## Cruising and Rendezvous Program

---

### CRUISES

Early in the year, the Fleet Captain and the Cruise Committee put out an inquiry to the membership for opinions to work out tentative cruise itineraries. Plans for an extended two week and three week cruise off the bay are asked to be submitted to be put forth to the membership. A One Week Cruise Around the Bay has traditionally been held the week after the annual blast.

When a member(s) submits a plan for a cruise, that person(s) will act as Cruise Captain. The Cruise Captain will submit a draft itinerary of dates, ports of call, and activities to be published in the Masthead. A meeting date will be announced to present the cruise itinerary to the membership, usually in March. A final itinerary with dates, times, tides and activities will be given out to members who plan to sail on a cruise of their choice.

During a cruise, the itinerary may have to be adjusted due to weather. The Cruise Captain's responsibility is to keep the fleet informed of daily plans and/or changes that may occur. It is also the responsibility of the captains participating on a cruise to advise the Cruise Captain if they plan to leave the cruise and go their own way.

### THE SBCC RENDEZVOUS

The designated HOST boat should hoist the large burgee supplied by the Fleet Captain. All hands are invited to attend. Rendezvous usually begin around 1630 hrs. and last for about 2 hours. It is customary in the SBCC to bring your own drinks and to contribute to the snacks. Boat names should be on your bowls or platters and taken back to your boat. Pets should be left on their owner's boat. It is the duty of the HOST boat's captain to take a list of the boats that attend the rendezvous and stay the night until 6 am the next morning. That list should be given to the Fleet Captain as soon as possible by email.

Rendezvous are not normally cancelled due to inclement weather, but will be cancelled in the event that severe weather is forecast.

In the event the HOST captain is unable to attend their scheduled Rendezvous, it is expected that the HOST captain will obtain a substitute HOST boat and captain for the event, and then notify the Fleet Captain by telephone.

### RAFT-UP PROCEDURE

It has been tradition that no invitation is necessary to join a raft-up at a SBCC rendezvous, **weather permitting**, but please ask the HOST boat for permission to raft-up for the duration of the rendezvous. After the rendezvous, you should leave the raft and anchor nearby. While attending the rendezvous, please treat other boats as you would your own.

## Club Races and Awards

---

Over the course of our Club history, many special races, trophies and awards have been developed to meet the needs and interests of SBCC members. The late Gene Reardon, our past historian, compiled a brief description of some of these.

**Perseverance Trophy** – Donated by Fred Schnur in 1951. A consolation prize for the last boat to finish in the West Island Race. It was discontinued in 1994.

**West Island Race** – A race, established in 1951, in which a boat could sail the published course in either direction. This tested the skippers not only in the normal racing skills, but also in the added factors of predicting the winds, waves, tides and currents in the selection of which way to go around West Island. This race was the brain child of Hervey Smith and was originally called “The Annual Race”. This is normally the best attended race of the season.

**Annual Cruise Award** – This was designed to reward the best planned and executed cruise. Established in 1952, it originally required the submittal of an itinerary in advance. This award transformed itself into the Blue Water award in 1964. In 1967 the Green Water Award was added.

**Ocean Race** – First sailed in 1953, it was sailed from just outside of Fire Island Inlet to either Jones Inlet or to an offshore buoy. Typically, it was about a 25 nm race. It was originally called the Lightship Race and, for a period between 1954 and 1961, it was replaced by the Night Race.

**Foulke Trophy Race** – Established in 1954 in honor of J. Brion Foulke Jr., for the best corrected time in a race from Babylon to Bellport and return, finishing after dark. Beginning in 1959 it was required to keep south of West Island on the eastbound leg. This requirement was dropped in 1961.

**Smith Trophy Race** – This trophy was donated in 1954 by Hervey Smith in memory of his father. It was for a day race sailed in Patchogue Bay that was conducted by the Wet Pants Sailing Association as an invitational. In 1972 the race was moved to start in Bay Shore and run by the SBCC.

**Ladies’ Race** – From its inception in 1955, the helmsman was required to be female. Beginning in 1966, a special award was given to the boat with not only a female skipper, but also an all female crew.

**Commodore’s Cup** – Established in 1956 by Commodore Henry Post. Bestowed upon the boat with the best combined times in the Labor Day Weekend races, Babylon to Bellport, and Smith Trophy at Sayville. A special effort was made to encourage the entire family to be involved. In 1957 it became a single race from Timber Point to Bellport, and in 1973 it became a closed course race, sailed in Nicoll Bay.

**Windjammer Trophy** – Given to the boat that sailed the greatest distance on a Club cruise. The skippers computed the distances from their logs and submitted a report to the Cruise Committee. This award had a short life from 1957 to 1959.

**Single-handed Creepstakes** – Started in 1960 for a race in which only the skipper was on board. Beginning around 1980, spinnakers were also permitted. The spinnaker experiment was terminated around 1989 after several close encounters.

**Deale Trophy** – Created in 1963, in memory of William H. Deale, for the best corrected time in the West Island Race.

## Club Races and Awards

---

**Sympatico Cup** – This trophy was donated by Merritt Smith in 1963. It was originally called the Regatta Committee Trophy and is bestowed upon the last boat to finish in the Foulke trophy race. It was discontinued in 1984.

**Character Cup** – Donated by Ev Seidenberg in 1965, for the individuals contributing to “the legend and lore of the Great South Bay”. Last awarded in 1968.

**Broadside Trophy** – Established in 1966 by Boyd Max, to be awarded to the first boat to cross the finish line in the Ladies Day Race with an all female crew - thus the Broadside cannon salute to the skipper. This trophy was retired in 1982, and then reinstated in 2011.

