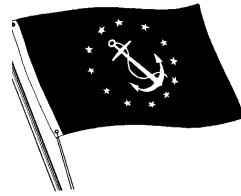

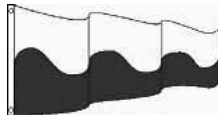

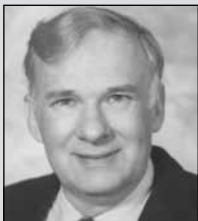

Cruising and Rendezvous Program

CRUISES

Early in the year, the Fleet Captain and the Cruise Committee put out an inquiry to the membership for opinions to work out tentative cruise itineraries. Plans for an extended two-week and three-week cruise off the bay are asked to be submitted to the membership. A One-Week Cruise Around the Bay has traditionally been held the week after the annual event called "The Blast."

When a member(s) submits a plan for a cruise, that person(s) will act as Cruise Captain. The Cruise Captain will submit a draft itinerary of dates, ports of call, and activities to be published in the Masthead. A meeting date will be announced to present the cruise itinerary to the membership, usually in March. A final itinerary with dates, times, tides and activities will be given out to members who plan to sail on a cruise of their choice.

During a cruise, the itinerary may have to be adjusted due to weather. The Cruise Captain's responsibility is to keep the fleet informed of daily plans and/or changes that may occur. It is also the responsibility of the captains participating on a cruise to advise the Cruise Captain if they plan to leave the cruise and go their own way.

THE SBCC RENDEZVOUS

The designated HOST boat should hoist the large burgee supplied by the Fleet Captain. Rendezvous usually begin around 1630 hours and last for about 2 hours. All hands are invited to attend. It is customary in the SBCC to bring your own drinks and to contribute to the snacks. Boat names should be on your bowls or platters and taken back to your boat. Pets should be left on their owner's boat. It is the duty of the HOST boat's captain to take a list of the boats that attend the rendezvous and stay the night until 6 AM the next morning. That list should be given to the Fleet Captain as soon as possible by e-mail.

Rendezvous are not normally cancelled due to inclement weather, but will be cancelled in the event that severe weather is forecast.

In the event the HOST captain is unable to attend their scheduled rendezvous, it is expected that the HOST captain will obtain a substitute HOST boat and captain for the event, and then notify the Fleet Captain by telephone.

RAFT-UP PROCEDURE

It has been tradition that no invitation is necessary to join a raft-up at a SBCC rendezvous, **weather permitting**, but please ask the HOST boat for permission to raft-up for the duration of the rendezvous. After the rendezvous, you should leave the raft and anchor nearby. While attending the rendezvous, please treat other boats as you would your own.

SBCC Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions

I. QUALIFYING TO RACE

Sailboats eligible to race in accordance with the South Bay Cruising Club (SBCC) bylaws owned or chartered by SBCC members in good standing are encouraged to participate in club races.

A. INTENT OF PROGRAM

All sailboats are assumed to comply with the manufacturers' standard hull and accommodation plans. It is the responsibility of the owner of any vessel that has been materially modified or is of a unique design to inform the Handicap Committee of the irregularity prior to racing. Such vessel will then be reviewed by the Handicap Committee and rated accordingly.

B. EQUIPMENT

All equipment required for the participating vessel is to comply with Federal, State and Local requirements. It is strongly recommended that all sailboats participating in a SBCC sanctioned race on the Great South Bay comply with US Sailing from ISAF Category 4 & 5 equipment requirements. <http://www.ussailing.org/safety/ISAF/cat5.htm>

C. INSPECTION POLICY AND PROCEDURES

With the permission of the owners or their representatives, the SBCC measurer or designated assistants may conduct random inspections to confirm compliance with equipment and handicap declarations of any SBCC sailboat racing in SBCC sponsored races. These inspections may also be requested to resolve protest issues.

D. HANDICAPS

The SBCC fleet includes many different types of sailboats. In order to make race participation attractive to as many members as possible, SBCC handicap racing is offered. Under this system every boat in the fleet is given a SBCC rating. Updated information on the SBCC Handicap process is available on the SBCC web site.

Handicap forms may be obtained from the SBCC web site (www.sbccsail.org) or by contacting the Handicap Committee. Boats that do not have a handicap form on file will be assigned a base handicap. In this case the committee may give a handicap that is less favorable than that which could be obtained by filing a handicap form. The form must be updated when a change is made to the boat.

E. HANDICAP APPEAL

A skipper who believes the boat's handicap might deserve correction may request a handicap review by submitting a written request to the Handicap Committee stating the reasons he or she believes a review is in order. The Handicap Committee will respond in writing within 10 days and the new handicap, if any, will take effect as of the date of the written decision. Skippers who are not satisfied with their decision have recourse by appealing directly to US Sailing. The appeal to US Sailing can only be done once in each calendar year. Contact the Handicap Committee or US Sailing for the procedure and current cost.

F. SBCC HANDICAP CLASSES

Spinnaker, Non-Spinnaker and White classes are scored under the SBCC handicap system. The Non-Spinnaker and White classes sail inventory is restricted to use of only those sails that can be correctly flown on all points of sail. In these classes, only one headsail

may be flown in the fore-triangle at any one time. Boats handicapped as having permanent double head rigs will be permitted to fly their staysail when racing in these classes.

Members may change classes as often as they desire, as long as it is done before the warning signal and they inform the Race Committee.

G. RACING NUMBERS

Racing numbers, either US Sailing or SBCC, are required on mainsails, spinnakers, and overlapping headsails with an LP of greater than 130% of J. Numbers shall be integer values with no leading zeros and have high contrast to the sail. This modifies RRS, 77.

H. MEMBERSHIP RESTRICTION

No boat shall race in an SBCC-sponsored event (except invitationals) unless skippered by an SBCC member or associate. However, a member's boat may be skippered by an associate without a member on board only twice in one season, and only once in any series.

II. RACING RULES

A. RULES

The races and series will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS) except as otherwise specified in these instructions. Government navigation buoys not stated as being marks of the course may be disregarded at the discretion of the skipper.

B. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect. Changes will be made by posting on the SBCC official notice board which is the SBCC website located at <http://www.sbccsail.org>.

