defunct railroad for about a mile. Several of us did this just to prove, I think, that we still could. The "launch" service here was an experience that you might have dreamed in a nightmare. A decrepit yard tug with nails where fenders used to be comes somewhat alongside in what can only be described as a semi-controlled accident. Just before the boats separate everybody jumps and this is not easy carrying a block of ice. Going or coming, it's the same and I never saw a decent landing. Only the cheerfulness and help of the tug operator prevented this from becoming a disaster. We understand that this service was an experiment which I don't think was headed for success. Dinner at the Chart House with the Dick Parkers was however, a complete success.



## YEAR IN REVIEW (Cont'd.)



July 19

Weather hazy. Wind SW 10/20 knots. Almost dead on the nose for Padanaram. Most went over to the mainland for some lee as pretty good seas were running up Buzzards Bay. We stayed in the channel and played with the Loran. As we went into Padanaram we met Bill and Barbara Dunleavy out sailing. They had left us at Hadley's to pick up their son Billy and daughter-in-law Linda for a few days. We took on some, ice, water and fuel at the New Bedford Yacht Club before picking up an assigned mooring. Launch service here was very good as it responded quickly to calls on VHF enabling some of us to hit the beach for another land based meal. Very hot ashore — need many cooling drinks to ease thirst.

July 20

Weather hot and very foggy in the morning. Wind calm. We all waited till nearly noon before crossing over to Cuttyhunk, all the while looking back over our shoulders at squalls over the mainland. Rafted with "Mariah" and "Manana III" until 0200 when the front went thru, the wind came hard out of the North and a "Chinese fire drill" ensued. After separating from the raft we cruised around the crowded pond looking for a place to anchor when a Good Samaritan took pity on us and invited us to raft with him as he was on a mooring. He'd hardly finished speaking when we had bow, stern, forward spring and aft spring fast to his boat complete with every fender we had. A couple of boats had gone ashore and seeing them on their sides wasn't conducive to any more fooling around.

## YEAR IN REVIEW (Cont'd.)

July 21

This was a scheduled travel day for the trip to Block Island. Some left and after a hairy couple of miles just outside of Cuttyhunk, turned West and had a wild reach to Block Island with the wind gusting to 30 knots. The "Maryanne," now rafted with "Misty" on a mooring, elected to take a lay day right now and so we caught up on some sleep and did a little exploring on the Island. We were treated to a magnificent sunset as the clouds broke and the wind died just after dinner.

July 22

Weather rainy, wind calm. Five boats remaining at Cuttyhunk underway at 0800 for Block Island. We arrive in Great Salt Pond with clearing weather and raft with "Misty," "Black Petrel," and "Sea Jay." While picking up ice and water at the Block Island Marina we saw "Utopia" in a berth there and subsequently talked to them on VHF. Donald Jr., his wife Helen and two other couples will join us for the trip back to L.I. Several boats take advantage of this last night for lobster and their crews are seen dining at Dead-Eye Dick's.

July 23

Cloudy, wind west and light. Underway at 0800 for Cormorant Point. "Rakamah" has broken a shaft and is taken in tow for Montauk by Walter Raskin's "Virgo." We hear later that "Rakamah" is being towed into Montauk by the Coast Guard. Ralph later reported that "Rakamah" successfully passed the Coast Guard inspection. "Cathy O" and "Voyager" are also among the walking wounded with engine and shaft problems respectively. We are passed by a surfaced submarine between Block and Montauk — who knows how many submerged. Arrive Cormorant about 2000.

July 24

Weather clear. Wind NNE, 5/10 knots. "Maryanne," "Misty," "Mariah," "Judi," and "Utopia" buck the tide but eventually exit Shinecock Inlet headed for Fire Island. The balance of the boats at Cormorant join up with the Tiana Bay group for the inside trip, which appears to come off without a hitch — even at Moriches. The boats outside sail for awhile exhibiting spinnakers and flashers but eventually there is not even enough wind for these light sails and the engines are put to work. We note the progress of the inside group on the VHF and note that "Virgo" has contacted Highway Marine who has found some water to lead the boats thru so all is going well there and in fact for us too as the wind fills in out of the South and carries us to the inlet. Thanks to some fancy VHF work by Bob VanTassel with the Coast Guard, the Captree Bascule is opened for us and we proceed into the State Boat Channel, anchoring for the night in Hemlocks. I am once again convinced that those who use the State Boat Channel for pleasure would go to hell for a vacation! For plain lack of consideration, lack of knowledge and lack of seamanship, this would be hard to beat. Anyhow, after the terrors of the channel, it was great to have a pleasant, quiet night at Hemlocks.