**Governor’s Cup** – Created in 1966 by the SBCC Board of Governors for the best total score in the West Island, Foulke and Commodore’s Cup races.

**Patricia A. Kelly Trophy** – Created in 1982 by the SBCC for the best corrected time in the Ladies Race with an all-female crew.

**Cary Pearsall Trophy** – For the best corrected time in the Cary Pearsall Race. First awarded in 1993.

## Cruising Awards

**Cruising Awards** are given for participation in any of the Club’s organized cruises. To qualify, a yacht must anchor or tie-up with the fleet for at least 50% of the time designated for a cruise by the Fleet Captain. The Fleet Captain will submit a list of yachts eligible, based on cruise attendance records.

**Rendezvous Awards** are given, at the Fleet Captain’s discretion, to boats that attend a minimum number of rendezvous.

**Blue Water Award** – To recognize a well-planned and well-executed extended offshore cruise. Begun in 1964 and awarded occasionally, as deemed appropriate by the Awards Committee. It was the outgrowth of the Annual Cruising Award.

**Green Water Award** – Begun in 1967 to recognize a cruise of significantly greater distance and duration than the regular Club cruises. It was also an outgrowth of the Annual Cruising Award.

**Cruising Club Crock** – Begun in 1969 and given anonymously. It was for first place in the Character Boat Beauty Contest and Race and was originally called the Character Boat Perpetual Trophy. Competition was by invitation from the Selection Committee. In 1979 this trophy was changed to the best corrected time by a Club boat in the Around Long Island Race.

**Sheila Daytz Trophy** – Begun in 1993 and given to the boat attending the greatest number of Club Rendezvous in a season.

**The Ken Kondor Trophy** was created in 1995 and is awarded to the boat that does the most combined cruising and racing. To qualify, a boat must complete at least four races and get credit for four rendezvous. A boat gets one point for completing each race, an additional point for placing in a race, two points for attending a rendezvous and one point for hosting a rendezvous. The trophy is awarded annually at Commissioning Day.



## **SBCC Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions**

### **I. QUALIFYING TO RACE**

Sailboats eligible to race in accordance with the South Bay Cruising Club (SBCC) bylaws owned or chartered by SBCC members in good standing are encouraged to participate in club races.

#### **A. INTENT OF PROGRAM**

All sailboats are assumed to comply with the manufacturers' standard hull and accommodation plans. It is the responsibility of the owner of any vessel that has been materially modified or is of a unique design to inform the Handicap Committee of the irregularity prior to racing. Such vessel will then be reviewed by the Handicap Committee and rated accordingly.

#### **B. EQUIPMENT**

All equipment required for the participating vessel is to comply with Federal, State and Local requirements. It is strongly recommended that all sailboats participating in a SBCC sanctioned race on the Great South Bay comply with US Sailing from ISAF Category 4 & 5 equipment requirements. [www.ussailing.org/safety/ISAF/cat5.htm](http://www.ussailing.org/safety/ISAF/cat5.htm)

#### **C. INSPECTION POLICY AND PROCEDURES**

With the permission of the owners or their representatives, the SBCC measurer or designated assistants may conduct random inspections to confirm compliance with equipment and handicap declarations of any SBCC sailboat racing in SBCC sponsored races. These inspections may also be requested to resolve protest issues.

#### **D. HANDICAPS**

The SBCC fleet includes many different types of sailboats. In order to make race participation attractive to as many members as possible, SBCC handicap racing is offered. Under this system every yacht in the fleet is given an SBCC rating. Updated information on the SBCC Handicap process is available on the SBCC web site.

Handicap forms may be obtained from the SBCC web site ([www.sbccsail.org](http://www.sbccsail.org)) or by contacting the Handicap Committee. Yachts that do not have a handicap form on file will be assigned a base handicap. In this case the committee may give a handicap that is less favorable than that which could be obtained by filing a handicap form. The form must be updated when a change is made to the boat.

#### **E. HANDICAP APPEAL**

A skipper who believes the yacht's handicap might deserve correction may request a handicap review by submitting a written request to the Handicap Committee stating the reasons he or she believes a review is in order. The Handicap Committee will respond in writing within 10 days and the new handicap, if any, will take effect as of the date of the written decision. Skippers who are not satisfied with their decision have recourse by appealing directly to US Sailing. The appeal to US Sailing can only be done once in each calendar year. Contact the Handicap Committee or US Sailing for the procedure and current cost.

#### **F. SBCC HANDICAP CLASSES**

Spinnaker, Non-Spinnaker and Corinthian classes are scored under the SBCC handicap system. The Non-Spinnaker and Corinthian classes sail inventory is restricted to use of only those sails that can be correctly flown on all points of sail. In these classes, only one headsail may be flown in the foretriangle at any one time. Yachts handicapped as having permanent double head rigs will be permitted to fly their staysail when racing in these classes.

Members may change classes as often as they desire, as long as it is done before the warning signal and they inform the Race Committee.

### G. RACING NUMBERS

Racing numbers, either US Sailing or SBCC, are required on mainsails, spinnakers, and overlapping headsails with an LP of greater than 130% of J. Numbers shall be integer values with no leading zeros and have high contrast to the sail. This modifies RRS, 77.

### H. MEMBERSHIP RESTRICTION

No boat shall race in an SBCC-sponsored event (except invitationals) unless skippered by an SBCC member or associate. However, a member's boat may be skippered by an associate without a member on board only twice in one season, and only once in any series.