III. RACE PROGRAM

A. RACE SCHEDULE

SBCC sponsors numerous races and participates in various invitationals as set forth in the race schedule. See schedule for details and special notes.

B. COURSES

Courses used for SBCC races and some invitationals are set forth at the end of these instructions. They are grouped by starting area as follows:

“Babylon” “Bay Shore” “Nicoll Bay” “Watch Hill” “West Babylon”

For each of these areas a variety of courses are described in Section X, “Race Courses,” each bearing a distinguishing number. The course selected will be signaled from the committee boat by the appropriate numeric pennant. In addition, the RC may indicate a “Special” course. For “Special” see the RC for details.

The Race Committee may designate different courses for each class, except for Commodore's Cup race, West Island race and Foulke Trophy race, as set forth in Section X.

C. SERIES RACES

Bay Shore & Babylon Twilight Series – These are four race series as determined by the race schedule. These series will have one throw-out provided the series is at least two races. In the event that only one race can be sailed, one race constitutes a series.

Great South Bay Yacht Racing Association (GSBYRA) Race Week - This is a multi-day event. All boats must register with the host club and pay a registration fee. Check the Masthead for details or inquire with the GSBYRA.

Fall Series 1 & 2 – A two race series held in the fall.

D. SPECIAL RACES & EVENTS

Babylon Yacht Club July Invitational Series - This is a multi-race series with no throw outs. The courses, starting sequence, and other race instructions will be provided by the Babylon Yacht Club and will be available from the committee boat on station prior to the first race or at the Babylon Yacht Club. You must register with the Babylon Yacht Club to race the Babylon Yacht Club July Invitational Series.

Discoverers / Raymond G. Terry Race – A Non-Spinnaker race run jointly by Bay Shore Yacht Club and South Bay Cruising Club. The race is held on the Saturday morning of Columbus Day weekend with a start in the area of Bay Shore and a finish at Atlantique.

Ed Brooks Memorial New Year's Race – This race takes place on New Year's Day with the starting area off the Babylon Village dock. Post race awards and festivities are usually held after the race. Race awards begin after 1500 hours.

Foulke Trophy Race – Also known as the Night race. Approximately 30 miles with a late afternoon start.

SBCC/BYC Babylon Cup – An event run jointly by the SBCC and the BYC. A get-together will be held at the BYC Clubhouse, including trophy awards. Check the Masthead prior to the event.

Single-Handed Creepstakes - Only the skipper is allowed aboard during race. Two classes: 27 feet LOA and over; and under 27 feet LOA. This is a Non-Spinnaker race. Autopilots shall not be used. Y Flag is in effect for the race - PERSONAL FLOTATION DEVICES MUST BE WORN.

Turkey Race - This is the season finale with an after-race gathering at a place to-be-announced by the Regatta Committee.

West Cup – An event held in conjunction with the Unqua Corinthian Yacht Club and the SBCC. A post race party at the UCYC will follow the race. Check the Masthead prior to the event

West Island Race – This race originates in Bay Shore, circumnavigates West Fire Island, and may be sailed in either direction.

IV. RACE SCORING AND TROPHIES

A. SCORING METHOD

SBCC races will be scored using the time-on-distance method. A boat's corrected time will be based on its assigned handicap and the distance of the measured course. The boat with the lowest corrected time is the winner.

To determine the winner of the perpetual trophies, (see section IV. F), the race scorer will apply an adjustment between the winner of the spinnaker class and non-spinnaker class. The following adjustments will be applied to spinnaker boats:

Less than 10 Knots	30 sec/mi Reduction in Handicap
10 to 19 Knots	24 sec/mi Reduction in Handicap
20 Knots or Greater	18 sec/mi Reduction in Handicap

Preliminary race results are available to each participating skipper shortly after each race by e-mail. The official results are printed periodically in the Masthead and posted on the SBCC web site.

B. SERIES SCORING

The Twilight Season Championship Series and each of the individual twilight series will be scored using the Low Point Scoring system. Boats are assigned points according to their place at the finish line (1 point for first, 2 for second, etc.). Boats that do not finish the race, retire, or are disqualified score the number of boats in the race +1. The boat with the lowest total score wins.

For a series that is held over a period of time longer than a regatta, a boat that came to the starting area but did not start, did not finish, retired after finishing or was disqualified shall be scored points for the finishing place one more than the number of boats that came to the starting area. A boat that did not come to the starting area shall be scored points for the finishing place one more than the number of boats entered in the series (RRS A9).

C. SERIES TIE BREAKER

If there is a series score tie between two or more boats, each boat's race scores shall be listed in order of best to worst, and at the first point(s) where there is a difference the tie shall be broken in favor of the boat(s) with the best score(s). If a tie still remains between two or more boats, they shall be ranked in order of their scores in the last race. Any remaining ties shall be broken by using the tied boats' scores in the next-to-last race and so on until all ties are broken. These scores shall be used even if some of them are excluded scores (RRS A8).

D. SERIES SCORING FOR COMMITTEE BOATS

Boats that serve as the committee boat for one race in a series will receive a point for that race based on the average of the points earned in the other races in which it was a starter, as follows.

There must be at least two races available to compute average points. If the committee boat (CB) does not have at least two races in which it was a starter then the CB will not

get an adjustment for the race and instead will get points equal to the number of starters in the race +1. However, if the CB has two or more races in which it was a starter, then all the races started (up to a maximum of the number of races used for computing the series score) will be used to compute the average points. Thus, for a four race series in which one throw out is allowed, and if the CB did all the other three races, then the CB will receive an adjustment equal to the average points from the three races sailed. Or, if the series is the best seven out of nine, and the CB did all the other eight races, then the best seven races will be used to determine the average points for the CB adjustment. The committee boat will only receive the adjustment for one committee assignment in a series. If a boat does more than one assignment, the adjustment will be given to that race which is most beneficial to it.

The points for the CB adjustment will be included in determining the series standing, just as if the CB had actually raced in that race with the average points adjustment.