July 25

Weather clear, wind SW at 5/10 knots. Sail to Bergen Point in Babylon. Home. Est Finis.

**NARRAGANSETT BAY CRUISE**  
**FROM THE LOG OF "WILDE THYME"**

Thursday, July 1

A small group of sail boats assembled at Smith Point in the early hours of the evening in preparation for the Narragansett Bay Cruise which would begin the following day. Present at Smith Point were "Sea Sprite," "Lady Lynn," "Golden Days," "Flying Cloud," "Virgo" and "Wilde Thyme." The evening was cool and we all required blankets for that night and several more to come.

Friday, July 2

Departed Smith Point on a clear sunny morning at 0624 hours and motored eastward. Arrived at Moriches Flats, and promptly had "Golden Days," "Sea Sprite" and "Lady Lynn" aground. Other boats dropped anchor west of the Flats to try to figure out the next move. Boats aground were soon aided by Hi-Way Marina Service that performs this duty as a regular part of the days routine. All boats were towed across the sand flats with three bounces each. Hi-Way Service was efficient and helpful and well deserved of the tips he received. The Coast Guard assured one of the grounded boats that if you followed the buoys, you would be in deep water. Arrived Tiana Bay with strong gusting winds out of the southwest. Some boats went on to Cormorant Point for better protection. Others followed when tide had come up.

Saturday, July 3

Departed Cormorant Point 0630 hours for Shinnecock Inlet - sky clear, very slight wind out of southwest, which died as soon as we cleared the inlet. Motored all the way to Montauk. The day became overcast. We arrived at Lake Montauk at 1500 hours and rafted up with "Sinn Fein" and "Solitude." They had taken the ocean route from Fire Island Inlet.

Sunday, July 4

Lay day at Lake Montauk - had given some thought of going to Block Island, but were advised by radio that the harbor there was wall-to-wall boats. The day at Montauk was quiet, sunny and restful.

Monday, July 5

Departed Lake Montauk at 1000 hours under clear skies and light air. Had to motor part of the way to Block Island. Wind out of west northwest. There were still many boats in the harbor at Block but there was room for a few more. The swim in the pool at Block Island was very refreshing. That evening we had dinner at The Manasee Hotel. There were thirteen of us transported in one taxi all at one time to the hotel for dinner. After dinner we couldn't all fit into the taxi, so some of the party walked back to the harbor.

Tuesday, July 6

Departed Block Island at 0815 hours. Light air clear skies, wind out of the west — a reach across the sound to BW off Point Judith - then eastward toward the mouth of the Sakonnet River. This was a down wind run which increased with intensity as the day wore on. Arrived at mouth of the Sakonnet River at 1422 hours — wind gusting to twenty-five knots. Turned north up the Sakonnet and really moved along to Fogland Cove, where we anchored for the night. The cove offered good protection from the wind, but no facilities. The following boats were in our group at this point:

"Lady Lynn," "Whisper," "Solitude," "Golden Days," "Windrifter," "Sea Sprite," "Sanderling," "Gliding Gull," "Nimark," "Windshaker II," "Kyla," "Wilde Thyme."

## YEAR IN REVIEW (Cont'd.)

Wednesday, July 7

Departed Fogland Cove at 0800 hours on a very pleasant and sunny day. We sailed up past Tiverton through the narrow passage in the river. There were no problems with current at these points. Arrived at Fall River Battle Ship Cove at 1030 hours. It's really surprising to find the Battle Ship Massachusetts, a destroyer, a submarine and a mine sweeper anchored at this point. We dropped our anchors in the lee of the battle ship and spent a very pleasant day visiting the ships and the Nautiwe Museum at Fall River.

Thursday, July 8

After a restful night at Battle Ship Cove in the lee of the battleships we departed at 0830 for East Greenwich. We had a clear warm day with favorable winds for most of the passage through Mount Hope Bay. The people at the East Greenwich Yacht Club were very hospitable, helpful and very friendly. Most of us visited town, did some shopping and enjoyed the facilities at the club. In the evening the club furnished us with a large cookout grill, ready for cooking, tables, chairs, tablecloths, silver and general kindness. After dinner we all gathered on the porch and to the merry tunes of Dave Van Nostrand had a happy song fest. It was really a beautiful evening.