## II. RACING RULES

### A. RULES

The races and series will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing except as otherwise specified in these instructions. Government navigation buoys not stated as being marks of the course may be disregarded at the discretion of the skipper.

### B. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect. Changes will be made by posting on the SBCC official notice board which is the SBCC website located at [www.sbccsail.org](http://www.sbccsail.org).

## III. RACE PROGRAM

### A. RACE SCHEDULE

SBCC sponsors numerous races and participates in various invitationals as set forth in the race schedule. See schedule for details and special notes.

### B. COURSES

Courses used for SBCC races and some invitationals are set forth at the end of these instructions. They are grouped by starting area as follows:

“Babylon” “Bay Shore” “Nicoll Bay” “Watch Hill” “West Babylon”

For each of these areas a variety of courses are described in Section X, “Race Courses,” each bearing a distinguishing number. The course selected will be signaled from the committee boat by the appropriate numeric pennant. In addition, the RC may indicate a “Special” course. For “Special” see the RC for details.

The Race Committee may designate different courses for each class except for the Commodore's, West Island, Foulke, and Smith Races, as set forth in Section X.

### C. SERIES RACES

**Bay Shore & Babylon Twilight Series** – These are four race series as determined by the race schedule. These series will have one throw-out provided the series is at least two races. In the event that only one race can be sailed, one race constitutes a series.

**Great South Bay Yacht Racing Association (GSBYRA) Race Week** - This is a multi-day event. All yachts must register with the host club and pay a registration fee. Check the Masthead for details or inquire with the GSBYRA.

**Fall Series 1 & 2** – A two race series held in the fall.

### D. SPECIAL RACES & EVENTS

**Ed Brooks Memorial New Year's Race** – This race takes place on New Year's Day with the starting area off the Babylon Village dock. Post race awards and festivities are usually held after the race. Race awards begin after 1500 hours.

**East Cup** – This is an event jointly run between the SBCC and the Wet Pants Association. Race awards will be given at the Wet Pants Association facility.

**Babylon Yacht Club July Invitational Series** - This is a multi race series with no throw-outs. The courses, starting sequence, and other race instructions will be provided by the Babylon Yacht Club and will be available from the committee boat on station prior to the first race or at the Babylon Yacht Club. You must register with the Babylon Yacht Club to race the Babylon Yacht Club July Invitational Series.

**Single-Handed Creepstakes** - Only the skipper is allowed aboard during race. Two classes: 27 feet LOA and over; and under 27 feet LOA. Non-Spinnaker only. Y Flag is in effect for the race - PERSONAL FLOTATION DEVICES MUST BE WORN.

**Turkey Race** - This is the season finale with an after-race gathering at a place to-be-announced by the Regatta Committee.

**Sayville Yacht Club (Jack's Trophy)** - This is a two-race series sailed over two days. It will be scored by the SYC as the arithmetic sum of the corrected times of the yachts participating in both races. A party is scheduled that Saturday night for all participants who pre-register. See SYC race committee for a handout and details and register with the SYC.

**Spring Family Race** - A Non-Spinnaker race leaving from Watch Hill Sunday morning. Crew must sleep aboard their yacht Saturday night at Watch Hill. Start time to be announced by committee boat at dock.

**Fall Family Race** – A Non-Spinnaker race leaving from the Atlantique Boat Basin Sunday morning. Crew must sleep aboard their yacht Saturday night at the Atlantique Boat Basin. Start time and course may be published in the Masthead and will be announced by committee boat at dock.

**West Island Race** – This race originates in Bay Shore, circumnavigates West Fire Island, and may be sailed in either direction.

**SBCC/BYC Babylon Cup** – An event run jointly by the SBCC and the BYC. A get-together will be held at the BYC Clubhouse, including trophy awards. Check the Masthead prior to the event.

**West Cup** – A Friday-evening event held in conjunction with the Unqua Corinthian Yacht Club and the SBCC. A post race party at the UCYC will follow the race. Check the Masthead prior to the event

**Foulke Trophy Race** – Also known as the night race. Approximately 30 miles with a late afternoon start. Yachts will start at different times based on their handicaps. The race will be scored 'Time-on-Distance.'

### IV. RACE SCORING AND TROPHIES

#### A. SCORING METHOD

SBCC races will be scored using the time-on-time method unless the note for an individual race states some other method. A time factor is obtained using a formula based on handicap and elapsed time. This time allowance is then multiplied with the yacht's elapsed time yielding the corrected time. The yacht with the lowest corrected time is the winner.

The Corrected Time (CT) is computed from the Elapsed Time (ET), the boats handicap (HC) and a factor, B. The formula used for CT is the following, where the times are expressed in seconds:

**CT = ET X 650/[B+HCP] where B is defined as follows:**

650 for an average wind speed of less than 8 knots

550 for an average wind speed of 8 to 15 knots

480 for an average wind speed of greater than 15 knots

In determining the winner of the perpetual trophies (Section IV. F), the race scorer will apply an adjustment between the winner of the spinnaker class and non-spinnaker class if it is determined that the spinnaker class carried the spinnaker to advantage for at least one third of the race.

Preliminary race results are available to each participating skipper shortly after each race by e-mail. The official results are printed periodically in the Masthead and posted on the SBCC web site.