E. RACE TROPHIES

Trophies for individual SBCC races (when not part of a series) will be awarded to each class, according to the following schedule:

Number of Starters	Trophies for
1	None awarded
1 to 2	1 st
3 to 4	1 st and 2 nd
5 to 14	1 st , 2 nd , and 3 rd
15 or more	1 st , 2 nd , 3 rd , and 4 th

In any SBCC series, the greatest number of starters in any race will govern the number of trophies awarded for that series.

F. PERPETUAL TROPHIES

Perpetual trophies are awarded once a year. They are awarded to the SBCC boat with the best-corrected time based on the method specified in section IV. A. Except for the Pearsall Cup.

The Club will award eight perpetual trophies, as follows:

Broadside Trophy - Best corrected time

Commodore's Cup - Best corrected time in the Commodore's Cup race.

Cruising Club Crock – Best-corrected time in the Around Long Island Regatta scored with SBCC Handicaps.

Deale Trophy - Best corrected time in the West Island race.

Foulke Trophy – Best corrected time in the Foulke Trophy race (night race).

Governor's Cup - Best total score for the Commodore's Cup, West Island and Foulke Trophy races.

Pearsall Cup – Best corrected time for the West Cup race.

Smith Trophy - Best corrected time in the Smith Trophy race. This is a two-handed race.

It is the responsibility of the winner of the perpetual trophy to return it by October 1st to the Trophy Chairperson for engraving with the following year's winner. Keeper cups are given to winners of these trophies and their names are engraved on the perpetual trophy.

V. COMMITTEE BOAT ASSIGNMENTS

A. SERVING AS COMMITTEE

The SBCC depends upon the cooperation of all members. Being the Committee Boat for a race is an important responsibility. Reliable, timely, and accurate performance is essential. Prior to their race, Race Committees should contact Scoring to arrange reporting of results.

Race Chairpersons are assigned by the Regatta Committee, and listed in the Race Schedule. These assignments are obligatory.

B. CHANGES

A Race Chairperson may switch assignments with another Race Chairperson provided that the Regatta Captain is notified at least 24 hours before the race. Arranging such changes is the **sole responsibility of the assigned skipper** and does not relieve him or her of responsibility.

C. PENALTIES

Any Race Chairperson who willfully fails to do his or her assignment shall not be scored in any SBCC race for a period of one year from the date of his or her scheduled Committee Boat assignment. As an alternative penalty, a Race Chairperson who failed to do his or her race assignment for the first time in the racing season will be scored in SBCC races after payment of a \$100 fine payable to the SBCC.

VI. STARTING LINE AND FINISHING LINE PROCEDURES AND RULES

A. CLASS STREAMERS

Racing yachts are required to fly streamers from their standing backstays. Streamers should measure 4"x18".

Failure to display the appropriate streamer may be considered grounds for disqualification.

B. CODE SIGNALS

The code flags below are special SBCC course flags:

R - Sail the designated course in the REVERSE direction. Leave or round a mark on the opposite side.

T - Sail the designated course TWICE around.

U - Sail the designated course THREE times around.

For T and U round the pin/X-Mark on the same side as the next mark of the course.

For Bay Shore course #2 this instruction does not apply.

V - Finish at the Babylon Y.C. dock. This is not recommended for Twilight Races.

The following Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) code flags are some of the more common race signals used during SBCC conducted races. While not all signals are listed, racers are expected to know all of the race signals and their definitions.

- L** - Come within hail for instructions. This signal is accompanied by one gun.
- S** - When flown after the start, (accompanied by two guns), finish between the Committee Boat and the mark where the course is shortened. For this purpose the mark is the pin and is no longer a turning mark.
- X** - Individual Recall. This signal is accompanied by one gun.
- Y** - Personal buoyancy devices are required. This signal is accompanied by one gun.

C. STARTING

Races will be started in accordance with Rule 26, as summarized below:

Signal*	Flag and Sound	Minutes before starting signal
Warning	Class flag and 1 sound.	5
Preparatory	P flag and 1 sound.	4
One-minute	Remove P flag and 1 long sound.	1
Starting	Remove class flag, 1 sound.	0

* Approximately one minute before the warning signal for the first class to start, the RC will make 3 or more, quick sound signals.

The Race Committee may utilize a “keep-off” (anti-barging) buoy. If one is used, this is not a temporary or accidentally attached object, and is therefore part of the committee boat.

D. STARTING SEQUENCE

The following class flags shall be used, and the classes will be started in the following order:

At the starting signal, the Race Committee may announce “all clear” if no boat is on the course side of the starting line.

E. STARTING LINE ETIQUETTE

Racing skippers are reminded to stay clear of the starting line until the Preparatory Signal for their class. Classes not starting are to remain clear of all boats in the division before them. Failure to do so may result in a protest that may lead to a disqualification. No boat will be disqualified without first being given a direct and specific written warning.

F. RECALLS

As per the Racing Rules of Sailing, published by the US Sailing Association (RRS Rule 29), boats on the course side (OCS) will be penalized by having 30 minutes added to their elapsed time. This modifies RRS 28.1.

G. FINISHING

The finish line is determined by the “X” mark (or buoy) and a blue flag on the Committee Boat or Committee Platform.

H. VHF COMMUNICATIONS

VHF radio watch shall be maintained during a race utilizing Channel 72 for communication. Radio communications may be utilized to relay information on unusual situations during

aces such as postponements, recalls, withdrawals, etc. However, Race Committees may not always use VHF radio so it should not be relied on as the sole means of communication. Racers are requested not to initiate communications with the Race Committee from the time of the warning gun to the time that the last class starts.

I. OTHER INFORMATION

No boat may make use of an autopilot during any SBCC race.

VII. TIME LIMIT

The time limit for each race is stated in the notes to the Racing Schedule. The time limit for all classes starting after the first class will be extended so as to allow all classes to have the same amount of racing time. If any boat finishes within the time limit for her class, it is a race for her class. Yachts finishing after the Committee Boat has left its station should record their time and report it to the Race Committee as soon as possible.

VIII. PROTESTS AND REDRESS

The Protest Committee will only entertain protests made in conformity with U.S. Sailing Rules 61, 61.1, 61.2 and 61.3. Requests for redress must conform to Rules 62, 62.1, and 62.2. Rule 61.2 Protest Contents, *A protest shall be in writing*, is amended to *a protest shall be in writing using only a U.S. Sailing Protest Form*. Requests for redress shall also be submitted in writing on a U.S. Sailing Protest Form, which amends Rules 62.2 to the extent it presently provides *the request shall be in writing*.