Friday, July 9

Partly cloudy, warm, very slight wind for sailing down the East Channel to Newport. Departed East Greenwich at 0900 and arrived at Newport at 1200 hours. At Newport some of our boats docked at the Pearson Rendezvous, others went to Ida Lewis Yacht Club area.

Saturday, July 10

This was a lay day in Newport. Those attending the Pearson Rendezvous had their day of activities planned for them, while others shopped and relaxed.

Sunday, July 11

At this point many of the boats in the group chose to go in different directions. "Sea Sprite" and "Golden Days" headed for Point Judith. "Solitude," "Lady Lynn," "Wilde Thyme," "Windrifter" headed for Block Island. Other boats in the group had gone to Wickford, while others had headed for Fishers Island. Those going to Block departed at 1000 hours. The day was sunny and warm and the wind was out of the northwest, which gave us a pleasant sail. Arrived at Block Island at 1500 hours and found several of our cruise mates already there and at anchor.

Monday, July 12

Awoke to a pea soup fog in Block Island. We had planned this as a lay day and therefore made no effort to move out of the harbor. Most of us went into town to do some shopping and then a refreshing swim in the pool at Champlins Marina.

Tuesday, July 13

Bright, sunny day, wind out of the south-southwest at seven to ten knots. We had a beautiful sail across the sound after we left Block Island at 1000 hours. Arrived at the east end of Fishers Island and entered Fishers Island bay area through the Lords Passage. Anchored at West Harbor, Fishers Island at 1500 hours. Many of the boats ordered fresh lobster from the local lobster fisher, and we had lobster dinner that evening at Fishers.

Wednesday, July 14

Another beautiful day with wind out of the southeast, which provided us with a beautiful sail — through the Race — into Gardiners Bay and down to Coecles Harbor where we anchored for the afternoon and evening. Entertainment was provided by Roy Van Nostrand and Ken Kondor on their squeeze boxes for our “happy hour.” The crew of the “Whisper” gathered mussels in the harbor and steamed them for the raft up.

Thursday, July 15

Very hot sunny day. Light air. Departed Coecles Harbor at 1030 hours. Stopped at Sag Harbor for ice and water and then on to West Neck Harbor for a swim and a quiet afternoon.

Friday, July 16

West Neck Harbor was the parting point for our cruise. Some of us were going through the Shinnecock Canal, others were remaining in the area of Shelter Island for another week, and still others were heading for Montauk for the sail around the point. Those of us going through the canal departed West Neck at 0900. Went through the locks at 1200 hours and dropped anchor at Smith Point at 1900 hours for an uneventful motor and sail along the South Shore of Long Island. This ended a very eventful Narragansett Cruise.

### FISHERS ISLAND CRUISE FROM “SILHOUETTE”

The best laid plans of cruising people often go awry; and so the Fishers Island Cruise started off with a glorious departure with an ignominious return shortly thereafter due to an unexpectedly jammed halyard. Fortunately our dockmaster (Ken Koch) was on hand to give expert help and muscle, and soon “Silhouette” was underway with a strong southwesterly behind her.

The sail eastward treated us to the sight of many green and white burgees converging on the Bellport Reach, and with the beautiful sunset pushing us through the Smiths Point Bridge we were soon anchored in the company of about a dozen SBCC boats. Now anchoring techniques vary among cruising sailors; however, when *no* anchor is needed to stay in place then a truly unique (?) technique has been developed.

An early departure gave us plenty of time for an informal rendezvous at buoy 39 due to a large uncharted hill (undoubtedly caused by underbay volcanic activity). With the help of the “Judi” — who selflessly hurled herself aground to point out the shortest water — and a “not to worry” attitude coupled with considerable derring-do, most of us managed to get past the “obstruction” and parade on to Cormorant Point.