#### B. SERIES SCORING

The Twilight Season Championship Series and each of the individual twilight series will be scored using the Performance Gradient System (G), developed by Bill Grauer. The Performance Gradient is calculated for each boat, in each race, based on the following formula:

$$G = 1 - [(p - 1)/(n + 1)] - [1/\{2(n - 1)\}];$$

Where *p* is the boat's finish position (1 for first place, 2 for second place, etc.), and *n* is the number of starters in the race. The details and rationale behind the Performance Gradient System can be found on the SBCC website at: [www.sbccsail.org/The Performance Gradient System.pdf](http://www.sbccsail.org/The%20Performance%20Gradient%20System.pdf).

The Performance Gradient will therefore be a number greater than zero and less than one. Boats that did not come to the starting area, that did not start, did not finish, retired after finishing, or were disqualified shall be given a *p* equal to *n*+1 (number of starters in the race plus one). Rule A9 will not apply for series that use the Performance Gradient System.

## SBCC Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions

In general, for a series in which there are no throw-outs, the boat's **G's** are added together and then divided by the number of races to obtain an Average **G**, or **AG**. The boat with the highest **AG** wins. For a series that uses the best **X** races, the top **X** races are added together and divided by **X** to derive an **AG**.

For the individual Twilight Series, there will be one throw-out race. The **G's** earned for each remaining race are added together. The total **G** is then divided by the number of races counted to derive **AG**. There shall be three Twilight Season Championships: Bay Shore, Babylon Spin and Babylon Non Spin. The Season Champion in each of these shall be the boat with the highest season **total AG** for that venue/division.

#### C. SERIES TIE BREAKER

Ties for a series shall be broken in accordance with RRS, A8.

#### D. SERIES SCORING FOR COMMITTEE BOATS

Boats that serve as the committee boat for one race in a series will receive a **G** for that race based on the average of the **G's** earned in the other races in which it was a starter, as follows.

There must be at least two races available to compute an average **G**. If the committee boat (CB) does not have at least two races in which it was a starter then the CB will not get an adjustment for the race and instead will get a **G** computed with a *p* equal to *n*+1. However, if the CB has two or more races in which it was a starter, then all the races started (up to a maximum of the number of races used for computing the series score) will be used to compute the average **G**. Thus, for a four race series in which one throw out is allowed, and if the CB did all the other three races, then the CB will receive an adjustment equal to the average **G** from the three races sailed. Or, if the series is the best seven out of nine, and the CB did all the other eight races, then the best seven races will be used to determine the average **G** for the CB adjustment.

The committee boat will only receive the adjustment for one committee assignment in a series. If a boat does more than one assignment, the adjustment will be given to that race which is most beneficial to it.

The **G** for the CB adjustment will be included in determining the series standing, just as if the CB had actually raced in that race with the average **G** adjustment.

#### E. RACE TROPHIES

Trophies for individual SBCC races (when not part of a series) will be awarded to each class, according to the following schedule:

Number of Starters	Trophies for
2 or 3	1 <sup>st</sup>
4 through 6	1 <sup>st</sup> and 2 <sup>nd</sup>
7 through 14	1 <sup>st</sup> , 2 <sup>nd</sup> , and 3 <sup>rd</sup>
15 or more	1 <sup>st</sup> , 2 <sup>nd</sup> , 3 <sup>rd</sup> , and 4 <sup>th</sup>

In any SBCC series, the greatest number of starters in any race will govern the number of trophies awarded for that series.

#### F. PERPETUAL TROPHIES

Perpetual trophies are awarded for one year only. They are awarded to the SBCC yacht with the best-corrected time based on the method specified in section IV. A. Except for the Pearsall Cup.

## SBCC Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions

The Club will award six perpetual trophies, as follows:

- Commodore's Cup** - Best corrected time in the Commodore's Cup race.
- Cruising Club Crock** – Best-corrected time in the Around Long Island Regatta scored with SBCC Handicaps.
- Deale Trophy** - Best corrected time in the West Island race.
- Foulke Trophy** – Best corrected time in the Foulke Trophy race (night race).
- Governor's Cup** - Best total score for the Commodore's Cup, West Island and Foulke Trophy races.
- Smith Trophy Distance Race**- Best corrected time in the Smith Trophy race.
- Pearsall Cup** – Best corrected time for the West Cup race.

It is the responsibility of the winner of the perpetual trophy to return it by October 1st to the Trophy Chairperson for engraving with the following year's winner. Keeper cups are given to winners of these trophies and their names are engraved on the perpetual trophy.

### V. COMMITTEE BOAT ASSIGNMENTS

#### A. SERVING AS COMMITTEE

The SBCC depends upon the cooperation of all members. Being the Committee Boat for a race is an important responsibility. Reliable, timely, and accurate performance is essential. Prior to their race, Race Committees should contact Scoring to arrange reporting of results.

Race Chairpersons are assigned by the Regatta Committee, and listed in the Race Schedule. These assignments are obligatory.

#### B. CHANGES

A Race Chairperson may switch assignments with another Race Chairperson provided that the Regatta Captain is notified at least 24 hours before the race. Arranging such changes is the **sole responsibility of the assigned skipper** and does not relieve him or her of responsibility.

#### C. PENALTIES

Any Race Chairperson who willfully fails to do his or her assignment shall not be scored in any SBCC race for a period of one year from the date of his or her scheduled Committee Boat assignment. As an alternative penalty, a Race Chairperson who failed to do his or her race assignment for the first time in the racing season will be scored in SBCC races after payment of a \$100 fine payable to the SBCC.

### VI. STARTING LINE AND FINISHING LINE PROCEDURES AND RULES

#### A. CLASS STREAMERS

Racing yachts are required to fly streamers from their standing backstays. Streamers should measure 4"x18".