The time limit for protesting or requesting redress is one (1) full business day after the last boat in the race finishes, except where the rules provide otherwise. The protest/request for redress is to be mailed, showing a postmark by the postal service, or e-mailed to the Protest Chairman within the time limit. The Protest Committee will attempt to hold a protest/redress hearing by the second Monday after the time limit has expired. If a party to the hearing of a protest or request for redress does not come to the hearing, the Protest Committee may nevertheless decide the protest or request. A party may appear at a hearing through its representative by telephone conference provided arrangements to do so are made with the Protest Chairman 24 hours prior to the scheduled hearing date.

IX. SAFETY

It is the exclusive responsibility of each skipper to decide whether or not to start, continue, or drop out of any event. The South Bay Cruising Club does not assume any liability for the decision of any participant. The Board of Governors of the South Bay Cruising Club recommends that all owners and skippers carry liability, as well as hull insurance, to protect all parties from the financial consequences of an accident.

X. RACE COURSES

COURSE INSTRUCTIONS

1. When passing through the Robert Moses Causeway, the center span must be used.
2. When the designated course is to be sailed twice around, the “X” mark is a mark of the course the second time around. It is to be rounded on the same side as the **next** mark of the course unless otherwise specified.
3. For all Yacht Club Invitational races please see special Sailing Instructions for the event.
4. All marks are to be rounded or left on the side indicated.
5. The wind directions listed to the right of each course serve as an approximation of the suitability of that course under current wind conditions. Every attempt will be made by the Race Committee to select a course with a balanced upwind start.

Start and Finish established by the Race Committee (RC); at Willets Creek (40°40.92 / 73°18.12); off West Islip Marina (40° 40.877 / 73°17.464); or (in the case of course 3) at “#9.” If finishing at the Babylon Yacht Club dock, the RC shall display code flag “V.” If it is used as a mark of the course, leave “9” to starboard the last time it is rounded when finishing at the Babylon Yacht Club dock. Course distance may vary based on pin and “X” mark positions. It is not recommended that twilight races finish at Babylon Yacht Club. DO NOT RUN A DOWNWIND START.

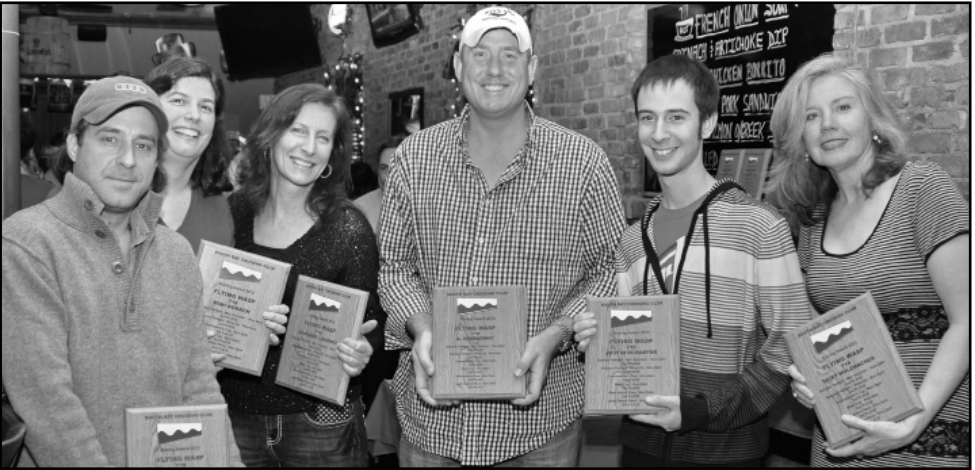
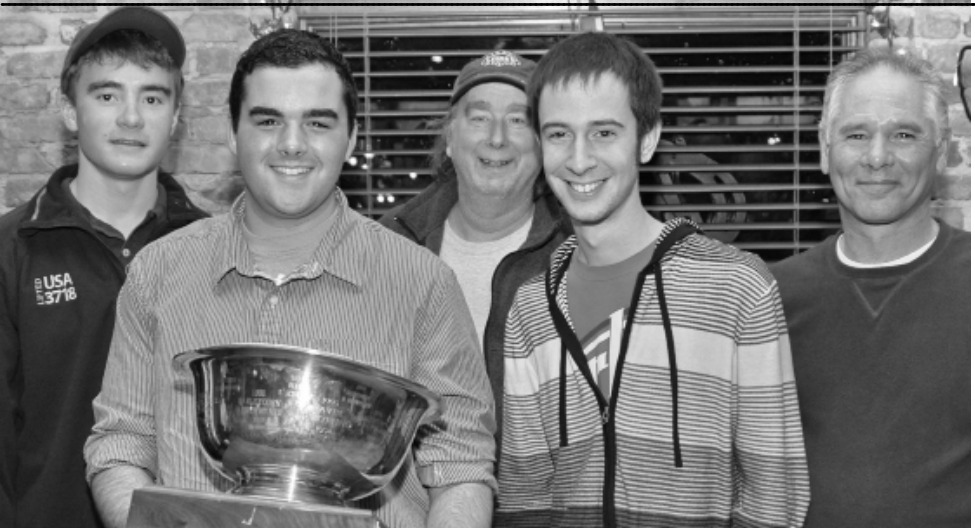

Club Races and Awards

Cruising & Rendezvous Awards

Cruising Awards are given for participation in any of the Club's organized cruises. To qualify, a yacht must anchor or tie-up with the fleet for at least 50% of the time designated for a cruise by the Fleet Captain. The Fleet Captain will submit a list of yachts eligible, based on cruise attendance records. Rendezvous Awards are given at the Fleet Captain's discretion to boats that attend a minimum number of rendezvous.

Annual Cruise Award – This was designed to reward the best planned and executed cruise. Established in 1952, it originally required the submittal of an itinerary in advance. This award transformed itself into the Blue Water award in 1964. In 1967 the Green Water Award was added.