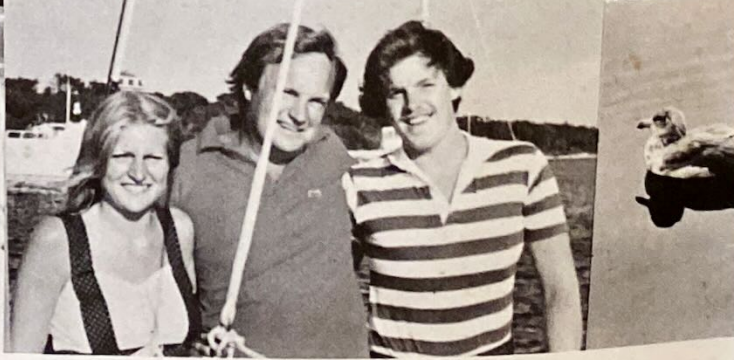
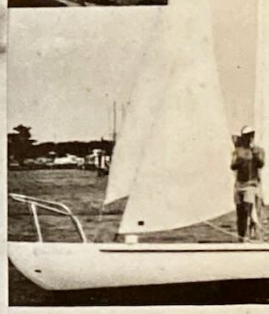
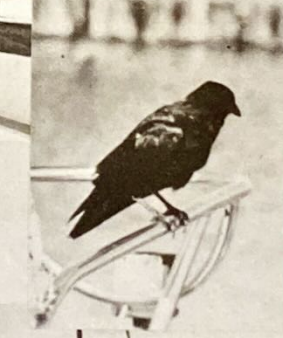
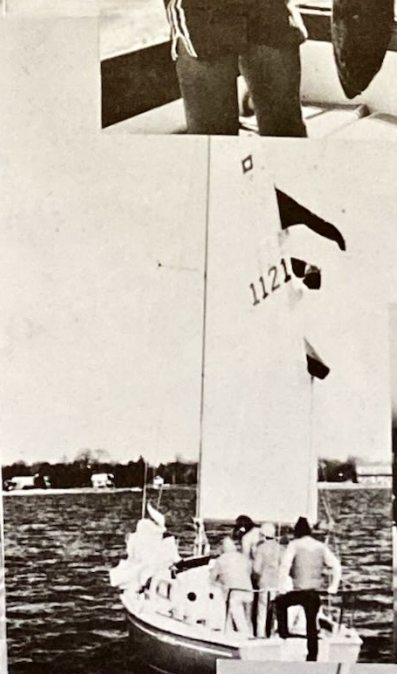
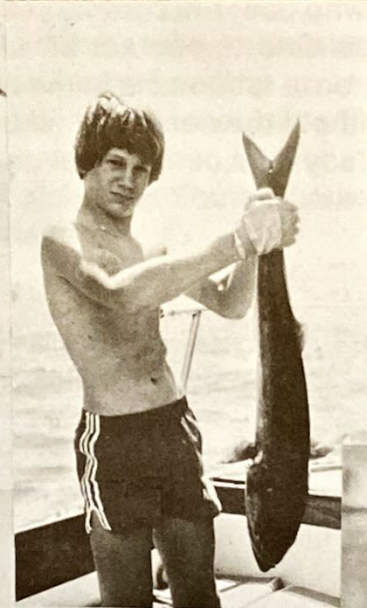
While lowering the mast at Shinnecock Canal the pivoting mast step on the cabin top broke, and the mast went over the side. Three miracles followed.