*Failure to display the appropriate streamer may be considered grounds for disqualification.*

## SBCC Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions

### B. CODE SIGNALS

The code flags below are special SBCC course flags:

- R** -Sail the designated course in the REVERSE direction. Leave or round all marks on the opposite side.
- T** - Sail the designated course TWICE around.
- U** -Sail the designated course THREE times around.  
*For T and U round the pin /X-Mark on the same side as the next mark of the course. For Bay Shore course #2 this instruction does not apply.*
- V** - Finish at the Babylon Y.C. dock. This is not recommended for Twilight Races.

The following Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) code flags are some of the more common race signals used during SBCC conducted races. While not all signals are listed, racers are expected to know all of the race signals and their definitions.

- L** - Come within hail for instructions. This signal is accompanied by one gun.
- S** -When flown after the start, (accompanied by two guns), finish between the Committee Boat and the mark where the course is shortened. For this purpose the mark is the pin and is no longer a turning mark.
- X** -Individual Recall. This signal is accompanied by one gun.
- Y** -Personal buoyancy devices are required. This signal is accompanied by one gun.

### C. STARTING

Races will be started in accordance with Rule 26, as summarized below.

Signal	Flag and Sound	Minutes before starting signal
* Warning	Class flag and 1 sound.	5
Preparatory	P flag and 1 sound.	4
One-minute	Remove P flag and 1 long sound.	1
Starting	Remove class flag, 1 sound.	0

\* Approximately one minute before the warning signal for the first class to start, the RC will make 3 or more, quick sound signals.

The Race Committee may utilize a 'keep-off' (anti-barging) buoy. If one is used, this is not a temporary or accidentally attached object, and is therefore part of the committee boat.

### D. STARTING SEQUENCE

The following class flags shall be used, and the classes will be started in the following order.

At the starting signal, the Race Committee may announce "all clear" if no boat is on the course side of the starting line.

### **E. STARTING LINE ETIQUETTE**

Racing skippers are reminded to stay clear of the starting line until the Preparatory Signal for their class. Classes not starting are to remain clear of all yachts in the division before them. Failure to do so may result in a protest that may lead to a disqualification. No yacht will be disqualified without first being given a direct and specific written warning.

### **F. RECALLS**

As per The Racing Rules of Sailing published by the US Sailing Association (Rule 29). Yachts OCS (On the Course Side) will be penalized by having 30 minutes added to their elapsed time. This modifies RRS 28.1.

### **G. FINISHING**

The finish line is determined by the "X" mark (or buoy) and a blue flag on the Committee Boat or Committee Platform.

### **H. VHF COMMUNICATIONS**

VHF radio watch shall be maintained during a race utilizing Channel 72 for communication. Radio communications may be utilized to relay information on unusual situations during races such as postponements, recalls, withdrawals, etc. However, Race Committees may not always use VHF radio so it should not be relied on as the sole means of communication. Racers are requested not to initiate communications with the Race Committee from the time of the warning gun to the time that the last class starts.

### **I. OTHER INFORMATION**

No boat may make use of autopilot during any SBCC race.

### **VII. TIME LIMIT**

The time limit for each race is stated in the notes to the Racing Schedule. The time limit for all classes starting after the first class will be extended so as to allow all classes to have the same amount of racing time. If any yacht finishes within the time limit for her class, it is a race for her class. Yachts finishing after the Committee Boat has left its station should record their time and report it to the Race Committee as soon as possible.

### **VIII. PROTESTS AND REDRESS**

The Protest Committee will only entertain protests made in conformity with U.S. Sailing Rules 61, 61.1, 61.2 and 61.3. Requests for redress must conform to Rules 62, 62.1, and 62.2. Rule 61.2 Protest Contents, "A protest shall be in writing," is amended to "a protest shall be in writing using only a U.S. Sailing Protest Form". Requests for redress shall also be submitted in writing on a U.S. Sailing Protest Form, which amends Rules 62.2 to the extent it presently provides "the request shall be in writing." The time limit for protesting or requesting redress is one (1) full business day after the last boat in the race finishes, except where the rules provide otherwise. The protest/request for redress is to be mailed, showing a postmark by the postal service, or e-mailed to the Protest Chairman within the time limit. The Protest Committee will attempt to hold a protest/redress hearing by the second Monday after the time limit has expired. If a party to the hearing of a protest or request for redress does not come to the hearing, the Protest Committee may nevertheless decide the protest or request. A party may appear at a hearing through its representative by telephone conference provided arrangements to do so are made with the Protest Chairman 24 hours prior to the scheduled hearing date.

It is the exclusive responsibility of each skipper to decide whether or not to start, continue, or drop out of any event. The South Bay Cruising Club does not assume any liability for the decision of any participant. The Board of Governors of the South Bay Cruising Club recommends that all owners and skippers carry liability, as well as hull insurance, to protect all parties from the financial consequences of an accident.

## Significant Accomplishments 2011 Trans Atlantic Race - from Bob Forman

We crossed the finish line off Lizard on July 16, 2011 at 15:29:08 UTC. After a year of planning we had completed the Race in 19 days, 21 hours and 29 minutes and finished third in our class. Jacqueline IV with a crew of seven sailors had started from Newport, each with a dream. We finished as a closely knit team who had shared a lifetime experience. We became one of a small number of sailors who had completed a transatlantic Race. For me this was especially special as I shared this experience with my daughter, Kara.