Blue Water Award – To recognize a well-planned and well-executed extended offshore cruise. Begun in 1964 and awarded occasionally, as deemed appropriate by the Awards Committee. It was the outgrowth of the Annual Cruising Award.

Green Water Award – Begun in 1967 to recognize a cruise of significantly greater distance and duration than the regular Club cruises. It was also an outgrowth of the Annual Cruising Award.

Ken Kondor Trophy was created in 1995 and is awarded to the boat that does the most combined cruising and racing. To qualify, a boat must complete at least four races and get credit for four rendezvous. A boat gets one point for completing each race, an additional point for placing in a race, two points for attending a rendezvous and one point for hosting a rendezvous. The trophy is awarded annually at Commissioning Day.

Sheila Daytz Trophy – Begun in 1993 and given to the boat attending the greatest number of Club Rendezvous in a season.

Racing Awards & Trophies

Over the course of our Club history, many special races, trophies and awards have been developed to meet the needs and interests of SBCC members. The late Gene Reardon, our past historian, compiled a brief description of some of these.

Broadside Trophy – Established in 1966 by Boyd Max, to be awarded to the first boat to cross the finish line in the Ladies Day Race with a female skipper — thus the Broadside cannon salute to the skipper. This trophy was retired in 1982, and reinstated in 2011 using the handicap system instead of first boat across.

Cary Pearsall Trophy – For the best corrected time in the Cary Pearsall Race. First awarded in 1993.

Character Cup – Donated by Ev Seidenberg in 1965, for the individuals contributing to "the legend and lore of the Great South Bay." Last awarded in 1968; now awarded as the Cruising Club Crock, which began in 1969.

Commodore's Cup – Established in 1956 by Commodore Henry Post. Bestowed upon the boat with the best combined times in the Labor Day Weekend races, Babylon to Bellport, and Smith Trophy at Sayville. A special effort was made to encourage the entire family to be involved. In 1957 it became a single race from Timber Point to Bellport, and in 1973 it became a closed course race, sailed in Nicoll Bay.

Club Races and Awards

Cruising Club Crock – Begun in 1969 and given anonymously. It was for first place in the Character Boat Beauty Contest and Race and was originally called the Character Boat Perpetual Trophy. Competition was by invitation from the Selection Committee. In 1979 this trophy was changed to the best corrected time by a Club boat in the Around Long Island Race.

Deale Trophy – Created in 1963, in memory of William H. Deale, for the best corrected time in the West Island Race.

Foulke Trophy Race – Established in 1954 in honor of J. Brion Foulke Jr., for the best corrected time in a race from Babylon to Bellport and return, finishing after dark. Beginning in 1959 it was required to keep south of West Island on the eastbound leg. This requirement was dropped in 1961.

Governor's Cup – Created in 1966 by the SBCC Board of Governors for the best total score in the West Island, Foulke and Commodore's Cup races.

Ken Kondor Trophy – See page 56.

Ocean Race – First sailed in 1953, it was sailed from just outside of Fire Island Inlet to either Jones Inlet or to an offshore buoy. Typically, it was about a 25 nm race. It was originally called the Lightship Race and for a period between 1954 and 1961, it was replaced by the Night Race.

Patricia A. Kelly Trophy – Created in 1982 by the SBCC for the best corrected time in the Ladies Race with an all-female crew, including skipper. *See also Broadside Race.*

Perseverance (Schnur) Trophy – Donated by Fred Schnur in 1951. A consolation prize for the last boat to finish in the West Island Race. It was discontinued in 1994.

Single-handed Creepstakes – Started in 1960 for a race in which only the skipper was on board. Beginning around 1980, spinnakers were also permitted. The spinnaker experiment was terminated around 1989 after several close encounters.

Smith Trophy Race – This trophy was donated in 1954 by Hervey Smith in memory of his father. It was for a day race sailed in Patchogue Bay that was conducted by the Wet Pants Sailing Association as an invitational. In 1972 the race was moved to start in Bay Shore and run by the SBCC.

Sportsmanship Award - Award given at the discretion of the Regatta Captain to a member who exemplifies the best traditions of the sport of sailing.

Sympatico Cup – This trophy was donated by Merritt Smith in 1963. It was originally called the Regatta Committee Trophy and is bestowed upon the last boat to finish in the Foulke trophy race. It was discontinued in 1984.

West Island Race – A race, established in 1951, in which a boat could sail the published course in either direction. This tested the skippers not only in the normal racing skills, but also in the added factors of predicting the winds, waves, tides and currents in the selection of which way to go around West Island. This race was the brain child of Hervey Smith and was originally called "The Annual Race." This is normally the best attended race of the season. *See also Deale Trophy.*

Windjammer Trophy – Given to the boat that sailed the greatest distance on a Club cruise. The skippers computed the distances from their logs and submitted a report to the Cruise Committee. This award had a short life from 1957 to 1959.

Significant Accomplishments

The Bermuda Race - by Bob Forman

The conditions for the race to Bermuda in 2012 were dominated by a low that would be north of us, pressing up against a high to the south. It was our twelfth Bermuda Race and, like all the others, had its own personality. We could expect strong NE winds for a good 48 hours, followed by wind backing to the SW and dying off. Since we were the slowest boat in our class the challenge would be saving time on our competition and finishing before the ocean glassed over. We had a good start and popped the spinnaker as we crossed the starting line.

On our best day, Saturday, we covered 209 miles at an average speed of 8.71 knots with the wind from the NE at speeds ranging from 16 to 26.5 knots. As the seas built to 6 – 8 feet, we dropped the spinnaker and went to the blast reacher, our work horse in those conditions. On Sunday, we were still on the port tack, very unusual for this race. The winds continued to be from the NE but began to diminish. Around 2200 the wind backed to the north and then NW. As this happened, we changed from the blast reacher to first, the A5 spinnaker, and then the larger A3. We covered 171 miles at an average speed of 7.1 knots. The question now was how long would our wind last?