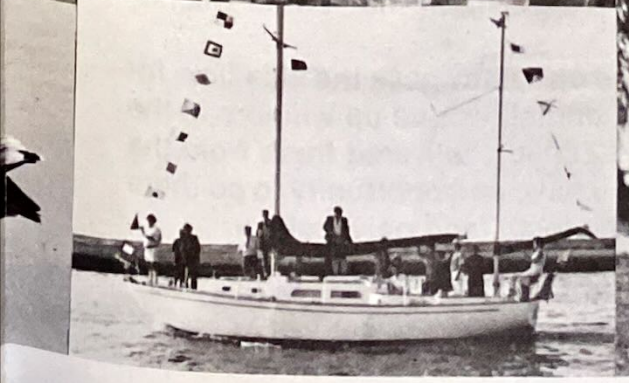
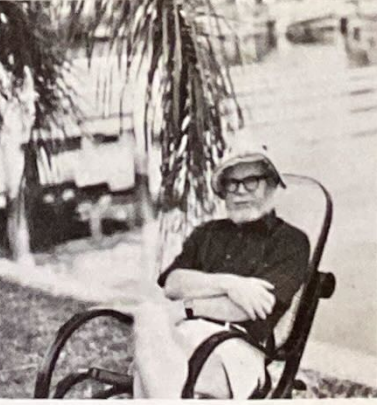
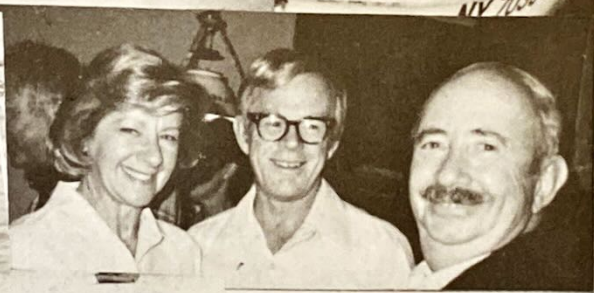
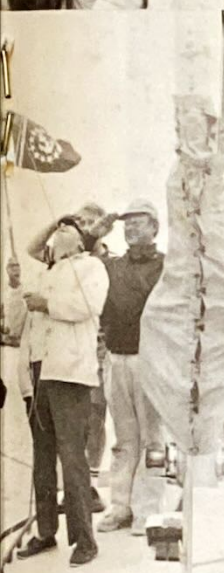
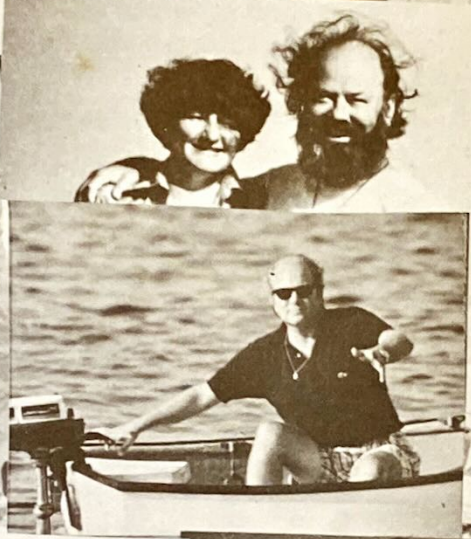
#1: No one was hurt.

#2: The mast and rigging were undamaged. We lashed it on deck.