The first step in preparing for the race was to gather wind, current, air temperature and sea temperatures that we could expect along the 2900 mile route. I used this information to run simulations of the actual race. As a result of this exercise I found that we could expect the trip to take at least 18 days. The air temperatures would vary between a low of 47 to a high of 75 with an average temperature of 59 degrees. The average wind speed would be about 16 knots and we could expect winds in the mid 30's and would have to be prepared for winds greatly in excess of that. The sea surface temperatures would vary from a low of 48 degrees to a high of 66 degrees with an average of 57.5.

My daughter took responsibility for provisioning JIV for 420 meals that would all have to fit into a 42 foot boat and would taste good and provide us the needed nourishment to function at a high level for the duration of the race. We ate like kings, and one meal was better than the next. In addition to such traditional JIV treats like ice cream, we enjoyed crab cakes with fresh baked bread and bean salad. We also enjoyed fresh baked chocolate chip cookies right out of the oven

We spent a lot of time thinking about safety. Everyone in the crew had a personal EPIRB. Six of the seven members of the crew took both the one day theoretical safety at sea and one day of hands on. Two members of the crew took the wilderness two day first responder medical course and ½ day CPR course. In addition to that we sailed JIV 800 miles prior to the race in all conditions including a gale.

Jacqueline IV had been designed to be both a good cruising boat and to be competitive in the Bermuda Race. Now she would have to be upgraded for a transatlantic race. Some of the upgrades were: the addition of a water maker, AIS system, high water alarm, and changed all interior lighting to LED.

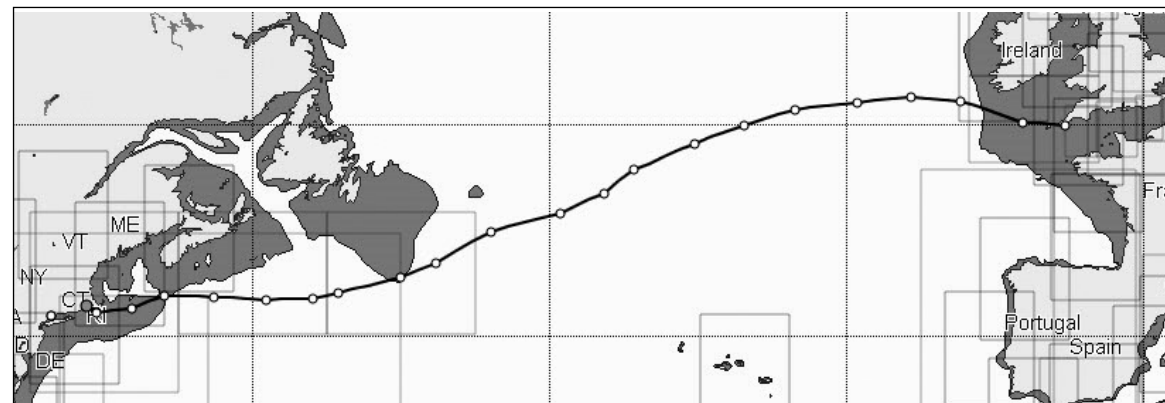
This is the actual route we took between Newport and Lizard which was 2860.8 miles. The distance between each two dots represents the distance covered that day. We averaged 144.09 miles per day. On our best day we sailed 202.5 miles at an average speed of 8.44 knots. On our slowest day we sailed 77.48 with an average speed of 3.37 knots. Our average speed for the entire race was 6.0 knots

The amount of marine life that we saw was staggering. We almost always had sea birds with us. We saw a number of whales of different types. Dolphins were with us almost every day. The first eight days were very foggy and cold with a lot of condensation on everything. When the fog finally lifted we had one spectacular clear night where I steered by lining up the sheave for the check stay with Jupiter. On some of the sunrises the entire sky and water lit up. There were many periods of light winds most often from behind the beam which made progress agonizingly slow. There were other times when we surfed down the front of waves either under spinnaker or blast reacher for over a day at time.

The finish of the race was off of Lizard which is on the southern coast of England. We opened a bottle of Mount Gay Rum to celebrate the completion of our Transatlantic Race. The prizes

were awarded at the Royal Yacht Squadron by Princess Anne. It was the first time that I have received a sterling silver trophy in all of my years of sailboat racing.

## Significant Accomplishments 2011 Around Long Island Race - from Kevin Padden

Race day began on Thursday, July 28. With the new start time (1730 hours) for our Spinnaker Division (#4), the need to get to Staten Island in advance of the race has been eliminated. Although I miss the days of meeting at Richmond Hill YC in Staten Island for the start, I don't miss the logistics of getting boat and crew in place for the race. All of the crew were Great South Bay sailors. My co-captain, Barry Pittman, and I have done this race together at least 15 times, though this was the first in *Rettsie*, my 1980 Ericson 38. The balance of the crew on my watch was John Shroeder, a perennial *Mirage* crew member; Jim Glynn, who has been sailing and racing on the Bay all his life; and Tony Furey, Barry's son-in-law. On Barry's watch were Bill Harbert, a regular *Rettsie* crew member; Conor Hartnet of Mary Carroll's fame, who supplied the necessary rum and vodka; and John Everett, also a life-long Bay sailor.

We left the dock at Babylon shortly after 9:00am on race day. After some stress getting Through Wantagh and Meadowbrook Bridges, we stopped at Lido Beach for ice, and took the opportunity to do final rig tuning and wire up the depth/knot meter. We passed a few dolphins on the way, a good omen, and made the start area with more than an hour to cruise around and check out the competition. The race started in a SSE 12-15 knot breeze. With full main and #1, we easily won the start, and then headed south of the many container ships anchored in the area, fearing their wind-shadows would hurt our progress. We did foot off and break away from the fleet that hardened up to sail above them.