Early Monday, we jibed onto starboard tack under the A3 spinnaker. During the day the wind continued to diminish, dropping from 19 to a low of 6.5 knots as we approached Kitchen Shoals, about 4 miles from the finish. Now the real challenge began. The wind continued backing to the SW and became ever lighter. We were now beating into a dying breeze against lumpy seas on what was the lea side of the island. Victor was down below navigating, my son Trip was driving, I was in the cockpit trimming sails and acting as tactician. The rest of the crew was mostly on the lea rail to get *Jacqueline IV* to heel. At one point Trip cried out that we were going backward — we were actually doing 2 knots to windward.



We finished at 1:23 AM. It had taken us 1.5 hours to go the four miles from Kitchen Shoals. We had slipped from 3rd place to 4th but still earned a podium position in our class of 20 boats. Our elapsed time was our best ever — 84 hours 11 minutes — beating our previous best by almost 12 hours. It had been a very fast race with mostly hot wind angles.

Now I looked forward to a relaxing family vacation. Jackie flew in with our daughter-in-law Brittainy and our two granddaughters, Annabel and Nova. My nephew Lew and wife Stacey came with their daughter, our grand-niece, Ela. It was priceless to see Nova meet Ela for the

first time, “kissing cousins.” On Wednesday we had a party in our condo for family, the racing crew, return crew and friends, and watched the sun go down over Hamilton Harbor and the Great Sound. Roger Daisley had brought his guitar; he and Mike Saganic took turns leading us in song until the early hours.

There was a strong weather system scheduled to come off the coast. Over the years I have found that the best way to stay out of storm force winds was to avoid them, so the decision was made to leave by Friday noon. My return crew consisted of Roger Daisley, John Ziegler who had done five return trips from Bermuda and has rowed across the Atlantic in a rowboat race, and Mark Smith, a single digit golfer, who had never sailed in the ocean but had gone to culinary school and been a chef – so no matter what, we would eat well.

Early Sunday morning, we were treated to an amazing phosphorescence and lightning show. Ahead of us, from horizon to horizon, a continuous lightning show marked the front of an advancing cold front, while the entire ocean was lit up with ever-breaking waves glowing as if there was a bulb under each one. During the trip we were also treated to several visits by pods of dolphins. They would ride our bow wave for an hour or two and then depart. On Monday morning, as the winds dropped down to the low single digits, Mark cooked us one of the best omelets I have ever had.

Sunday morning we had our first problem. The centerline halyard winch, which was holding up the jib, failed. So we furled up the jib and proceeded to disassemble the winch on the inclined deck, while we bounced over 5-foot waves with the winds in the mid-to-high teens blowing salt spray over the decks. On Tuesday the winds built to the mid 20's and went to the NNW and it became obvious that heading to Bay Shore was not a possibility. Our destination now became Newport. As we bounced along over 6 to 8 foot waves, the bracket on top of the mast holding the VHF antenna and the Windex came loose. Fortunately it wrapped itself around the shrouds, preventing it from swinging wildly around the top of the mast.

On Wednesday morning we arrived in Newport and were treated to the sight of the new America's Cup Catamarans. We had definitely made the right decision to leave early. Boats that left on Sunday ran into a serious storm with winds gusting to 70 knots. One boat, *Avenir*, a 41' sloop, was abandoned after rudder failure, and on another boat a crew member had to be evacuated after a fall in the cockpit.

After a night in Newport and dinner at my favorite Newport restaurant (Puerinis), we decided to split up. John and Mark took the rental car to pick up the racing sails being delivered to Newport. Roger and I took *J/IV* to Stonington for repairs, and then had a nice sail home to Bay Shore.

The Salty Dawg Rally - by Bill and Maureen Danilczyk

This past November 9th, my wife Maureen and I had the pleasure of sailing our Conser 47/50 catamaran *Runaway* in a new rally — “The Salty Dawg Rally” — with 65 other sailing vessels, all experienced sailors, from Hampton, Virginia to the British Virgin Islands. I had spent the summer lengthening my catamaran from 47’ to 50’ which took much longer than anticipated. I have experience sailing offshore, having participated in two Caribbean 1500 Rallies, one Bermuda Cup and one Bahama Rally aboard *Runaway*, as well as a Caribbean 1500 on a Jeanneau 54DS, in addition to many other offshore trips. This would be the second rally for Maureen, as she sailed with me in the 2010 Bahama Rally which had us sailing from Hampton, Virginia to Charleston around all three capes against the current in near-gale conditions, trying to avoid a hurricane heading towards Bermuda. Not an easy trip.



The Salty Dawg Rally is a new rally started by Bill and Linda Knowles. They have transited back and forth from Bristol, Rhode Island to the BVI every year starting in 2004, making the trip seven times with the Caribbean 1500 and then starting the Salty Dawg in 2011. The Salty Dawg is different in many ways from the Caribbean 1500. The first item of major importance is that it is only offered to sailing vessels with offshore experience. The rally is free to all participants — in comparison, the average cost of the Caribbean 1500 is now \$1800. All safety requirements and boat inspections are the responsibility of the captain. The Caribbean 1500, which was sold in 2010 to the ARC people, now uses European standards which generally cost a U.S. boat \$5,000 to \$10,000 to fulfill.

The Salty Dawg has many sponsors and offers great discounts and benefits to participants, as listed on their website (www.saltydawgrally.com). This includes free weather routing by Chris Parker via daily chats on SSB at 6:00PM, or satellite phone dial-in to his office until the end of November. Individual boats use either Spot or inReach for position reporting.

The rally was originally scheduled to leave November 4th but Hurricane Sandy got in the way. Luckily Sandy missed the southern Chesapeake. Many boats were delayed getting to

Hampton, Virginia due to the size and strength of the storm. Most boats finally left November 9th from Hampton, although a participant can leave from any location on the East Coast with a few leaving from Beaufort, North Carolina.

The most critical portion of the trip is crossing the Gulf Stream, which is generally about 16-24 hours after departure. We chose to leave in the afternoon, letting the sea state calm after the passing of Sandy. Therefore, we left with a dying wind and soon motor-sailed across the Gulf Stream. We continued on an ESE course, heading just south of Bermuda for another 24 hours. We were then alerted by Chris Parker to a strong low forming around Bermuda. So we changed course, heading due south in strong northeast winds for the next 36 hours. As the winds clocked to the north, then northwest, we sailed a SE course 10-20 degrees north of our destination. These were great sailing conditions providing us with a fast and comfortable few days. It is important to get far enough east before the trade winds set up to avoid a beat to the BVI. As the trade winds arrived we sailed south-southeast on a rhumb line for Virgin Gorda.