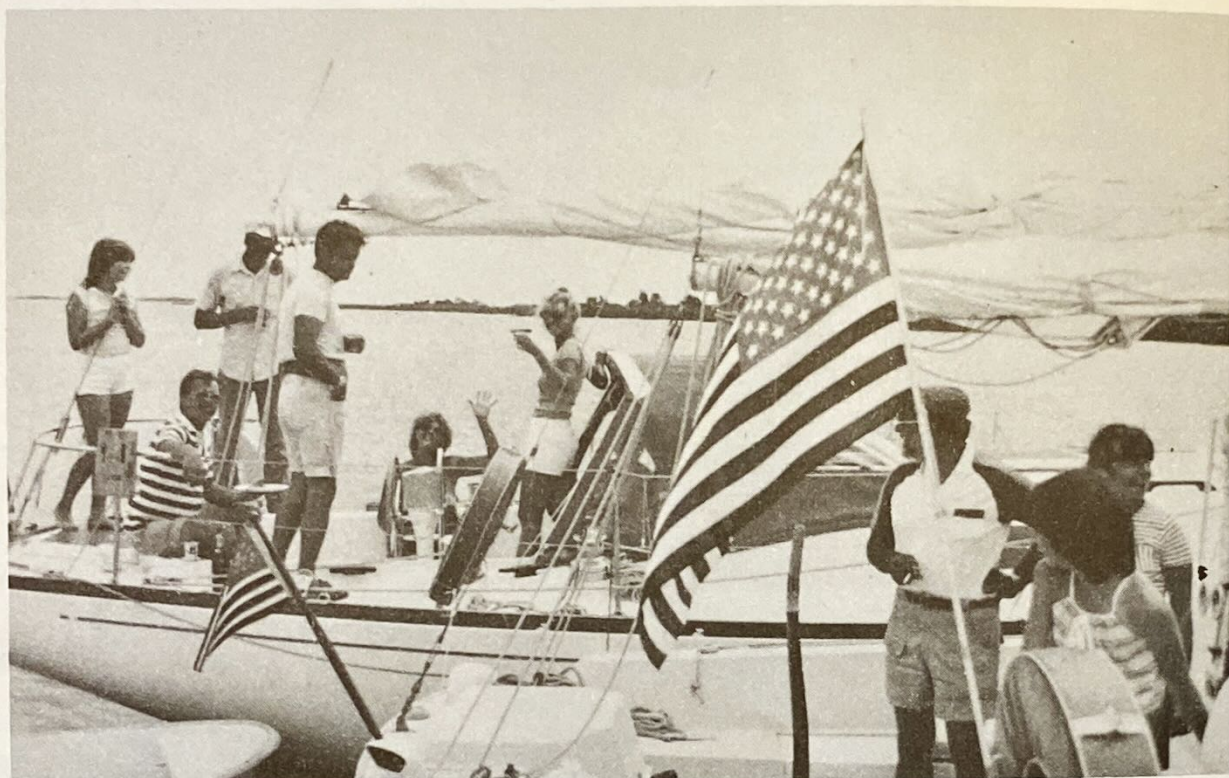

Several of the group traveled up the river to enjoy the hospitality of Andrews Marina and the Goodspeed Opera House — while Father Langley was coming up the river.

On Wednesday, "Passages" and "Carolina" conducted a tour to Gillette Castle, while the rest of us went to Essex to shop, eat and relax. The weather? Absolutely "SUPER." Later in the day, several SBCC boats that had departed a week earlier joined us in the Cove. A surprise Costume Party was sprung on the fleet, with some startling results: 1st Place — Dominoes from the "Dixie D"; 2nd Place — Star Wars from "Passages"; 3rd Place — Indians from "Sugar & Spice." Various navigational aids were used to guide us to the Pond — coffee cups, lobster pots and the sounds of other boats. Tuesday, 21 brave and energetic souls assaulted and conquered the Southeast Point Lighthouse and descended to the bottom of the cliffs. Some even made it back. A scavenger hunt turned up much Block Island treasure, but not, unfortunately, any of Captain Kidd's. Shopping, biking, ice cream cones, movies, cold beer & seafood, and last but not least, Pac Man, are all memories of Block Island.

Wednesday some of our group departed for Shelter Island and others went to Lake Montauk. The Dockees enjoyed the pleasures of Captains Marina, while the Dinghies rafted for the night. A lay day at Lake Montauk saw the kids (and grown-ups) swimming, relaxing and doing all the good things that go into a lovely, lazy summer day on the water.

The Captains meeting had the usual racey comments.

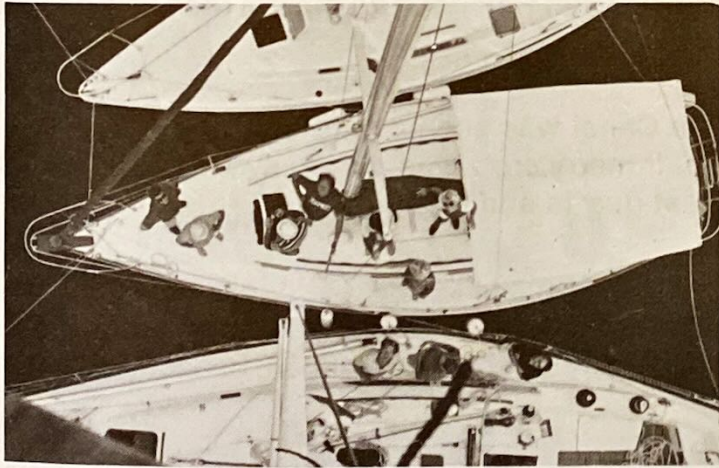
The kite flying contest had only 5 illustrious athletes to brave the 20-knot winds, (parents were a big Help).

Aug. 14, Sat.