Before passing Long Beach, the wind seemed to shift due south. Seeing chutes pop up behind us, we decided to hoist the  $\frac{3}{4}$  symmetrical spinnaker. We were able to carry it to advantage, with apparent wind about 10 degrees forward of the beam. By 10pm, the first shift change, we were already abeam of Fire Island Inlet. The wind started oscillating and clocking east, and it appeared we would not be able to continue carrying the chute. John Shroeder convinced me to hold on, and miraculously the wind clocked back to south, carrying the chute at 7+ knots!

My crew went below for some well-deserved sleep. When I came back on deck at 2am, we were a few miles west of Moriches Inlet, and I was happily surprised to see the spinnaker still up and pulling, with Johnny Everett driving effortlessly. The 2-6

graveyard shift was like no other in my 15 years of doing this race. While the wind dropped a little, the boat speed never went below 5 knots, and we continued to carry the chute with the wind forward of the beam. Around 5am, several Division 7 boats slid slowly past. At the 6am shift change, I told Barry we had run those Division 7 boats down all night, and it was their job to get past them! I then went below with a sly grin on my face, knowing Barry had little chance to get past those sleds.

We rounded Montauk as the tide was turning against us, about 9:50 am. We gybed the chute, having made the 100-mile leg in 16 hours and 10 minutes, and then realized the wind was too far forward to carry the chute, so we hoisted the light plastic 150. I had installed carbon tapes on it in hopes of improving its durability. It worked, as we carried this sail through Plum Gut, and then pointed the boat at Northport, on the rhumb line, driving 270 degrees.

We continued to make great time, dodging storms that rolled in to the west, which cleared before we got to them. We were all giddy, calculating our finish time based on current boat speed. Rum started disappearing at a rapid rate until the voice of reason (Barry) proclaimed the crew was to slow down the libations. We knew the race could be won or lost on the second day in the Sound. I went down for more rest as we neared Port Jeff. When I came back up, I saw we had passed the Northport Chimneys – and then noted Barry holding a cocktail! “No one listened to me,” he said. “Why should I be the only one not drinking!”

We had hardened up and began long tacks towards Hempstead Harbor. I called for a change to the Dacron #1, as the Plastic Fantastic was tacking through more than 100 degrees. We quickly made the change and worked our way into Hempstead Harbor. As we approached, we called committee to alert them, as required in the racing rules. We were quite surprised when they announced that Rettsie was the projected winner of our class! We crossed the finish line at 2:10am on Saturday, for a total elapsed time of 32 hours and 40 minutes. Happily, SCYC had arranged to keep the bar open until 4am. We quickly made our way to shore to celebrate our victory. We had a great motor sail back to Babylon and the party on Sunday at SCYC was fantastic. And in addition to winning our class—the next boat was more than 9 hours behind us!—we took second place in the Classic Division, for boats older than 25 years of age.

## Two Week Cruise - To Block Island, RI and Essex, CT

June 24 - July 9, 2011 from Dave Tedesco

*Block Island is 15 miles east of Montauk Point and has been called the Bermuda of the Northeast. Essex is a quaint New England town founded in the 1600's. Silent P and Phoebe Rose left our home ports on June 25, arrived at Block on Monday the 28th, left for Essex, CT July 1, and returned to Block July 5th. We've been members of the SBCC since 1997. The beauty of this club is that there is such a knowledge base from the many people that belong to the club. Therefore, you will see that several of our sailing friends are referenced.*

**Friday, June 24** –Real snotty weather – winds from the east at 20-25 knots. We decided to put in to safe harbor at Atlantique rather than anchor in Sore Thumb. For the first time since I can remember, *Phoebe Rose* left the dock in daylight and arrived in daylight for the first leg of the Two-Week Cruise!

We spent a beautiful afternoon and evening the next day anchored in Sore Thumb. On the way, we waved to Captain Ricky LaTorre on the bridge of the *Yankee III*, fishing in the Thumb when we got there. We relaxed rafted up to *Silent P* for the official rendezvous of the 2-Week Cruise, then after dinner we broke away and anchored for the night.

**On Sunday** we navigated Fire Island Inlet without any problem, thanks to the local knowledge provided by Ricky LaTorre's racing crew. Don Metzlik would have been proud of me. My first stop in Shinnecock Bay was Jackson's Marina for fuel! Lots of southerly rollers on the way.

**Monday, June 27 to Thursday, June 30** – We arrived at Block Island a day later than planned, but we didn't have any adverse winds to slow us, and nothing fell off the engine! Yesterday's rollers disappeared, and we had a delightful motor-sail about ½ mile off the beach along the 50-foot deep line. Dennis Connor once told me that you could steer your boat to Montauk just by following that 50-foot contour line on your depth finder. When we arrived, we made our way into New Shoreham where we met Carrie Pshedesky on the ferry from New London. She signed on as crew to *Silent P* for the next week & a half. We then stopped at Mohegan Cafe to celebrate our arrival.

**On Tuesday**, we took a cab to Southeast Light and hiked around the lighthouse and Mohegan Bluffs. We took the stairs down to the beach, taking lots of pictures. We walked down the road a piece, and found another trail which led to an escarpment overlooking the Bluffs. The weather was clear, and we could see the Montauk Light from these vantage points.

The next day we rented a car and continued to explore the island. We stopped at the Three Sisters for lunch, a charming little cottage where you walk in the front door, place your order, and walk out the back door. Your lunch is served to you in a metal pail and then you pay when you leave! Next stop was Rodman's Hollow, where we befriended a black lab. Carrie named him Neavis, and he accompanied us all the way to the Black Rock Beach overlook and back. We took advantage of the rental car and stocked up on provisions at the BI Market.