We arrived off Anegada, BVI around midnight and reduced sail, slowing down for a first light entrance into the Gorda Sound. We cleared customs at the new office at Gun Cay, Virgin Gorda, which was incredibly easy for the incredible total fee of \$11.50. It was then on to The Bitter End Yacht Club for a free night's dockage, followed by free moorings till December 21 and full use of all the facilities, including the pool, bars, all the small boats, and wind surfers. Being a Dawg has its advantages!



Maureen's major description of the trip was "it was boring," which was good after her previous white-knuckle trip. I do think she has a new sense of accomplishment after sailing 1500 nm while being 500 nm from land at times. It is amazing how big the oceans are for anyone who has not sailed offshore. You generally do not see many other boats out there even though there are dozens heading to the same destination.

This is truly a great rally being run by very generous volunteers. Anyone who has the opportunity to participate will find it an amazing experience. There is also a north-bound Salty Dawg in April each year. So untie your dock lines and sail off out of the bay. The experience is truly rewarding in many ways.

Sailing Off the Bay

Solo Sail to Kingston for a Significant Meeting - by Rich Troy

Let me start by saying I'm no stranger to solo voyages on our sailboat *Fun Sway*. In 2012, I traveled the SBCC's two-week cruise as a solo sailor and in 2011 I did a two-week solo trip to Annapolis in time for the annual sailboat show. I enjoy traveling with my wife and family when possible, but sometimes schedules just don't work out.

My solo sailing follows some simple guidelines which include limited offshore coastal sailing, mostly during daylight hours, leaving GPS markers behind while underway (especially when entering or leaving a new passageway), and always making landfall to a new port of call during daylight hours. Our sailboat's autopilot relieves the tedium of needing to stay behind the wheel during long runs. My laptop fits perfectly on top of the instrumentation behind the wheel and allows me to watch movies during the long ocean runs. While coastal cruising, it's also easy to stay in touch with friends and family via email, phone calls and nowadays, even video calls.

My journey to Kingston followed this itinerary: Day 1: home port to a mooring at the Nyack Boat Club NY; 13 hours. Day 2: To Kingston NY, slip at Kingston Town Marina; 7 hours. Returning home the itinerary was: Day 1: Kingston to a mooring in Sheepshead Bay; 13.5 hours. Day 2: Sheepshead Bay back to home port; 7 hours.

While passing through New York Harbor I was chased away from the Staten Island Ferry's path by a Coast Guard chase boat which was armed with a machine gun. That ferry must have had a VIP on board! The Nyack Boat Club was a happy find. Their mooring fee includes use of their boat launch and clubhouse. Across the Hudson River was another happy find: The Tarrytown Marina has a floating fuel dock that is open all hours – you just swipe your credit card and start pumping. A benefit of traveling by boat in the New York Harbor and in the Hudson River includes some of the best scenery: A close-up to the Statue of Liberty, views of the Manhattan skyline, the dramatic Palisades cliffs and the rolling mountains of the Catskills.

As I arrived in Kingston at high tide with the sun high ahead of me, I ended up on the low side of the bridge and got to see (and hear!) our masthead VHF antenna grazing the bottom of the bridge. Once clear of the bridge, I was happy to see nothing was damaged, but chagrined to see I had not noticed the markers pointing to the higher end of the bridge where I would have cleared with no problem. The Kingston Town Marina has an excellent location, being strategically located at Kingston's renovated downtown with many restaurants near at hand.

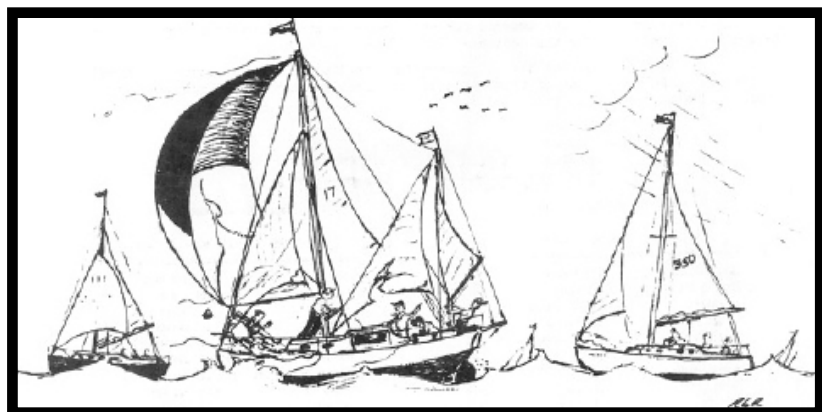
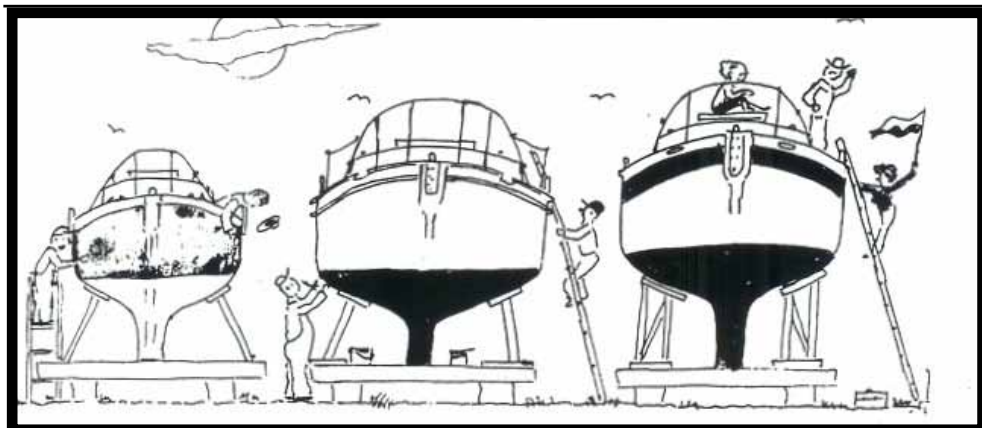
Father and Son Meet for the First Time

July 13th the trip got off to an early start with a group of boats gathered at the Robert Moses basin for the night and others at Sore Thumb for an early Saturday morning departure. We organized into two groups — those who planned to take the inside route through Moriches Bay, and those who planned to take the Ocean route. The fleet would then rendezvous at Cormorant Point late Saturday afternoon.