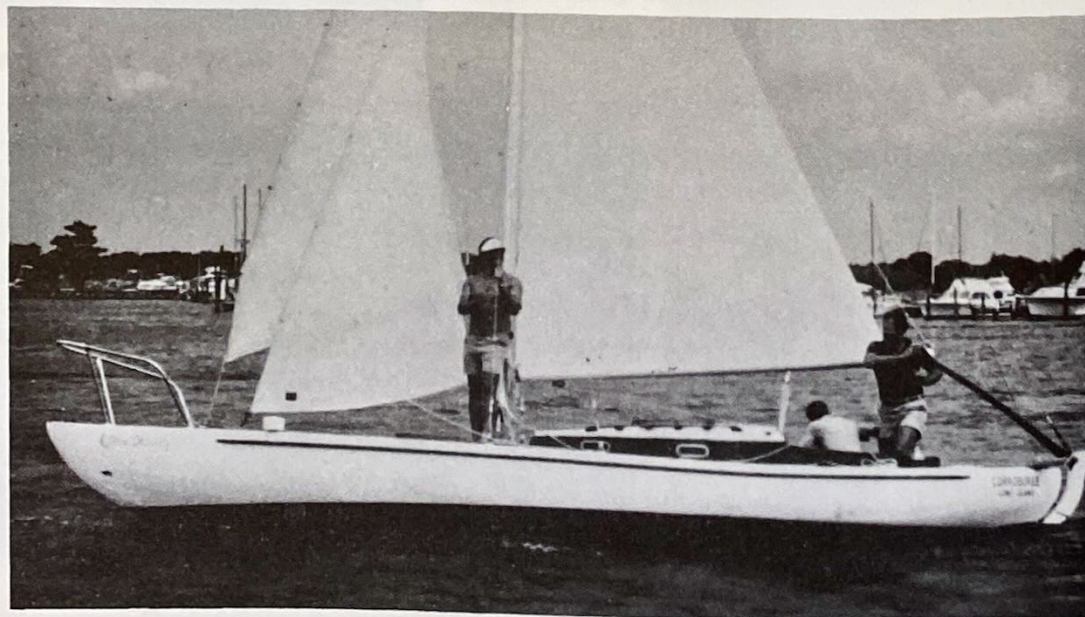
The grand tour up the Great River Canal was scenic and fun.