**On Thursday**, we met up with Jack and Ann Young, who had just arrived from Essex, CT aboard Storm Runner, their 42 foot Grand Banks trawler. Jack is an original member of the SBCC, with membership back to 1951, when the Club was founded. He was also the Club's third Commodore in 1954 and 1955.

**Friday, July 1 – Block Island to Essex, CT** – We flew towards the Race at over 6 knots, but started experiencing opposing current by the time we got to the Connecticut River. It seemed to take forever to reach the Amtrak Railroad trestle, and once we did, we had to wait about 45 minutes for 3 commuter trains to pass before it could open for us. Even with the opposing current, we had a nice calm motor up the River to Essex. The river was well marked, and before long we found ourselves docked in a most beautiful setting at the Essex Island Marina. Thanks again to Dennis Krug, who advised us to get reservations here rather than try to get one of the few moorings at Hamburg Cove for the busy July 4<sup>th</sup> weekend.

## Two Week Cruise - To Block Island, RI and Essex, CT

**On Saturday**, June and I took the Krug's advice once again, and had lunch at the Griswold Inn, founded in 1776. The Inn was commandeered by the British during the War of 1812 and used as their headquarters for the duration of that war. Later, both crews met and walked through town, sampling and comparing Connecticut Ice Cream with that of Rhode Island's.

**On Sunday**, the crew of *Phoebe Rose* attended services at the First Baptist Church in Essex, which was in the midst of a month-long 200 year anniversary celebration. Interestingly, the church is a sister church of the Sag Harbor Whaler's Church. Both were built from the identical plans. We were fortunate enough to be given a little tour of the organ pipe room behind the organ following the service, after one of the members noticed me taking pictures of the stenciled pipes. It was quite interesting to see the signatures of the 'Bellows Boys' that dated back to the 1800's. These boys would manually pump the bellows so the organist could play the organ in the days before electricity. Both crews met at the Gris, and had a wonderful Sunday Brunch while it rained outside. The rest of the day was spent shopping, doing laundry and eating.

We celebrated July 4<sup>th</sup> by taking a Steam Train excursion that dropped us off for a side trip to the Gillette Castle, where William Gillette, the stage actor, built himself quite an amazing retreat atop one of the Seven Sisters, a range of hills overlooking the Connecticut River. Fleet Captain Rich Troy had recommended a tour of this historic site.

**July 5 – Return to Block Island** – We experienced a 3-knot favorable current most of the way to Block Island from Essex. The trip that took us 8 hours on Friday only took us 5 hours today! We passed Jack & Ann Young on the return trip from Essex, waving as we passed by. When we arrived at Block the day after July 4<sup>th</sup>, we were pleasantly surprised to immediately find a mooring. After cleaning up, we dinked into the Boat Basin and took a cab to the Spring House for a magnificent lunch on the shaded porch overlooking the green ocean.

Carrie booked us for a 2-1/2 hour private kayak tour of the Island's inner ponds with Corrie Heinz from Pond & Beyond. The day was foggy, windy and cool, which turned out to be perfect for our pond tour. Corrie grew up 'On Island,' and has worked as a naturalist and biologist before setting up her own company. On our last day on Block, *Silent P* went to Crescent Beach and **Phoebe Rose** had lunch at The Oar, and then went to town. The Pshedesky's went to The Oar for dinner, and the Tedesco's had appetizers at the National. This is something we've been doing since the very first time we went to Block Island and dined there with Lee and Margaret Christiansen.

We said good-bye to Carrie on Friday, who took the high-speed ferry back to New London. The weather forecast was patchy fog. Well, we left Great Salt Pond around 7:30 a.m. and didn't see land again until we were about 3 or 4 hours from Shinnecock Inlet! We never saw Montauk. Don't worry Dennis, we had the radar reflector up! Ed called a couple hours from Shinnecock and said there was a horrendous line of T-storms headed our way. We called Oakland's Marina and made reservations for the night. After fueling and tying up, we celebrated a wonderful cruise at the restaurant, where each couple split a 5-pound sweet, juicy lobster. We had heavy rain, but not the bad T-storms that were predicted. That's OK... the lobster was wonderful!

We left Shinnecock at 5:15 a.m. Saturday and hoped for an uneventful 8 hour trip back home. Just off the Fire Island Lighthouse June and I saw a splash, then another....dolphins!! June steered into the midst of them, and they started jumping out of the water alongside the boat. June radioed *Silent P* and they came over to join in the fun. It was incredible! There were over 100 dolphins of assorted sizes and colors giving us our own private SeaWorld show! After an uneventful transit of Fire Island Inlet, we again passed Captain Rick LaTorre aboard the *Yankee III*, and sailed to our homeports in West Sayville and Patchogue.

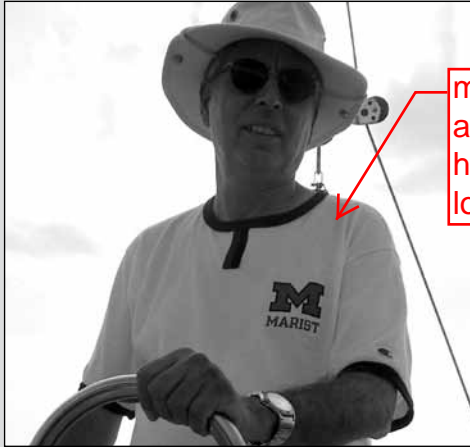