July 14th was the official start of the two-week cruise. We saw calm conditions and great weather, and we had an uneventful transit of the Fire Island Inlet. We arrived at Lake Montauk at 3:00 PM and proceeded single file into the lake. It was quite a parade! We had an impromptu rendezvous on *Indigo*, our newest club member. The party broke up early and just as the last of our group got back to their boats, a light rain began to fall, and then continued through the night.



Monday morning, July 16th, we woke to beautiful weather, had our check-in radio call, broke anchor, and headed to a party hosted by Bill and Maureen Danilczyk at their home in Southold. We traveled as a group, all arriving at the same time. There

was a mad scramble to anchor and get ashore to start the party —and what a party! Good band, good food, good company. And in case you could not tell, a good time was had by all!

Tuesday July 17th, we motored the short hop to the Shelter Island Yacht Club. The fleet took advantage of being in the Peconics to purchase batteries, a dinghy, and other unexpected necessities, and to have some general repairs made.

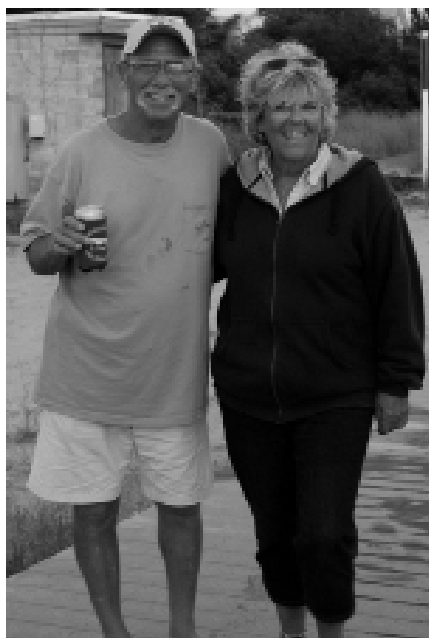

Excerpts From Members' Reports to the Commodore

The boat rose with the water, but came down atop a pole ... house surrounded by water ... 4' in basement ... a significant portion of the starboard deck was raised about an inch and a half off the hull & the teak toe rail snapped ... hasn't seen either of his boats yet ... they turned the gas off so my gas generator can't work; no telephone just spotty cell phones ... we moved everything from the first floor to the second floor ... the water was lapping at the top of our deck, but never came in the house ... our garage was flooded and everything in there is ruined ... came within 2" of coming into our kitchen from the garage ... we had moved the car to higher ground ... we tied the boat up in the middle of our canal ... boats started floating free from the marina across the canal from our house ... three boats got caught in our boat lines and stayed there all night ... Babylon village is a mess; boats were tossed off their jackstands and left in the middle of the roadways; a layer of sludge, gas and heating oil coats the streets around Lewis Circle ... we lost both of our cars ... lost our chimney, no big deal ... has to shop for all new furniture, cabinets, flooring, rugs ... came through like a champ, rode the storm out in our canal, but unfortunately our house did not fare as well ... was put up on the hard for safety at the Anchorage, but the surge floated her and she wound up 100 yards down on D dock, on her side ... her hull is badly gouged, the bowsprit broken, and some water came into the bilge through the transducer, but the rigging seems ok ... spent Saturday helping BSYC dig out from the mess Sandy left ... dealing w/after effects of neighbors' oil tanks dumping during storm, much of which is in the water in our basement; house full of fumes ... the crawl-space needed to be pumped out and then the insulation removed ... yesterday we had gas and electric restored ... we are looking for a 2-6 month rental while our home undergoes restoration ... we were very fortunate here ... if you hear or know of any Club members in who need assistance, please call ... or email ...

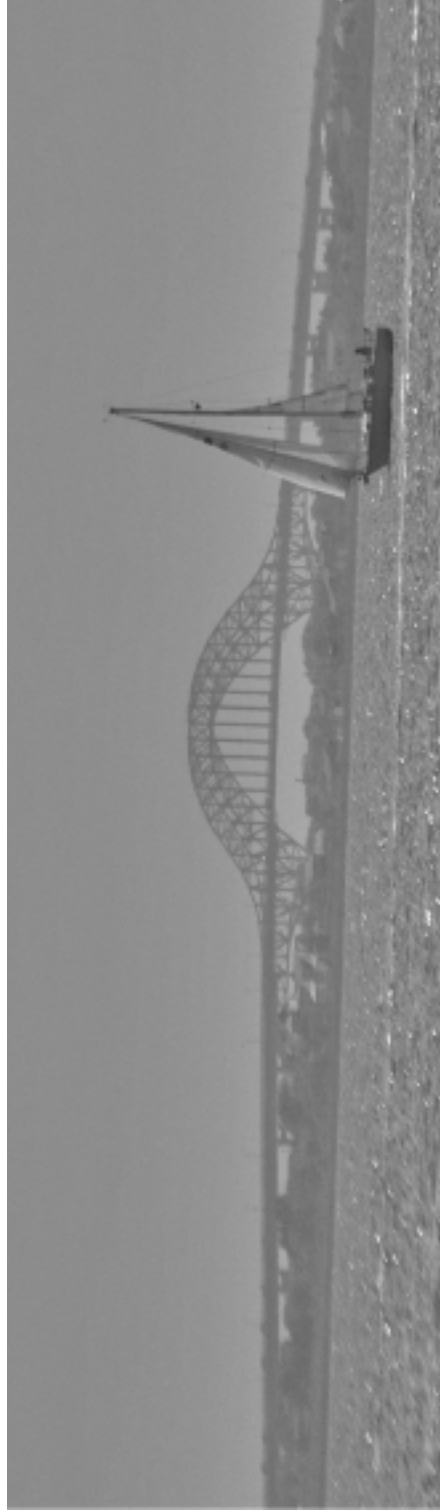