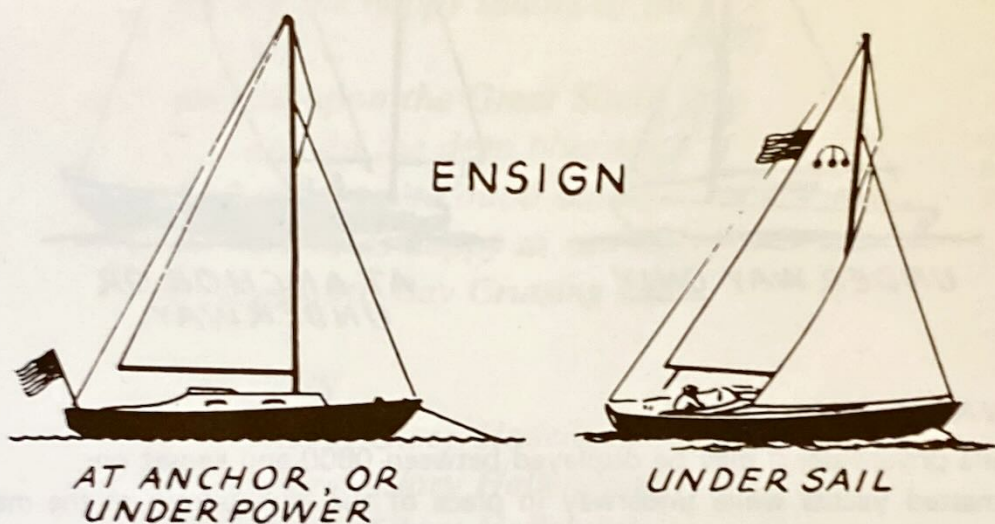

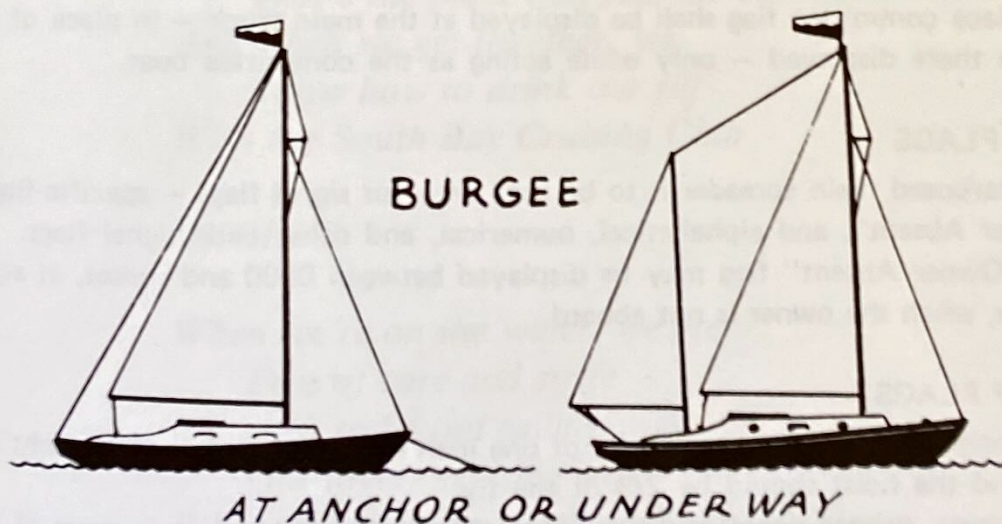
## FLAG ETIQUETTE

The correct display of flags, signals, and ensigns is one of the more obvious marks of a yachtsman. This inflexible code is steeped in the tradition of the sea and promotes uniformity in communication and identification between yachts. The complete flag etiquette of the N.A.Y.R.U. covers ten pages. We offer below a paraphrased version that covers the signals that are used daily on small or medium sized sailing yachts.



### THE ENSIGN

1. The ensign is displayed between 0800 and sunset only.
2. The ensign is displayed at anchor or under power along at a stern staff.
3. The ensign may be displayed under sail at the after peak of gaff-rigged yachts, otherwise 2/3 of the way up the leach of the aftermost sail.

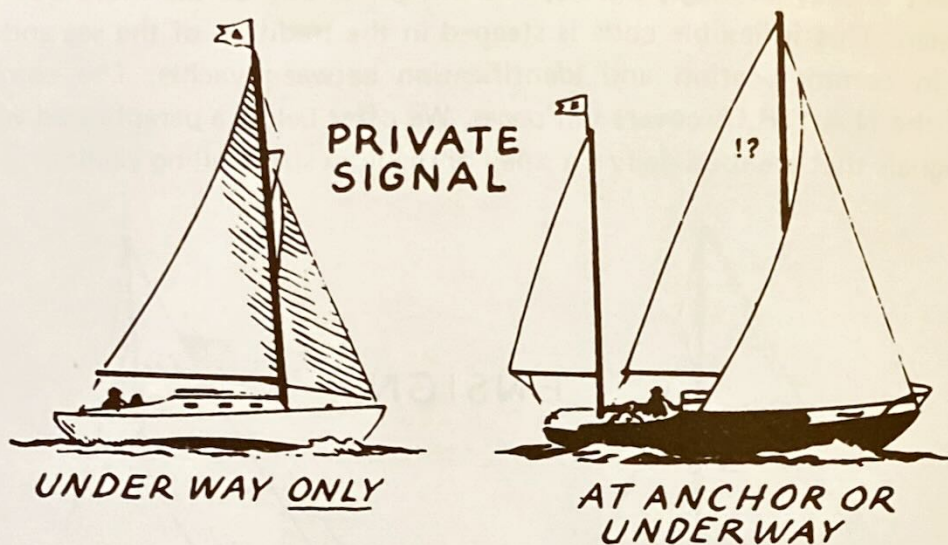


### THE BURGEE

The club burgee is displayed whenever the ensign is displayed, but may also be displayed separately, between 0800 and sunset, while at anchor or underway, on

1. The masthead of single-masted yachts
2. The forward masthead of two-masted yachts
3. NEVER at the spreader

## FLAG ETIQUETTE (Cont'd.)



### THE PRIVATE SIGNAL

The owner's private signal may be displayed between 0800 and sunset on:

1. Single-masted yachts while underway in place of the club burgee at the masthead.
2. Two-masted yachts at the after masthead, at anchor and underway.

### FLAG OFFICERS' FLAGS

A flag officer shall display his flag both day and night in place of and instead of his private signal on two-masted yachts or at the masthead of single-masted yachts.

### RACE COMMITTEE FLAG

The Race committee flag shall be displayed at the main truck — in place of the flag otherwise there displayed — only while acting as the committee boat.

### SIGNAL FLAGS

The starboard main spreader is to be used only for signal flags — specific flags, such as "Owner Absent", and alphabetical, numerical, and other code signal flags.

The "Owner Absent" flag may be displayed between 0800 and sunset, at anchor or underway, when the owner is not aboard.

### SIZES OF FLAGS

The ensign should have a minimum of one inch of fly for each foot of yacht's overall length, and the hoist should be  $\frac{2}{3}$  of the fly.

The burgee, private signal, and flag officers' flags should have a minimum of  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch of fly for each foot of height of the highest mast, and the hoist should be  $\frac{2}{3}$  of the fly.
